RABBI'S MESSAGE

Happy Landings! ; אידישע נחת

Have you ever wondered about the meaning of the word "נחת"? We wish each other "nachas" from our children, yet do we really contemplate what we are truly requesting?

Truth be told, a Great Rebbe once pointed out that asking simply for "nachas" is incorrect and downright dangerous! One should ask more specifically for "אידישע נחת"; "*yiddishe nachas*", to distinguish it from that of עשיו הרשע's grandchild named נחת (יג, בראשית לו, יג)!

What then is "*yiddishe nachas*"?

The plain translation of the word נחת implies calmness or satisfaction. It would seem too trivial of a sentiment if we were merely asking that we reap calmness and satisfaction from our children. The word נחת can also connote to descend, to land, to arrive, rooted in the word נח, implying to come to rest.

Perhaps this מנהג ישראל to wish nachas is meant to express the idea that to achieve true happiness one must arrive at a goal that one strived and toiled for. At a simcha we pray that the many efforts exerted and energies invested in bearing and raising our children should bring the hoped for results, arriving at our life's journey's destination. Only this can bring true nachas.

Nachas is not procured, it is earned. It is the product of remaining focused on our goals and landing safely with the finished product intact and whole.

Nachas, satisfaction is not enough. We must daven for *Yiddishe Nachas*, the form of nachas that results from a life of standing up to and conquering all the נסיונות we are destined to face.

Only then will we calmly taste the true satisfaction of אידישע נחת!
