RABBI'S MESSAGE

Born to Toil

Toil, toil, toil, toil, toil, it might come as a surprise to you but that's precisely why we are all here in the first place.

ני אדם לעמל יולד (איוב ה ז). For man is born to toil...

What is this "hard labor" we are all sentenced to? Are we shackled from the moment we are born?

The Gemara cites a reference that indicates it is "the demands of the mouth" that is being summoned to work.

It continues to ponder whether this "work done by the mouth" refers to אמל תורה, by the toil in learning of Torah or מול שירוה, by the use of our mouth in "conversation"?

The Gemara concludes that the verse that exhorts us, אדורה הזה מפיך והגית בו יומם ולילה (יהושע א ח), this book of Torah shall not leave your mouth and you shall think about it day and night, clearly indicates that man's purpose was שלעמל תורה, to be consumed by the intellectual pursuit of the study of Torah.

Amazingly, the Gemara entertains the possibility that we were created for "otycot of shmooze" industriously! Do we actually need a verse to refute this?!

It seems evident from the Gemara that there are only three reasonable choices why we might have been placed on this planet: סמלאכה, שיחה oeither toil in physical activity, to engage in focused conversation or to study Torah. Is this the sum total of life?

The only place in Chumash where it uses the word סשימה, to converse, is by Yitzchok Avinu.

(בראשית כד סג), And Yitzchok went out to "converse" in the field.

The Ramban explains this to mean simply, that he went out towards evening to "shmooze" with his friends that were there in the field.

The first mention of a concept of G-d's "Torah", is when Hashem assures Yitzchok that he need not descend to Egypt despite the famine. He is promised to nevertheless flourish in Eretz Yisrael in fulfillment of the oath Hashem had made to his father Avraham; עקב אשר שמע אברהם בקלי וישמר משמרתי מצותי חקותי ותורותי (בראשית כה ה), Because Avraham obeyed My voice, and observed My commandments, My decrees, and My Torahs.

Our purpose in life echoes the noble goals of the Avos. We are hear to develop the world and enhance it with the values of Torah.

The sons of Yaakov Avinu represent the full gamut of industry, ", "bthat serves humanity. The talented merchants of Zevulun, the bountiful crops from the lands of Naftali, the prodigious oil of Asher, the pasture land and flocks of Dan, the leadership of Yehuda, and the unique contribution of each tribe towards the greater development of a successful society.

It was Yaakov Avinu who was the paradigm of, אמאל מלאכה, where Yaakov displayed honest hard work and the values of Torah that emanated from every aspect of his engagement in it. No wonder he merited such talented children.

It was with his craft of speech, אימא שיחה, Yitzchok sought to sway his errant son Esav from his evil ways.

Avraham discovers the blueprint of Torah through his intense intellectual observation of the magnificent and profound universe Hashem has born from that Torah. He is divinely inspired and merits to access ever deeper levels through the divine spirit. (בי דעות בייך צור מ)

The character traits he develops is the natural product of the אועמל תורה, that he begins to toil and tend to, that continues to grow and inspire his consciousness. (Rabbi S.R.Hirsch Breishis 26 5)

Avraham Avinu is never portrayed proselytizing. It is his glowing inner perfection that is a product of the toiling in Torah that is more effective and contagious than anything else.

Hashem promises us, אום בחקתי תלכו (ויקרא כו ג), lf you will follow my decrees, He will bless us with all good.

Rashi informs us that this process begins with the directive , עמלים בתורה, that you shall toil in Torah.

Does this preclude those who engage in אעמל שיחה prom the rewards foretold?

Perhaps we may place a comma in this injunction. בתורה. חושתהיו עמלים, בתורה. all that we seek to engage in, whether purposeful industry or significant conversation that enhances general wellbeing, may its power generate from a potent internal engine of toil in Torah.

Without an inspired personal connection to Torah through an intensive study of and commitment to Torah, in whatever time each of us have available, our accomplishments in the arena of the toil we were destined for, will inevitably come up short.

All our toil must be permeated with the labor of Torah in order to succeed. It is what fuels our very existence in this world.

May we each access the power of Torah and bring our world to its perfection!
