RABBI'S MESSAGE

ישעיה מט אבדי אתה ישראל אשר בך אתפאר ישעיה מט; Awe Inspiring!

This week our Kehilla was uplifted and inspired by an ultimate act of generosity, the literal "giving of ones self", the donation of a kidney successfully transplanted into a total stranger.

What is so remarkable and awesome about this extraordinary gesture? Is it the willingness to submit oneself to danger for another? Is it the unbelievable support of family that encouraged and allowed this gift? Is it the phenomenal courage to be willing to permanently part with a vital piece of ourselves? Is it the singular sensitivity to another's plight? Is it the amazing sense of duty to fulfill the will of Hashem? It is this and so much more.

אברהם tell us that in the merit that אברהם אבינו brought butter and milk to his guests his children merited to eat the Manna in the desert for forty years and in the merit that he offered them water his descendants were privileged to drink from the Well of Miriam.

HaRav Chaim Shmulevitz zt"l asks; what was so significant about these gestures that merited such great rewards? Don't we all emulate these seemingly simple acts of chesed numerous times in our daily lives?

It is not the act in and of itself but rather the total absorption of ones self in the needs of the other that is so unique to our אברהם אבינו When אברהם אבינו gave a glass of water it was a act of total and absolute מסירת נפש with a complete focus on the other individual and his interests.
