RABBI'S MESSAGE

Look 'em in the Eye!

The משכן was a microcosm of the world as we know it and represented our closeness to חשם and His presence in every fiber of our existence.

The very structure starting with its base, the אדנים; the silver sockets, represent the firmament comprised of mineral. The קרשים; the wooden beams symbolize the next level, plant life. Finally the tapestries fashioned from wool and the עורות; the skins, that served as a covering were representative of animal life, the next stage in the hierarchy of creation. Man, the most exalted of all creations, performing the אחבה, brought all the elements of our world together in a wondrous expression of בורא כל to the בורא כל.

The pinnacle of our relationship with השם was embodied in the כרובים; the two golden cherubs atop the ארון. According to one opinion they directly faced each other when we fulfilled the will of השם and miraculously turned their faces outwardly to the walls of the מקדש when we lapsed in our responsibilities. An alternate opinion is recorded that the bodies of the כרובים always appeared as a student departing from his teacher yet with their heads inclined towards each other catching one last eye to eye glimpse of one another.

There are several views in חז"ל regarding the nature of the faces of the כרובים. Some offer that one was a male the other female. Others claim they were a young student and his teacher. Many maintain they represented two equals. Certainly the כרובים were representative of the love between הקדוש and בני ישראל and evidently all the relationships we encounter in life are reflected and defined by the nature of our relationship with שח.

The most basic premise in being able to transmit true feelings to one another is the ability to face each other and make direct eye contact as demonstrated in the פניהם איש אל אחיו.

What is so powerful about looking into the eyes of whom we want to connect to?

The pupil of the eye is termed אישון . לשון הקודש stems from אישו; a man, because when you look into the eyes of the person opposite you, you see your image reflected in his eyes, thus we refer to the pupil as אישון; a little man. (רבינו בחיי)

This phenomenon teaches us that only when we convey to the persons opposite us that we see ourselves in them and that our identity is defined and only gains meaning through their presence in our lives, can we succeed in developing a healthy and productive relationship. It is not enough to simply give to someone else for them to feel loved, they must feel that they are vital to and part of your existence.

כביכול, השם, looks us straight in the eye, communicating to us that we give him נחת, that our existence is a reflection of the צלם אלוקים, His very self.

This is the epitome of אהבה, and this must be emulated in our own interactions with those most precious to us. When we fulfill this then השם derives the greatest of נחת from us.

May we merit to see the day when השם will indeed see Himself reflected in us.
