

## RABBI'S MESSAGE

### “Winning Friends and Influencing People” מציאת חן

It can be safely stated that most of our lives are spent trying to gain favor in the eyes of others. Our תפילות are replete with pleas “למצא חן...”; to find favor. Whether it be winning the favor of ה', our children, parents, spouses, teachers, colleagues or neighbors we are constantly engaged in seeking the approval and admiration of others. Yet this special “חן”; favor, that we seek eludes us. So often we implement strategies to succeed in gaining the favor of others, yet we fail to achieve it. What is the secret to “finding favor in the eyes of Hashem and mankind?

In three instances in the Torah do we find the mention of individuals who possessed this special quality called “חן”. By נח, משה רבינו and יוסף הצדיק, the Torah emphasizes their having found favor. נח found favor in the eyes of Hashem, ...ונח מצא חן בעיני ה'. יוסף finds favor in the eyes of his captors, וימצא יוסף מצאת חן בעיני... Hashem, ...חן. משה is told by Hashem,

(The ארזי"ל in fact points out that יוסף and משה are the גלגולים of נח as alluded in משה רבינו's request on behalf of ישראל that Hashem should rather “מחני נא”; “erase my name” than destroy them. The letters “מחני” possessing the name “נח” and the ראשי תיבות of “יוסף” and “משה”.)

There is a common theme in all of the above instances. Each one displayed an unswerving dedication to the principles they believed in. נח despite the taunts and ridicule expressed toward him and his mission, maintained his faith and conviction and continued to fulfill the “seemingly” ridiculous request by Hashem that he build the Ark to be saved from a “flood”. יוסף הצדיק was admired by his foreign captors for his unstinting devotion to his G-d even under the most trying of circumstances totally isolated from his family. They observed “כי ה' אתו”, “that Hashem was with him”. Even when he interpreted the dreams successfully he assumes no credit and attributes all his talent to Hashem. In the face of seduction he remains uncompromising in the morals he so firmly believes in. משה consistently remains unswerving in his dedication to his fellow man and Hashem. Whether risking his royal privilege when he goes out to survey the plight of his brethren, valiantly confronting the איש מצרי who is abusing the Jewish slave, or in his standing up to the shepherds who threaten the daughters of יתרו, משה רבינו staunchly stands by his beliefs.

So often we think that by compromising our beliefs we can win friends and influence people. Yet the opposite is true. Only if we display a consistent devotion to the ideals we truly believe in will we win the favor of those who come into our company. People will admire us even for the things that they do not comprehend or agree with, if they observe our steadfast devotion and commitment to our principles.

In our culture we are often tempted to play down our identity, thinking that by appearing and acting more like the nations around us will we be able to survive in גלות. But history has born out otherwise. If we wear our identity with pride we will be admired for our wisdom, morals, faith and beliefs.

May we all merit to stand up for what we believe in and in that זכות may we find much חן; favor בעיני אלקים ואדם!
