RABBI'S MESSAGE:

A Sweeping Accomplishment!

Many of us have the custom to make a blessing over the Four Species specifically in the Sukkah.

Early sources explain that this is due to the fact that nowhere throughout the entire Torah does the word סוכה appear 'full', with a ו between the ס and כ, except in one location.

King David describes the Messianic times, when all the nations will mass against Jerusalem, the sovereignty of G-d will be clearly recognized when he wreaks vengeance upon them.

Then was in Jerusalem, סוכה His Tabernacle, and His dwelling in Zion (תהלים ע ג)

Until such time as all wars will become obsolete and the recognition of G-d's new world order will be established, only then will His סוכה Sukkah, be 'complete'.

The Masters of Kabbalah reveal that each one of the four species correspond to one of the letters of G-d's Ineffable Name - י-ה-ו-ה.

The Lulav corresponds to the third letter, ו.

We therefore introduce the 'missing' letter from the Sukkah, by bringing the ו shaped Lulav into our 'Tabernacle', hoping it will catalyze the full expression of G-d's presence and glory in the world.

There is a fascinating verse that describes how G-d will sweep away [our enemies] במטאטא - with a 'broom' of destruction. (ישעיה יד כג)

What is this 'broom' the Prophet Isaiah speaks of?

There is a relevant question whether a Lulav that grew on the Sheviis year is imbued with the sanctity of Sheviis and its restrictions.

Generally, only items whose pleasurable benefit is 'consumed' in a manner similar to eating — that its pleasure and its disintegration happens simultaneously, qualifies.

Rashi explains that the primary usage of palm fronds was as a broom. Since the sweeping and its wearing out from friction happen at the same time it should thus qualify to be imbued, as food is, with sanctity of Sheviis.

How fascinating! We take something that is a lowly broom and designate it as the vehicle to restore the world to its perfect order!

One of the great Tzadikim of Jerusalem, Reb Nota Zehwirth zt'l, was once observed running hastily, though with great joy and

zeal, with a broom in his hand. His friend inquired asking him why he was hurrying so. He responded that he was running with a Lulav in his hand. His friend looked quite perplexed thinking this Tzadik had lost his mind. Reb Nota instantly clarified by posing the following question. "Is this simple stick with leaves that grow on a palm tree, that significant that it is worthy of being an article of mitzvah? Yet, evidently G-d indeed commanded us such that it is now prominently known as the Lulav". He continued, "since right now there is a foul stench in the Study Hall, due to an accident, and there is a command incumbent upon me to assure 'your encampment shall remain holy', so that we can continue to learn and pray there, now the will of G-d is that my taking the 'broom' and mop is just as significant as a Lulav".

Perhaps the greatest lesson of the Lulav is that no matter the instrument, when used to promote the will of G-d in the world, everything has sanctity, even a broom becomes a holy scepter.

If one enters the 'heavenly realm' of the Sukkah, with the realization that one holds the key to infusing a world of selfishness to a world that reflects G-d's presence in all we do, then just maybe we will succeed in bringing the world a few steps closer to that marvelous time.

The word במטאטא - with a broom, the prophet uses to portray our mission, when adding up the numerical value of this word, counting the number of its letters as well, is numerically equivalent to לולב, 68!

The late Sar HaTorah, Rav Chaim Kanievsky zt'l, was wont to point out that the first letters in the sentiment we express in Tefillah: וטהר לבנו - and purify our heart, לעבדך באמת - to serve You sincerely, spell out the letters לולב!

May we merit to purify our motives so we may serve G-d with sincerity!
