# RABBI'S MESSAGE

# "Clothes" Encounters of the Third Kind

From time immemorial mankind has been preoccupied with clothing. From the fig leaf to Brooks Brothers and Saks Fifth Avenue we have been trying to "cover up" from the consequential בושה; embarrassment, resulting from our grave mistake of having eaten from the אין, the Tree of Knowledge.

inform us that there are three functions to garments alluded in words we use for clothing.

לבוש; attire, is a contraction of two words; לאבוש, not to be shamed. The most basic of purpose; to cover our shameful nakedness, since as a result of sin we no longer view our private parts solely as holy tools in the service of Hashem, but also as means for selfish desire.

Our outer dress very often is a external presentation that often "betrays" our true self. One may wear a suit or dress that is "flattering", possessing the quality of "disguising" our natural flaws. The noun בגד garment, is similar to the word for a "traitor"; a בואד, for clothes often present a false facade of dignity and sophistication that often is not truly present in the person donning them.

Finally there is an unusual word the Torah uses for a garment, דלבש הכהן "מדנ", and the Kohen shall don his fitted linen tunic. This is the source for the modern Hebrew term for uniforms, מדים. It is it's accurate measurement that lends this word it's connection to clothing. The אוידים, character traits, too, are referred to as garments of an individual, for they are the true "measure" of man's essence. In this sense there is an idea of clothing that truly express the soul of a person. בגדי מלכות ובגדי כהונה; clothes of royalty and of the Kohanim, are in this category of attire because it "suits" the wearer and is truly reflective of the measure of the person beneath.

In the story of מגילת אסתר as recorded in מגילת אסתר, there are three episodes that reflect each of these ideas.

The summoning of Queen ישתי to appear naked before the King at the grand feast is the unfortunate result of the use of clothing in it's most elemental design. When clothing are merely utilized as an excuse to conceal that which is truly desired to be seen, they become a method to accentuate that which will ultimately be revealed in disgrace. The "לבוש" transformed into לא בוש , no shame!

The buffoon אחשורוש desires to camouflage the simple and coarse stable master that he truly is, in the guise of the בגדי כהן גדול; the raiment's of the High Priest. This act becomes symbolic of his continuously revealing the true fool he is, time and again. His feeble attempt to deceive the populace that he is true royalty results in the realization that he is indeed an "Emperor with no clothes"! He remains a "בוגד"; a traitor only to himself!

מרדכי הצדיק and אסתר המלכה, however, appear in the full glory of לבושי מלכות; royal attire, radiating from without the yearning soul of greatness that burns within them. Their outer display of splendor is but a pale manifestation of the "מידות"; the sterling character, that "measures" up to the grandeur of the אמהות and אמהות.

The Tamously teaches us that יום הכייפורים"; the Day of Atonement is only כייפורים", like Purim, with פורים, like Purim, with פורים the greater of the two days. On each of these ימם טובים we wear a nondescript white "Kittel", accentuating the shedding of our colorful personalities in subservience to Hashem. As מלאכים; Angels, we refrain from sensory indulgence placing ourselves totally in His embrace. On פורים we do one better. We take every fiber of our multifaceted lives and prove that even with our senses fully operational and functioning in it's total glory we can dedicate ourselves entirely to Hashem.

To a certain extent we live our lives clothed in deceptions. We act one way externally but sense otherwise beneath our skin. We are often dishonest with ourselves as to where we really are holding in our commitment to our fellow man and Hashem. On פורים we have the opportunity to retrieve our גדלות הנפש that lies within each one of us.

May we display before the world in our מדות, that we are truly בני מלכים allowing our true colors to enlighten the universe!
