California Reparations

The Task Force California established the Task Force to Study and Develop Reparations

Proposals for African Americans through legislation (AB 3121) enacted September 30, 2020. The Legislature charged the Task Force with studying the institution of slavery and its lingering negative effects on living African Americans, including descendants of persons enslaved in the United States, and on society. AB 3121 called for a report to the Legislature, to be made available to the public, with recommendations for appropriate remedies of compensation, rehabilitation, and restitution.

The Report

The Task Force issued its final report on June 29, 2023, following nearly two years of public hearings and in-depth research and deliberations. The report contains comprehensive empirical data and historical evidence on slavery in California—where it was tolerated despite the state's designation as a "free state"—and the far-reaching negative impacts of discriminatory laws and policies born from the end of slavery. In the report, the Task Force makes hundreds of recommendations for state policy and budgetary changes to address these impacts. 2024 Legislative Package The California Legislative Black Caucus recently announced a 2024 Reparations Priority Bill Package as a first step in what will be a multi-year effort to implement the legislative recommendations in the report. The package includes 14 measures to be introduced during the current legislative session addressing access to education, civil rights protections and apologies for rights violations, criminal justice reform, health equity, and business opportunities.
