


Schedule of Pre-Trip Events

Outstanding 2018 film about an African- American teen who's constantly switching between two worlds—the poor, mostly black neighborhood where she lives and the wealthy, mostly white prep school she attends. Sunday Nov 24 4-5:30 PM	 Book discussion: <i>Just Mercy</i> by Bryan Stevenson , founder of the Equal Justice Initiative (whose museum and memorial we'll visit in Montgomery). NY Times best-selling book recounts Stevenson's coming of age as a young lawyer, provides a moving window into the lives of those he has defended, and makes an inspiring argument for compassion in the pursuit of true justice. Sunday Dec 15 2-3:30 PM	 Book discussion: <i>The Case for Reparations</i> by Ta-Nehisi Coates . Discussion of the 2014 article that rekindled a movement such that reparations for slavery and legalized discrimination are now being discussed by major presidential candidates. Tuesday Jan 14 6-9 PM	 Film and discussion: <i>13th</i> . This award-winning 2016 documentary by Ava DuVernay provides an in-depth look at the prison system in the United States today and how it reveals the nation's history of racial inequality. The title refers to the 13 th Amendment to the US Constitution, which abolished slavery except as punishment for a crime. Sunday March 15 4-5:30 PM	 Book discussion: <i>The Price of Whiteness: Jews, Race, and American Identity</i> by Eric L. Goldstein .
