## Rabbi's Ramblings

Rabbi Bennett Greenspon



It was a good feeling seeing the sanctuary filled with people as we began our opening ceremony for Mitzvah Day. Over five hundred people gave of themselves, their

possessions and of their time to help others in need. Some planted plants, others made dog biscuits, some put together "blessing bags" to give to the beggars under the underpasses. After the good deeds were done a number of participants hung around to play kickball and eat bbq.

At the opening ceremony I reminded everyone that when building a synagogue there are three things that we are supposed to consider doing.

- 1. The building or the ark should face toward Jerusalem. So, if you are in the United States it means that the structure would face east. This is to remind us that our spiritual home is in the land of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- 2. The building should have a part of it that is unfinished; be it an unpainted patch or a small hole in the wall. This is to remind us of the destruction of the ancient temple and the destruction of so many of our houses of worship throughout the world and throughout history. It is also to remind us that we are partners in completing this imperfect world.
- 3. The third thing that is needed is a window. This is to remind us to look toward the heavens and strive to be the best we can be. It also reminds us that we need to look outside of ourselves. We have a commitment to others. If we are holed up in our own sanctuary or our own selves, we will not fulfill the commandment of Tikun Olam, repairing the world. Being selfish may get us momentary pleasure, but it won't bring us long term happiness or fulfillment.

So many people came up to me to tell me how good they felt about Mitzvah Day. Mitzvah Day should be every day. So, if you felt good on that day or, you rue the fact that you missed your opportunity to participate that day, do something about it. Do a mitzvah! Go shopping and drop some food off at the temple for one of our foodbank partners. Come over and weed a garden or pick up trash. Write out a check and give a scholarship. There are so many things you can do. As someone said, "Just do it!"

I have been a fan of Dr. Suess' The Lorax since I was young. I loved the book as well as the original animated TV special and even the movie released in 2012. The book and movies express how important it is to take care of our natural world, which is

also a message stressed during Tu B'shvat, the birthday of the trees. In the movie is a song, "Let it Grow". The lyrics refer to a community decision on whether to plant a tree seed or to live under a false reality of needing to purchase air because there are no trees.

## Cantor's Notes

As we prepare for the holiday of Tu B'Shevat, we are reminded that Tu B'Shevat encourages us to contemplate our unique connection to the Land of Israel.

The story is told that 85 years ago a British politician asked Chaim Weizman, "Why do you Jews insist on Palestine when there are so many other countries you could have more conveniently?"

Weizman looked directly into his eyes and replied, "That's like me asking you – why did you drive 20 miles to visit your mother last Sunday when there are so many old ladies living on your street!"

Tu B'Shevat is a time to revisit our commitment to Israel. There are a lot of beautiful stories of peace and coexistence happening in beautiful Israel every day. I am reminded of two stories that I shared during a Shabbat service a few weeks ago:

There is an Israeli Arab living in Jerusalem who shared this story on social media...almost every night he gets his dinner at the same pizza restaurant, owned by Israeli Jews. Over the years, he and the Jewish owners have always been very friendly and polite to each other. One recent night, when he was especially hungry, he was waiting in line and the owner looked behind him, taking the order of the Jewish family behind him first. And then, he took another Jewish family's order before waiting on the Arab man, still waiting patiently in line and wondering why the owner was being so rude and what was going on here? When the Jewish owner finally took the Arab man's order, he whispered to him, "I have a fresh pizza in the oven and wanted to make sure you got the freshest slices...as the regular customer that you are...so I gave them the last pieces from the previous pizza so yours could be hot and fresh."

Then there were the two Arab plumbers in Haifa who refused to charge their elderly Jewish customer for their extensive work in her small apartment once they learned that she had survived the Holocaust.

Let's take a lesson from our tradition and strive to be like the trees, spreading beauty and nourishment wherever we can.

## **Social Emotional Learning in First Grade**

First Grade has been successfully implementing SEL since the beginning of the year. You must be asking yourself what does SEL stand for? SEL is Social- Emotional Learning, it refers to a journey a child takes towards understanding self, showing empathy, regulating emotions, and managing behavior. It is a process of ups and downs with many successes along the way and not just one finish line. Students may not be able to reach the finish line, but when teachers focus on this journey, it can lead to a complete turnaround in their classroom engagement and students' personal growth.

There are five components of SEL (Social-Emotional Learning):

- 1. Self-awareness is the ability to understand one's own emotions, thoughts and values. It is the ability to recognize one's strengths and limitations.
- 2. Self-management is the ability to manage one's emotions, thoughts, and behavior. Controlling impulse, being able to handle one's own stress and setting goals to achieve.
- 3. Social Awareness is the ability to understand and empathize with others. It is the capacity to feel compassion for others.
- 4. Relationship Skills is the ability to establish and maintain healthy and supportive relationships with one's own peers. This includes problem solving and negotiating conflict collaboratively.
- 5. Responsible Decision-making is the ability to analyze situations, identify the problem, solve the problem and then reflect.

There are many strategies that we use on a daily basis in our classroom. These strategies guide us with our lesson plans, as well. We are always present and observant of what is going on. We watch to see if there are any changes in our students' behaviors and try to find the cause. We start each day with an emotion check-in. It sets the tone for each day. We create a supportive atmosphere where the students are able to voice their own opinions and their feelings by participating in a partner or group activity. We share our own life experiences by telling stories of when we were their age. We stimulate open discussions by reading and listening to them, giving them a chance to express themselves. We give the students the opportunity to practice, and put themselves in someone else's shoes to truly understand a situation. Besides teaching all the subjects, we are also establishing strong social-emotional skills. Students that have these skills are better able to cope with everyday challenges and will benefit academically and socially.

In the month of February our classes will experience the holiday of Tu B'Shevat. This holiday occurs on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the Hebrew month of Shevat, and is considered the New Year for Trees.




This is one of my favorite holidays to celebrate with the children. When they play on the playground and enjoy the shade our school trees provide, it is a perfect learning opportunity for the students. Learning about trees and what they provide for us emotionally as well as physically in our daily lives is essential. I live in a neighborhood in Cooper City with many beautiful old trees. Many mornings I walk through the neighborhood and the trees cover me with beautiful sweeping arms of leaves. They protect me from rain, wind, and at times our strong Florida sun. I have noticed that I have

a spiritual hunger that can be satisfied only by contact with nature. Many of our children feel the same way. They crave nature in their day!

Some of our classes take the children to walk/run over near the patio. Once there they swing from our trees, they climb our little hill perfect for our legs, pick up sticks, look at the sky, listen for birds, and watch a butterfly flap it's wings. These are the moments where we are witnessing children find comfort in their own souls through contact with nature. When we see them play outside with no toys or structures, the importance of trees and nature takes on a whole new meaning. Creative play reaches an all-time high for the children. One can't help but smile as they create new games running through the trees, and calling to their friends, "Catch me if you can!" The joy and comfort nature brings to all of us is contagious! We see the joy it brings children to touch and interact with the many natural elements we have added to our classrooms. We have focused on creating classes







The children love learning about the different fruit trees, which of course leads to many classes making a fruit salad or a fruit smoothie. Learning through cooking is a favorite amongst our students. This is a great opportunity to try new fruits and sample healthy choices. 





## Noah Kathein

Noah Kathein will be called to the Torah as a Bar Mitzvah on Saturday, February 11, 2023. Noah has been a student at Temple Beth Emet since he was two years old. He has grown up in the halls of Beth Emet. He is currently in 7<sup>th</sup> grade at Beth Emet Middle School. Noah is an excellent student. He excels at all subjects, but Math is where he shines! He has a thirst for knowledge and is a big fan of Civics class, and loves learning about Jewish History.

Noah is a golfer! He's worked hard at his golf game for the past three years. At just 12 years old, he can drive the ball 167 meters and has hit a speed of 80mph! Noah loves watching documentaries on topics that interest him, and he's a big Heat fan, loves gaming, and is a master at making edits! Gathering Friday nights for Shabbat with his immediate and extended family is a tradition that is very important to him.

For Noah's mitzvah project he chose to fundraise for OCRA-Ovarian Cancer Research Alliance. When it came time to pick a mitzvah project, the first thing that came into his mind was his grandmother. She suffered from Ovarian Cancer for eight years, and sadly passed away when Noah was 9. He was very close with her and decided to fundraise in her honor. With the funds raised by this organization, OCRA has expanded its support programs for those living with the disease, reached more rising healthcare providers with important information about risk and symptoms, been central in securing the largest increase in federal funding for ovarian cancer research and education programs, and made tremendous progress in their understanding of immunotherapy, precision medicine, combination treatments, genetic mutations, and more. We couldn't be prouder of him for picking such an essential foundation for a fundraising project.

The Kathein family would like to thank Paula Bergman for her mentorship, kindness, and continued support in preparing Noah for his big day. Thank you, Rabbi Greenspon, Rabbi DeWoskin and Cantor Jan, for your dedication and guiding Noah spiritually throughout his time at Temple Beth Emet. 




