



# Rabbi's Ramblings

Rabbi Bennett Greenspon



Perceptions and polling are interesting things. As we have learned from the last few election cycles, one does not know if they are correct or not. Was the polling wrong or was it the interpretation that was off?

We know that faith in government is way down. We don't trust the institution of the presidency, yet alone the president. We don't like our representatives or senators nationally or locally. Schools are terrible. Crime is up. But when asked about crime in our neighborhoods or our local schools, we rate them as safe and as good.

I was recently at a meeting where the question was asked: Is the country going in the right direction? Three quarters of the room said no. But when asked why, some felt it was becoming too conservative and others felt it was becoming too liberal. Of course, none could explain what conservative meant or what liberal meant.

When you ask someone if it is okay that x did something the answer might be yes. But if you tell them that y did the same thing that is seen as a sin. Of course, the definition of sin is also now on the table.

Be open to other's thoughts or at least to understanding where they are coming from Discuss not argue with someone who has a different view point than we do

And a few more resolutions that would not hurt us:

Post kindness and not spread maliciousness

Put down our cell phone when we are with others (especially our children and grandchildren)
Say thank you and it wouldn't hurt to say please more often

Maybe if we do some of these things, 2023 will be a better year than 2022.

There is a classic story that took place hundreds of years ago in Europe. A family wanted to leave a legacy to the community. They were blessed to have the means and donated a synagogue with the understanding that no one would be allowed to see the plans for the building until it was completed. When everyone entered it for the first time they were in awe

of the beauty and detail. As they looked around someone asked, "Where are the lamps? How will we be able to see?" The family who built the synagogue pointed to the brackets on the wall. Then they gave every family in the community a lamp to bring with them every time they attended. The donating family then shared, "Each time you are not here, your place within this synagogue will be unlit. This will serve as a reminder that some part of God's house will be dark when you fail to attend, especially when the community needs you. On the contrary, when you show up, your light will bring hope and dispel darkness. God's house will be a beacon of light for the community."

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Visiting & Learning Around the Globe

Being able to integrate Language Arts and Social Studies into our classrooms has been really exciting, giving us the opportunity to combine the book "Flat Stanley" and our Continents and Oceans Unit. Our students have been enjoying every part of it and are excited to continue traveling to various places with Flat Stanley.

Fiction and non-fiction collided in second grade! Flat Stanley, a character created by Jeff Brown, is able to be put in an envelope and mailed to visit his friend in California. After creating their own versions of Flat Stanley, the students were excited to mail them in envelopes to their friends and relatives all over the world. Some of the places our Flat Stanleys have been are different states in our country, Israel, The Bahamas, India, and more! Second grade discovered that their friends and relatives live on different continents than we do. And on Flat Stanley's trip overseas, he had to travel over one or more of the five oceans in the world.

While our Flat Stanleys are on their special adventures, they are experiencing different continents and all they have to offer. We took these opportunities to discover and learn about the similarities and differences they experienced compared to life here at home. As we get pictures and stories from people all over the globe, we interactively use our maps and mark on the specific countries or states.

Integrating these units has been an excellent and rigorous learning experience for our second graders. Not only were they able to learn about the 7 continents and 5 oceans, but they also got to travel with Flat Stanley around the world, giving us the opportunity to learn the geographic aspects of the maps and how far, yet how close we all are around the globe.

Through this experience we hope the students will be introduced to taking the risk to read books they may never have chosen to read before. One student said, in her response, "I didn't think I would like fantasy books but now I do!" I guess our goal was met successfully.

The students truly enjoyed and benefited from the experience and we look forward to seeing the results in their reading! As one student summarized, "I hope we do another book tasting soon. I can't wait to see which genres we will taste next."







# Early Childhood Center





## What is the Importance of having choice in one's day?

Over the past month, our teachers have been exploring the value of choice in their students' days. Each day, we as adults wake up and make so many decisions - from what to wear, what to eat, whether or not to exercise, should we call our mom to check in, what book to read, which podcast to listen to, or should we watch one more show on Netflix? The choices are endless for us as adults! From the small to the big we are constantly making decisions in our days and in our lives.

From the moment our students walk into the classroom, they also have many choices. They decide who and what to play with, how to challenge themselves, and when to persevere. Sometimes they have a choice of what snack they will eat, or what to eat first in their lunch box. Some days provide more opportunities for making choices than others...such is life. And on those days, they choose how to handle that as well!

When the children come to class in the morning, they might decide to play with the friends that make them laugh, or the ones that want to build with them. Do they choose the friends who are always the boss or always the follower, or the one that understands "give and take" in a relationship? As they move through these interactions they are building their knowledge about the people they want to surround themselves with in their lives. We don't tell them, "Play with this friend," or, "Don't play with that friend." We step back, ask questions, and make statements about different interactions that we see occurring in the classroom. We help them reflect on these various relationships. It is in these moments that they have the opportunity to build their own trust in themselves so that they can know when and how to listen to their guiding inner voice. Sometimes they will make the choice to play alone for reasons they alone have determined. We value this as we again step back and reflect with them to help them construct a strong, positive self-identity.

How do the children decide what to play with? Do they pick items that will challenge and excite them in their learning? Do they choose materials that are new to them, or ones they have used repeatedly? As they play, they are building their learning dispositions. They are learning what they like, how to manipulate different materials, and how to find joy and wonder in the world. They are working on problem solving, negotiating, and perseverance. As they make choices all of these skills are refined!

When children are given the opportunity to make their own choices, they develop a sense of agency that allows them to realize that they have the ability to control their own lives. It has been said that having a sense of agency builds a strong identity and has been identified as a foundation of learning and wellbeing.

We value the time in our classroom schedules that allow for the children to make decisions. In these times they develop their autonomy and their resilience. The joy and confidence that is built along the way is tremendous. As parents we sometimes want to make choices for our children. So today, step back and show your children you trust them. That trust will lead them to trust themselves! Let's give them the confidence to be the agents of their own lives with wisdom, strength and courage!

Conquering the Oil & Making Connections Across the Ocean

What does it mean to be part of a global Jewish community? How can we show our students that they are part of a larger Jewish community beyond Broward County? For over a decade our Merkaz Limud 6<sup>th</sup> grade & 7<sup>th</sup> grade students have been participating in Partnership2Gether - a wonderful program sponsored by The Jewish Agency for Israel & the Jewish Federation of Broward County. Partnership2Gether is a school twinning experience that affords our students the opportunity to virtually interact with 6<sup>th</sup> Grade students in Nesher, Israel. The purpose of twinning is to help bridge the gap of understanding between our students and their counterparts in Israel and to bring both sides together in the spirit of our Jewish faith. It also celebrates our rich heritage, our differences, and the culture that unites us all. We are very proud that our students are part of the 46 different partnerships between Jewish schools in the US and schools in Israel. We have a mutual responsibility to each other and by building and supporting these relationships, it will in turn, create a great connection to Israel and the Jewish experience, thus helping our students to build a strong Jewish identity.



Our second "mifgash," or planned educational meeting of Jews who live inside and outside of Israel, took place during Hanukkah. The goal was to learn how each community celebrates Hanukkah, special activities they participate in, holiday meals that they enjoy with friends and family and anything else that makes the holiday special to them. We ended the mifgash with everyone lighting their own Hanukkiah together and reciting the Hanukkah blessings.



The holiday season didn't stop there. We were so excited to Conquer the Oil together! All of our classes had so much fun cooking for Hanukkah. The kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grades fried delicious apple potatoes during their classes. Our 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade families came together for a beautiful morning of cooking, art, and laughter! Using teamwork, we made potato zucchini latkes



and sufganiyot (fried doughnuts eaten in Israel and around the world during Hanukkah) from scratch. Families also designed their own latke plate to use throughout the week of Hanukkah. The best part of this festive program was seeing all of the families schmoozing together and having a great time with each other.









Temple Beth Emet proudly boasts one of the most successful youth programs in Broward County. All youth activities are planned with one goal in mind: to help participants connect to their Temple community. Our three programs serve students in grades K-12 with various social, religious and community service events while socializing with their friends.



#### Levi Fleischer






