I write this on the holiday of Shavuot.

Shavuot was and is one of the major holidays of the Jewish calendar. Sadly, many liberal Jews no longer celebrate it. In ancient times people used to bring the first fruits of their crops or flocks to the temple to show their thanks.

While the holiday probably started as an agricultural festival it was transformed into a historical one. It also commemorated the day that the people received the Torah and the Ten Commandments.

According to one of the traditional legends, at the time that God was giving the Torah there was not a sound throughout the world. It was totally quiet. No birds were chirping, no wind was rustling the leaves, no animals were cooing and no one was talking.

Yet there was a voice. But a voice of silence. An enigma?

Everyone heard the voice of the Divine. Each one heard it in their own way and their own voice.

Can you hear the voice of the Divine? The voice that is telling you to do the right thing, to do the holy thing, to love your neighbor as yourself, to support charities, to be true to our people.

Rabbi's Writings

Rabbi Frank DeWoskin

Growing up, I knew many of the observed Jewish holidays, except when it came to celebrations or observances outside of the usual school year. I did go to an overnight Jewish summer camp. However, the camp's timing was not while the summer holidays took place. I do not recall talking about these days during religious school. Judaism is a religion that we connect with all of the time, all year long. What are the holidays or observances that take place over the summer?

Towards the beginning of the summer is Shavuot. Shavuot this year takes place on June 4 to June 5/June 6. Shavuot celebrates the conclusion of the counting of the Omer, which started the second night of Passover, seven weeks of counting. Shavuot is a spring harvest holiday as well as the traditional anniversary of when we receive the Torah at Mt. Sinai, referred to as revelation. In honor of this celebration, there is traditionally an all-night study session. We also read the book of Ruth which reflects on Ruth, King David's grandmother, and her journey into Judaism and the importance of being a part of the Jewish community. Shavuot is also when we at Beth Emet hold the confirmation service, in which our class is confirming their faith following a powerful 10th grade experience in our Jewish Teen Leadership program.

The next day of observance in the summer is T'sha B'Av, which takes place on the 9th of the Hebrew month of Av, corresponding from August 6 to August 7, this year. Traditionally this is a fast day in which many disasters against the Jewish people are commemorated, specifically the destruction of the First and Second Temples. We read the Book of Lamentations. To be honest, I do not mourn the destruction of the Temples and do not seek for them to be rebuilt. Due to this horrible reality of long ago, we have the Judaism we now observe everywhere in the world. Some people had an idea to make T'sha B'Av a half fast day followed up by a half day of celebration of Judaism today.

The final day of celebration during the summer is Tu B'Av, which takes place on the 15th of Av, corresponding this year to August 11 to August 12. This is essentially a Jewish holiday of love, slightly resembling Valentine's Day. It first started being celebrated in ancient days and recently made a triumphant return in Israel as a festival of singing and dancing.

As the summer winds down with the High Holy Days on the horizon, we utilize the month of Elul to ready ourselves for Rosh Hoshanah and Yom Kippur.

I hope you continue to celebrate Judaism throughout the year, during every season, celebrating Shabbat and all holidays and days of observance. I look forward to living Jewishly with you.

Shinshinim are 18 year-old Israeli emissaries, whose mission is to bring Israel to life inside the walls of TBE. They create a living bridge between our community and Israel. We are excited to welcome Ofri Meirov to TBE as a full time staff member for the 2022-2023 year. She will have an opportunity to infuse Israel into all of our departments and programs.

HOW ARE THEY A PART OF OUR COMMUNITY?

Ofri will take part in innovative Israeli education and engagement programs sponsored by the Jewish Agency for Israel. She will live with host families – we are looking for families with children living at home to host Ofri – for a 3-4 month hosting term.

WHAT IS REQUIRED OF A HOST FAMILY?

Each Shinshin is provided with an insured car, a cell phone, health insurance and a financial stipend through TBE and the Jewish Agency.

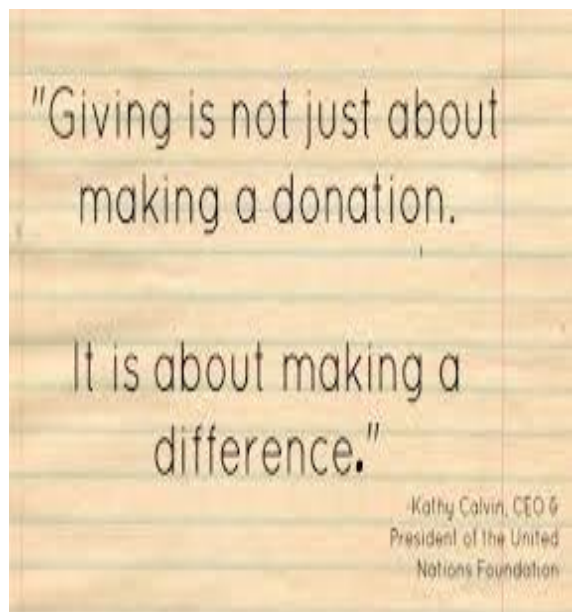

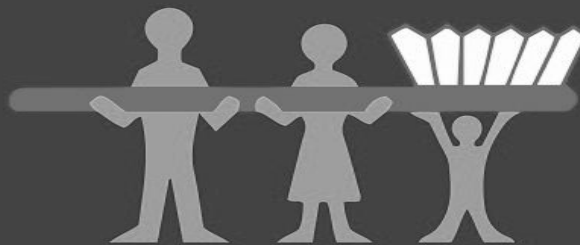
