Rabbi's Writings

Rabbi Frank DeWoskin

Every Rosh Hashanah we celebrate the Jewish New year with song, prayer and reflection. One song we always sing:



Return again, return again, return to the land of your soul.

Return to who you are, return to what you are, return to where you are, born and reborn again.

What does it mean to return again? Why do these words reverberate throughout the High Holy Day time? Is one able to ever return to where we were before?

Starting with the last question, sure we can return physically. We are able to go to the same space we have been before. When we have returned to that given space, after experiencing something in life, we are unable to see that space the same, spiritually and emotionally. Similarly, we often talk about the experience of reading Torah. We can read one verse today. When we approach that same verse a year later or five years later or even eighteen years later, we experience and interpret the verse differently, based upon the experiences we have had. We can return to studying that verse. At the same time, how we understand that verse is not the same.

People have searched for the Garden of Eden. I believe it is more of a conceptual space and less of a physical one. There was a sense of bliss there for Adam and Eve. However, they were in a state of naiveté, unawareness. Once Adam and Eve ate from the tree of knowledge, they could never unlearn what they became aware of. They lost that state of innocence. It is the same in our lives. When we try to return again we are unable to return to the same place, in the same way, as we were before.

What are we returning to if we can never truly go back to where we were? We work hard, especially this time of year, to return to our core values. It is these values that push us to be better versions of our self. By striving to return to an understanding of our essence, our being, we are able to truly grow and better ourselves. As the song states, we return to who we are and we return to what we are.

Returning to where we are born and reborn again is more of a challenging text. This is much more about repetition within our lives. Jewishly, each High Holy Day cycle we reflect similarly. We hear prayers, not just once; we hear them multiple times throughout multiple services. Even Kol Nidre, the powerful prayer said at our evening Yom Kippur service, is recited three times. Repetition allows for the message to really be heard, allowing us time to reflect and return.

Ultimately, we return again to get back to the basics in order to excel both as individuals and as members of the community.

From my family to yours, may your New Year be sweet, filled with health and safety, love and humor. Let us return once again to our core selves.

Shanah Tovah!



Aaron & Brody will be called to the Torah as a B'nai Mitzvah on Friday September 17, 2021.


