Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks wrote, "Happiness takes many forms. There is the happiness of one who is at peace with the word, and the happiness of one who challenges and changes the world. 

The Importance of Classroom Jobs

Students' Monday mornings are exciting at Beth Emet School. It is the start to a great new week, and every student in kindergarten discovers his/her new classroom job. We are greeted with a smile and an air hug at carpool, and the most important question of all, "Are we getting our new jobs today?" We enter the classroom, unpack our backpacks, and sit at our desks at record speed! We greet our distant learners on Zoom, and we are ready for our new weekly jobs. Classroom jobs teach us important life skills, such as early literacy, math, social skills, interdependence and responsibility.

Our jobs teach us early literacy skills. We begin our routine with the <u>Schedule Reader</u>, who reads our daily schedule. It shows us everything that we will be doing that day in order, including our academic subjects, snack time, and most importantly, recess time! Our <u>Calendar Reader</u> signs on to <u>www.starfall.com</u> on the Clear Touch Board. We use an interactive calendar that accommodates both in class and our distant learners. Fridays are special for calendar readers because we get to mark special events that happened during the week, including losing a tooth and celebrating a birthday. Our <u>Mensch Commitment Leader</u> reads us our classroom commitments or rules every morning.

Math concepts are introduced while we are completing jobs. The Days Counter lets us know how many days we have been in school so far and allows us to introduce place value in Kindergarten. We have a pocket chart that includes the ones, tens and hundreds place, and use straws to represent each day. The student counts the straws and puts them in the correct place value along with a number card. Every ten straws create a new bundle, which we put in the tens place. We call this bundle day! Every ten bundles create a bigger 100 bundle that will eventually go into hundreds place. Money Counter follows days counter, placing the correct amount of money in our "bank" that represents how many days of school we have had. This introduces us to different coins, allowing us to see what they look like and how much they are worth. The 100th day of school was exciting because we finally reached \$1.00! The Children Counter's job is done on the Clear Touch Board. They write the addend for girls and boys each and then find the sum of all the children.

We also have our <u>American Flag Holder</u> and <u>Israeli Flag Holder</u> during morning assembly, <u>IT Helper</u>, <u>Weather Reporter</u>, <u>Line Leader</u>, <u>Door Holder</u>, <u>Recess Roundup Leader</u>, <u>Floor Inspector</u>, <u>Noise</u> <u>Monitor</u> and <u>Stretch Leader</u>. They learn important life skills and gain a sense of pride. They learn the sense of responsibility fulfilling their jobs and enjoy feeling that their peers are relying on them. We are an amazing classroom community where everyone is important, reliable and trustworthy! Teaching to the whole child comes to life throughout our day in Kindergarten.

What is a true assessment of a Preschooler?



Each year we meet with families at least twice during the school year to provide a glimpse into their child's school experience. As a researchbased Early Childhood Center we continue to explore what an authentic assessment looks like for a preschooler.

This year we worked hard to create a "Learning Story" for each child. We refer to observations, photos, art and writing samples and informal conversations that take place throughout the year to "assess" each child. We try to touch on the domains of Social/Emotional, Fine Motor, Gross Motor, Cognitive, Literacy, Math and Science to have an overall

view of the students.

Each child is so unique in how they experience their day and how they

learn. We hope that the Learning Story begins to capture the essence of each of our students. We look at their disposition to learn, to try new activities, to persevere, to ask questions and to transfer knowledge. How do they handle change, frustration or waiting? Are they interested in the ideas of others and do they like stories? Who are they as a learner and as a person?

We use assessment every day, from the moment a child gets out of the car to the development of goals for long-term projects - we are constantly assessing. If it were not for assessment, we would not be able to appreciate their accomplishments or build on our next





moves!

Our teachers are extremely familiar with developmentally-appropriate benchmarks. Through detailed observation of our students immersed in learning, our teachers use this benchmark knowledge so that they can share accomplishments with their students and their families, while guiding them toward their next powerful understanding and milestone.

Most importantly, from these observations, teachers plan their next steps, and they plan what areas to target for direct or small group instruction. Teachers ponder what questions the students have as they build high, paint their hands, fit their body into a small cubby, mix ingredients in a science experiment...what are these students trying to figure out and how can we assist them on this journey? We don't give answers, yet we create amazing learning opportunities for their exploration, independent discovery and critical thinking!

Our second installation of Shabbat Across the World – Purim Edition – was a weekend full of "Boo's" for Haman, colorful masks to cover our eyes (not just our mouths), beautiful outside Havdalah service at TBE, time travel at the He'bros drive in movie experience and Mitzvah Madness. Our highlight of the Purim Edition was, however, the smell of Hamantaschen radiating throughout our neighborhood and across the ocean to Israel!



Jennifer and I were thrilled to host our very first virtual Hamantaschen Bake as part of Shabbat Across the World – Purim Edition! It was such an amazing opportunity for us to be able to connect between our Merkaz Limud (Hebrew School) classes & families, our surrounding community, our friends and families in Orlando & Tampa – and best of all, our friends and Partners 2Gether in Nesher, Israel!

We were elated to have more than 70 screens on Zoom, with over 130 participants!

Once everyone was settled in and ready to start, I explained step-by-step the process of making the dough and how to form the shape of Haman's hat. It was very helpful to have the technology that we invested in at the beginning

of the school year, in order to make this experience such a success, including the big 65-inch TV screen and professional camera that allowed us to zoom into and focus on the steps of what I was teaching. Einat Winter, our Partnership 2Gether liaison, helped to manage the chat for any questions or comments posted. It was so much fun to teach a cooking experience, as cooking and baking are both passions of mine. We enjoyed seeing everyone in their homes and in the classrooms participating and having fun.



Once the Hamantaschen were bursting with yummy fillings like chocolate spread, dulce de leche, fruit fillings like raspberry, strawberry, apricot, and formed into their unique triangle shape, participants were let in on the secret



twist that keeps the Hamantaschen from opening up while in the oven. As the delicious smells of Hamantaschen were wafting through the air here and in Israel, we were joined by a very special Gamemaster – Mr. Silvio! Mr. Silvio impressed us with his ability to include every participant, from children to adults, and in English and in Hebrew, in fun games and humor that entertained all of us! He got us moving and grooving while we all anxiously waited for our oven timers to beep!

We truly had such a great time that we are already planning our next cooking experience and will keep you updated with the details. In the meantime, we invite you to go on our Facebook page and check out the beautiful pictures of the yummy Hamantaschen that were baked that day. The smiles on everyone's faces are priceless.
