Rabbi's Ramblings

Passover is the holiday of freedom. Shavuot is the holiday of revelation. But Shavuot, which comes 50 days after Passover and commemorates the giving of the Torah (it probably started as an agricultural festival celebrating the first harvest and the birth of that year's calves and lambs) could also be a holiday of freedom. The Israelites were finally totally free from the slavery of idolatry and paganism.

This year for us Shavuot may also symbolize our freedom from Covid19. No, it is not going away. No, we are not going to be able to go back to the way we were. Yes, we are still going to have to be careful. Yes, many of us, if not most of us, will be getting booster shots and trying to prevent another pandemic.

Five minutes ago, as I sat down to write this message I realized that the name COVID is a homonym for the Hebrew word *kavod*. *Kavod* means honor...to give some *kavod* is to respect them, or to praise them, or to honor them somehow. Queen Esther showed the king *kavod* by not going into his presence unless called. She showed her uncle Mordechai *kavod* by going to the king even though she wasn't called.

We have been and must continue to show *kavod* to Covid by watching out for others. In other words, we must honor, *kavod*, others by being respectful to the power of this little virus. Hopefully, soon we will be giving *kavod* to all the doctors, nurses, health care workers, scientists and others who will bring the pandemic to its knees.

Back to Shavuot: I am hoping that with the advent of the holiday we will begin to return to some sense of normalcy with regard to Shabbat services. Nothing will ever be the same as it was! And that is probably good! Even when we move back into the sanctuary we will be Zooming or offering a virtual option of some sort.

In Israel, which has more or less brought the virus under control, there are limitations on synagogue attendance (sometimes, sadly, violated as we recently saw in the news). Services there are limited to ten participants indoors and to one hundred outdoors. Our TBE policy has our current indoor services limited to seventy-five assuming that at least forty attendees have been vaccinated. These limits have been for weddings and b'nai mitzvah where guests can be pre-screened. We can't pre-screen for regular services which is why we have been hesitant to fully or even partially re-open "normal services" because we have to show *kavod* to those among us who may be immuno-compromised or more susceptible to infection. We will open up more and more as the infection rates in Florida and Broward drop below 5%.

In the meantime, watch the eblasts for information. And as Shavuot will soon be upon us, sit down on Sunday evening the 16th and read the Book of Ruth and have a cheese blintz a traditional holiday food.

Every year, in May or June, we approach the end of our school year around the time of Shavuot. This holiday is known as the Feast of Weeks as it took seven weeks to get from Egypt to Mt. Sinai, the amount of time from Passover to Shavuot. It is also a pilgrimage festival, Biblically known as the festival of Reaping, a spring harvest festival. It is most well known as the holiday that commemorates God giving the Torah to the nation of Israel.

There is some irony in celebrating the receiving of Torah at the end of our school year. Wouldn't it be nice to celebrate receiving of the Torah at the beginning of the year? In reality, this holiday falls when it does because it is a Spring harvest holiday, **and** how symbolic it is that we celebrate receiving the Law just as we reflect on the information we received over the past year. It's a celebration not of beginning to study, rather a celebration of learning.

There is a midrash found in the Talmud that talks about staying up all night as people should not sleep the night before hearing God's voice in the morning. This was the custom of the High Priest. In another midrash it is written that the Israelites slept so deeply the night before the Torah was revealed they had to be awakened with thunder and lightning.

Many communities have all-night or a late night study sessions, a practice followed from these midrashim and put into practice by Kabbalists in S'fat as a way to celebrate the revelation of Torah at Mt. Sinai.

At Temple Beth Emet, we traditionally hold our confirmation class' service during Shavuot. At this time the 10th grade students lead the service and talk about what their Judaism means to them. They recognize that Judaism is not about becoming a bar or bat mitzvah. Judaism is a lifelong journey, and includes many milestones along the way. While we do not have a confirmation class this year, I look forward to confirmation services for years to come. There is something meaningful and powerful in the words of our students as they talk about the strength of the past supporting a bright and hopeful future.

When we wrap up our school year there is always reason to celebrate. Whether in merkaz limud (religious school), Jewish teen leadership, early childhood, elementary school, middle school, youth group, camp, any of our adult opportunities or in services, there were so many moments of growth and learning, with many wonderful questions being asked.

Thank you to everyone who participated in some capacity of learning through the year. There is always an opportunity to celebrate what you have learned. There are always opportunities to learn, for the first time or as refresher. May we all continue learning and growing together.

Israel Celebrates 73 Years of Independence

Throughout their long history, the yearning to return to the Land of Israel has been the focus of Jewish life. Independence Day is a celebration of the renewal of the Jewish state in the land where the Jewish people began to develop its distinctive religion and culture. Israel Independence Day is celebrated annually on the anniversary of the establishment of the State of Israel, according to the Hebrew calendar, on the 5th day of the month of Iyar.

Celebrating Yom Ha'atzmaut has been a way to express solidarity with the state of Israel and to strengthen their alliance with it.

Beth Emet School strives to provide excellence to our students, so they develop a passion for learning, infused with Jewish values, commitment to the Jewish community and connection to the State of Israel.

At Beth Emet School Israel is studied throughout the whole year from different perspectives. Here we look to develop a keen understanding of Jewish concepts, values and mitzvot. As part of our Jewish History class, the students learn about the major events and personalities that shaped the lives of our forebears. We explore the diverse ways in which the Jewish people have adapted and continue to adapt to changing times and circumstances. The goal is to enrich the students' knowledge and appreciation of the Jewish inheritance and feel proud of our history, Jewish life and traditions.

Our Primary Hebrew Curriculum is based on the notion that the best learning environment for children is one in which knowledge is acquired through a variety of activities using each of the five senses. Our program encompasses a wide range of activities through various modes of communication. It integrates Hebrew language with the development of Jewish concepts, values, reading and writing skills. We create a visual and oral Hebrew environment in the classroom, allowing the students to learn through pictures, songs, workbooks, reading books, conversation and challenging games using our technology with the Clear Touch interactive board & digital media.

This year our Upper Elementary classes started a new interactive Hebrew program, called Chaverim B'Ivrit. Hebrew language is acquired in contents relevant to the students' lives and cultural backgrounds. The program brings modern Hebrew based on the most current understanding of language acquisition in children including the need to transfer and apply learning in new context and situations. The lessons revolve around themes like family, friendship, traveling, food and music. Exposing our students to use multiple genres, stories, conversations, poems, songs, journals and bulletin boards, will give our students the opportunity to think, write and communicate in Hebrew and to treat Hebrew as a living language.

Our Middle schoolers continue the modern Hebrew language approach, from digital readings, conversations and discussions of the latest news of Israel, through reading comprehension of secular and religious texts. Every student is given the opportunity to explore his/her points of view towards the State of Israel, its people in Israel and in the Golah (Jews outside the State of Israel), supporting every student's social and emotional development.

At Beth Emet School we create a school culture where every student feels supported and valued. We feel fortunate to be able to teach students about our Jewish inheritance history and modern Hebrew language, so that they may strive to safeguard and preserve their cultural, religious and civic rights.

We practiced the art of truly listening to the students. We wanted to hear what they were interested in, what were they pondering and thinking about, and then from there our lessons were built!

The joy and enthusiasm for learning was so evident. The children loved the loose parts in our classes. These pieces allowed the children to expand their creativity and imaginations. The joy they had in building with stones, rocks, keys and beads was evident. In addition to this, the new blocks on our school playground were so popular. Building was a favored activity in all of our classes this year. From the blocks to the Magna-Tiles to the boxes the students built! They planned, they worked together, they learned about balance, design and gravity, and they explored height and size. They used their minds creatively each day as they built. They problem-solved independently and formed amazing friendships. In addition to the excitement of exploring a "play-based" curriculum we continued to follow the high standards of our NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) accreditation. We strive to build each child's skills and abilities academically and socially.



As we finish the year I take this time to reflect on the past ten months. Our enrollment is strong and we are proud to end the year with 205 students! This is an amazing achievement as we move through this Pandemic. The care and attention each teacher gave their students was our biggest accomplishment. From sitting with a child individually, to helping them create a piece of art, to guiding them so that they could express themselves, to running with them on the playground, we value and cherish our thousands of interactions and moments with each child. In addition to this we respected and valued their independence. We discover how intelligent they are when we step back and watch them with their friends or on their own! Each year, Dina and I challenge the teachers to learn exciting and new ways to facilitate

learning, conflict resolution and problem-solving in the classroom. With our continued emphasis on professional development our teachers are able to stay creative and fresh in their classroom strategies.

Dear Staff, this paragraph is for you. Thank you for emerging at whatever pace you are comfortable with - we are a great team! Thank you for challenging yourselves and for reflecting, growing and learning each day alongside your students! Thank you for coming to work each day in the face of this Pandemic with your masks and the Florida heat...you persevered. With your determination, your rigor and your commitment, the children at our school were able to experience a regular school day, as they deserve.

The office team that runs our school is outstanding. Miss Dina, Miss Aimee and Miss Lily work hard and diligently to keep our school running. I am so fortunate because when we work, we brainstorm together, we share ideas and sometimes we laugh. Thank you for working in a team that values hard work and partnership with a side of laughter! A job with laughter is a job worth doing!

Thank you to our PTO board for helping us and for supporting us in family programs and for taking care of our staff and the millions of little and big things you did behind the scenes. Our Nesher Connection

Our Merkaz Limud has been participating in Jewish Federation of Broward County's "School Twinning" program for many years, also sponsored by the Jewish Agency for Israel. Jennifer and I were fortunate enough to, separately, travel to Israel and visit our Nesher counterparts <https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Nesher>.

We toured some of their schools, got to know some of the students there, and broke bread with members of the Nesher community. We gave presentations about life in Broward County and about our Temple Beth Emet community. Our trips to Nesher reinforced our mindset that Israel should be part of our curriculum throughout the school year, not just during Yom Ha'atzmaut in the spring. That is one of the reasons we choose to participate in the School Twinning Partnership2Gether program every year, so that our students understand that Israel is not just a foreign place off in the distance, but that it is our homeland, filled with Jewish children that are just like them.

During the school year, our 6th Grade students celebrated Jewish holidays together with our 6th grade friends at Giliot School in Nesher, including Chanukah and Purim. This past month we also celebrated Yom Ha'atzmaut – Israel's Independence Day – together! Both sides prepared questions to ask each other about Independence Day in their respective countries. "What is the overall message of the Declaration of Independence?" "When was Independence Day declared in Israel?" "What are some facts about the American flag? The Israeli flag?" "How do you celebrate Independence Day in your country?" "Why do you think it's important to celebrate Independence Day?" These questions help to show the students on both sides of the ocean that they are more similar in their traditions and celebrations than they may think. Our goal is that when it comes time for any of our families to visit Israel, possibly even for Bar/Bat Mitzvah time, they will make a stop in Nesher as part of their tour. Our hope is that through personal interactions, our students will develop a sense of belonging and the drive to visit not just Israel as the country, homeland, but to visit a friend...learn their culture, taste their food, and realize that they are all teens with the same aspirations.

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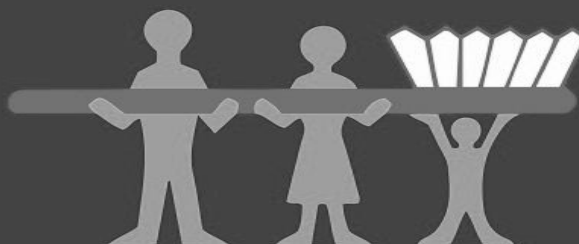

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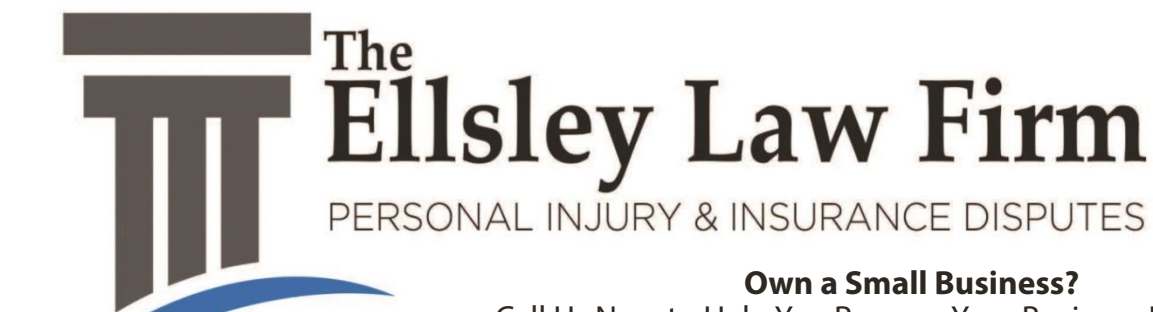
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
