Rabbinically Yours By Rabbi Earl Kideckel



Would you like to feel a sense that spring is in the air? Here in America, we have the tradition of Groundhog Day. Reporters gather in Pennsylvania to witness as a frightened groundhog looks to see if he sees his shadow. With all of the fanfare, on February 2nd, the crowd will gather to see Punxsutawney Phil's prediction. If he sees his shadow, we will embrace another six weeks of winter and, if

he does not, then we can assume that we will enjoy an earlier spring. (BTW, I wonder if the organizer of the event might consider a Phyl one year instead of a Phil. Perhaps she might be more accurate in her predictions.)

In Jewish tradition, we mark the awaiting of spring in a much different way. We read in the Talmudic tractate Rosh Hashanah 14a: "The mishna taught: **On the first of Shevat is the new year for trees**, according to the statement of Beit Shammai. The Gemara asks: **What is the reason** that the new year for trees was set on this date? **Rabbi Elazar said that Rabbi Oshaya said:** The reason is **since** by that time **most of the year's rains have already fallen, and most of the season, i.e., winter, is yet to come**, as it continues until the spring equinox, which usually occurs in Nisan."

The rabbis of the Talmud were quite clear that nature is somewhat predictable. In that matter, spring will not happen until the month of Nisan, when we will celebrate what is referred to as the festival that ushers in spring, better known as Passover. Phil or Phyl can be coaxed out of the ground, but Spring, with a winter even without snow shoveling, traditionally occurs around the month of Nisan.

Rashi adds a most interesting point with regard to the Jewish month of Shevat, which almost always occurs in the secular month of February. In commenting on the piece from the Talmud he adds: "Since most of the seasonal rain has come, it is the time of flowering and **the sap rises** in the trees as the fruit begins to ripen."

As I think about the tradition in our Tu B'Shevat seder, the mixing of the red wine into the white wine in gradations through the four cups might be symbolic of the emergence of the sap within the tree, in its different stages; not only of the changes within the season from winter to spring, from snow

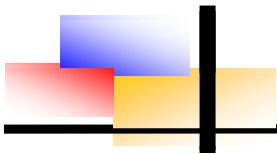
Any monetary donations to help cover the cost of materials for this mitzvah project would be greatly appreciated.
