

Rabbinically Yours By Rabbi Earl Kideckel



We all know the words “*Hinei ma tov umanayim, shevet achim gam yachad.*” It is one of our favorite melodies that we enjoy singing as we begin services. And the words remind us how wonderful it is that we, as a community and congregation, can join together to celebrate and experience different moments in our own personal lives, in the Jewish calendar and in the secular calendar.

The month of May brings us many different opportunities to enjoy each other’s company:
For the first time since I have been here as your rabbi (and that is going on three years), we will join together for an erev Shabbat service on Friday evening May 19th, *in person* at Temple Emanu-El, followed by a Shabbat dinner. At that time we will say a *todah rabbah* on behalf of our congregation to Oma and Omer, our *shinshinim* (emissaries), for their work in our community. We will also celebrate the completion of study of our students in our religious school. It seems quite odd that it has taken three years to finally enjoy a Shabbat meal and services together under one roof, but I am hoping that we will be able to find many more such occasions as our plans for our own shul building come into fruition. Marcia Reinhard will be joining us as well, and for the first time, she and I will be leading services together in person.

Our Jewish community will join together on Thursday evening May 25th for a most interesting Shavuot discussion at Temple Emanu-El. The topic will be “*Dirshuni*,” (“Interpret Me”) where we will study texts that need reinterpretation in a woman’s voice. The discussion will revolve around the texts associated with Lot’s wife turning to a pillar of salt, and how we can understand the text through a woman’s eye and how perhaps she was punished for unfair charges. We will also have breakout sessions where we will have the opportunity to take a male oriented midrash and reclaim it in a female voice. We will also have the opportunity to schmooze over some Shavuot dairy snacks.

On Friday morning, May 26th, we will reconvene at Congregation Beth Jacob, in Norwich, where as one congregational voice we will join together to celebrate Shavuot and recite Yizkor.

On Memorial Day Weekend Shabbat morning, we will join again at Temple Israel (Park St. shul across from Ocean Beach) for Shabbat morning services. During that service we will pause to reflect upon the bravery and service of the many men and women who have served in our Armed Forces and have passed away as we commemorate Memorial Day as a congregation.

I look forward to your joining us for these wonderful opportunities.

Dear Congregants,

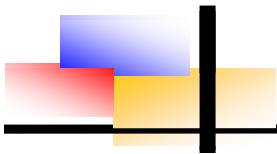
