Theodore Herzl is often quoted: "Im tirzu, eyn zo aggadah," "If you truly want it, then it is not simply a dream." If there was one motto that truly represents Judy Engel and her presidency here at Congregation Beth El, then perhaps it might be Herzl's vision. For the past two years, and even before as vice-president, Judy has had a dream for our shul and she continually and tirelessly has worked to make it a reality. No matter where she is in the world, even on

cruises in the Mediterranean or during intermission while attending a show on Broadway, her focus has been on our congregation.

I first got to know Judy (and Kirk) one on one, at a Saturday evening dinner during my interview weekend almost three and a half years ago. Lisa and I recognized how wonderful Judy (and Kirk) are as individuals. They are so personal, caring and thoughtful. We also realized that Judy would go the extra mile for our congregation. And similar to her predecessor, Kathleen, she truly has led and guided our congregation in a most unbelievable manner.

If you were to follow Judy around for twenty-four hours, you might be exhausted. First and foremost is her family. She is often visiting her mother in Amherst, MA, or her daughter and her family in Pittsburgh (with Kirk as her chauffeur). Her other children also have her undivided attention. Then there are all of the other volunteering efforts she and Kirk do to aid other individuals both in communal organizations or just as individuals. How often will I call Judy to find out that she is the middle of driving someone to a doctor's appointment, the grocery store or some other venue.

And then there is us, and we come a close first. Her calendar has been filled with meetings arranging for everything from programming and making sure that a congregant has a wonderful experience, to that of working on our future home and building with committees, the architect, the zoning department in Waterford and other areas. Often, we will talk about a program, and Judy is already making lists of food that she personally does the shopping for, or what the steps are that we need to all engage ourselves in to make the program a success. When just recently, the Holiday Inn erred and booked the room we had tentative reservations for the High Holy Days, Judy immediately put on her thinking cap and invited the High Holy Day Committee to join her at four different locations to check on their viability. And once a decision was made, she immediately secured the Hilton Garden Inn in Groton for Rosh Hashanah, as well as securing the Holiday Inn for Yom Kippur and for High Holy Day Services (if needed) for the following year. She spends countless hours on the phone or walking with our congregants just to get their opinion. And then there is Shabbat mornings, where she often arrives earlier than scheduled to help setup the audio equipment necessary to bring our services to those who are joining us via Zoom. Needless to say, when it was time to move from Crossroads, she quickly made arrangements with Temple Emanu-El to lease their facility for Shabbat morning services and for other events. Most of us do not realize the amount of time, effort and emotional stamina that Judy has put into our congregation. It goes far beyond the traditional shul presi-



Radical: My Journey Out of Islamist Extremism

by Majid Nawaz

Maajid Nawaz spent his teenage years listening to American hip-hop and learning about the radical Islamist movement spreading throughout Europe and Asia in the 1980s and 90s. At 16, he was already a ranking member in Hizb ut-Tahrir, a London-based Islamist group. He quickly rose through the ranks to become a top recruiter, a charismatic spokesman for the cause of uniting Islam's political power across the world. Nawaz was setting up satellite groups in Pakistan, Denmark, and Egypt when he was rounded up in the aftermath of 9/11 along with many other radical Muslims.

He was sent to an Egyptian prison where he was, fortuitously, jailed along with the assassins of Egyptian President Anwar Sadat. The 20 years in prison had changed the assassins' views on Islam and violence; Maajid went into prison preaching to them about the Islamist cause, but the lessons ended up going the other way. He came out of prison four years later completely changed, convinced that his entire belief system had been wrong, and determined to do something about it.

He met with activists and heads of state, built a network, and started a foundation, Quilliam, to combat the rising Islamist tide in Europe and elsewhere, using his intimate knowledge of recruitment tactics in order to reverse extremism and persuade Muslims that the 'narrative' used to recruit them (that the West is evil and the cause of all of Muslim suffering), is false. Radical, first published in the UK, is a fascinating and important look into one man's journey out of extremism and into something else entirely.
