President's Message



Dear Beth El Congregants,

Well, I guess the day has finally arrived when I take over the reins of the presidency of Congregation Beth El. I have to say that I'm a little apprehensive since my training is in chemistry, and I'm not so sure that 35 years at Pfizer (now retired) have prepared me all that well for my role in the administration of a synagogue. Nevertheless, I look forward to doing my part in service to the congregation, and I am very heartened by all the support and training that I have already received from my predeces-

sors, especially outgoing President Judy Engel, Rabbi Kideckel, Merrill and Melanie in the office, members of the Board of Directors, and all the wonderful congregants that I've interacted with since taking on the role of 1st Vice President in 2021. To paraphrase Isaac Newton, "... I stand on the shoulders of giants."

As I begin to get acclimated to my new role, I've been thinking about the goals of my presidency. I received some excellent advice from Rabbi Kideckel in which he instructed me to focus on a couple of really important goals, rather than a large number of goals that would just not get done due to dilution of my and the leadership's efforts. First and foremost, I'd like to maintain, and possibly accelerate, the excellent forward progress of my predecessors on the construction of our new home at 33 Kenyon Rd. in Waterford. Second, I'm hoping to build on the great ruach and community spirit that our congregation exhibits by encouraging and potentially realizing more participation from the various members of the congregation in all sorts of activities.

Regarding the first of these goals, the construction drawings for our new home have been developed to the point of being able to submit the application to the Town of Waterford for approval. This application went into the appropriate Planning & Zoning personnel on July 18 and includes copies of the application, supporting written materials, the soils report, rendering of the proposed project, site/landscape plan, architectural plans and elevations, site utility plan and photometric study and the civil engineering design documents. Barring any significant revisions from the P&Z Commission, we anticipate that the construction documents should be available to solicit bids in early November. As our property is already zoned for a place of worship, we hope to break ground later this year.

As for the second goal of encouraging and augmenting participation, our 1st Vice President, Jeff Dubins, and I are thinking about ways to get more participation from the congregation. Specifically, our feeling is that we are entering a new and exciting phase of Congregation Beth El as we make steady progress towards the construction of our new synagogue at 33 Kenyon Rd. Furthermore, we will also be celebrating the Centennial Anniversary of Congregation Beth El next year. We have faced several challenges since the sale of 660 Ocean Ave, including finding a new rabbi, Rabbi Kideckel, finding places to daven, dealing with COVID, and finding our new home. Through all of this we have remained a strong, supportive, and dedicated community. Jeff and I and the Board would like to take this opportunity to express our sincere gratitude for your patience and support during these times.

Nonetheless, there is a lot of work needing to be done, most immediately, for the upcoming High Holidays and preparing for the interior design of our new shul. By virtue of this article in our bulletin, we are hereby reaching out to the Beth El community to help in these endeavors. While the responsibility for these projects is shared



How to Find Your Way in the Dark

Finalist for the National Jewish Book Award and a NYT Best Mystery of 2021: Twelve-year old Sheldon Horowitz is still recovering from the tragic loss of his mother only a year ago when a suspicious traffic accident steals the life of his father near their home in rural Massachusetts. With his eye always on vengeance for his father's murder, Sheldon stakes out his place in a world he now understands is comprised largely of crimes: right and wrong, big and small.
