Rabbinically Yours By Rabbi Earl Kideckel



Just as the month of October brings on the fall season and the end of the harvest, the middle of the Jewish month of *Tishrei* heralds the celebration of the festival of *Sukkot*. It is quite interesting that both of these months celebrate the end of the harvest, one with adorning the outside of our homes with cornstalks and pumpkins, and the other sitting in a *sukkah* decorated with the fruits of the end of the harvest. Both

October and *Tishrei* are times of finding the way not only to recognize the beauty of creation and of the miracle of farming and its importance in our lives, but also spending time with friends, family and neighbors outdoors for one last time, before the chill of the fall and winter seasons come upon us.

Here at Congregation Beth El, both October and *Tishrei* and the month of Cheshvan that follows will provide us with the opportunity to join together outside of our usual locations. 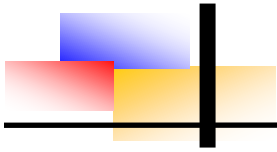
In that regard, a *todah rabbah* to all of those who helped make the High Holidays

President's Message



Dear Beth El Congregants,

As I write this message to you all, we have just finished up the High Holidays and we're now moving into the fall with Sukkot, Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah right around the corner. I don't know about you, but for me, as the High Holiday season draws to a close, I get a feeling of great relief. Primarily, this is from the release of the mental and spiritual energy and focus that I put into introspection of my actions of the past year and my aspirations for the future. As we read in the mahzor, we are

hopeful that "repentance, prayer and tzedakah avert the severe decree." I hope this is realized for all of you and your families.

This year, my sense of relief has been augmented from another source; that is, the ability to take a deep breath after all the logistical hubbub of the High Holiday services is over. As President, this year I was able to get some real insight into how the (kosher) sausage is made, and I have to say that I'm so impressed with not only the attention to detail throughout the whole process, but also in the level of volunteerism that I witnessed. I made mention of this in my Kol Nidre Appeal speech and I'm not going to go into significant detail here. Suffice to say that we have compiled a long list of thank you's going out to a wide range of congregants who made this year's High Holiday services a reality. This includes schlepping equipment and mahzorim from our office on Shaw St., our trailer at Temple Emanu-El and the storage room at Beth Jacob, as well as set-up, breakdown, tech support, polishing silver, obtaining flowers, baking, stuffing bags, coordinating honors, arranging for Torah readers, greeting congregants, cooking meals for Hazzan Dorman, providing musical accompaniment, and compiling the Yizkor book. You can find this detailed thank you on page 9 of this Bulletin.

Until I joined the High Holiday Task Force this year, I had no idea how much is involved in making the High Holiday services a reality. And of course, a huge thank you and Yasher Koach go out to Rabbi Kideckel for making the experience as spiritually rewarding as it was. In addition, it was such a pleasure to have Hazzan Dorman with us again this year.

As we move into October, please keep an eye on the weekly announcements for upcoming services and programs. First up are "Pizza in the Sukkah" at the home of Judy and Kirk Engel (Oct. 1), followed by a community Simchat Torah program at Congregation Ahavath Achim in Colchester (Oct. 7), the kick-off of the Knitzvah-New London project at the home of Nancy Brand (Oct. 15) and a Dinner & Daven at the home of Judi and Ed Goldberg (Oct. 27).

In the meantime, I wish you all a sweet New Year and, as president of Congregation Beth El, I will always welcome your questions and comments.

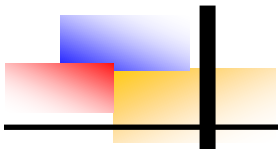

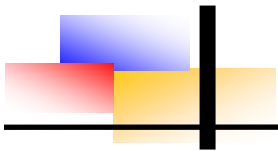

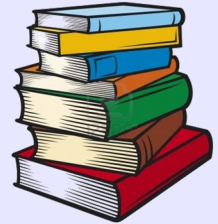

by Kai Bird and Martin J. Sherwin

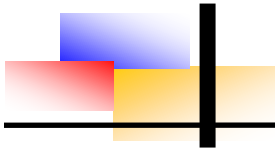
