Chanukah Lights for Israel

The month of Kislev provides us with the opportunity to spend time celebrating spirit vs might. We read in the Haftorah for Chanukah, from the words of the prophet Zechariah, that "not by might and not by power, but by My spirit" (Zechariah 4:6). Such a vision is quite complicated in wake of October 7th. How does one understand the nature of the miracle of Chanukah this year, as we are

aware that there are still many hostages in the hands of the terrorists Hamas?

During the time of the Maccabees, it became clear that My spirit is related to peaceful times. However, when the enemy needed to be defeated, then the might of military strength and force was required to remove the Graeco -Romans from overthrowing not only the Jewish religious traditions, but also the political ones, so that Judaism as a religious cultural society could survive.

Those who attend our Friday evening Kabbalat Shabbat services hear me say, each week, as we read "Or zaruah latzadik" that a light should shine for the righteous, that we shine our light upon the hostages and the men and women serving in the IDF. That the light of freedom and the light that guides them through their military service provide them with, not only God's protection and spirit, but of our prayers and hopes for them and for the State of Israel. As we light our Chanukah candles each night this year, may those lights serve in the same manner, as lights of hope that the miracle of freedom may shine upon both the hostages and the IDF.

On a different note, Lisa and I would like to thank all of you who have made calls, sent us notes or emails to wish us a mazal tov on the birth of our granddaughters, Ruby and Isla. We are grateful to those who have also made donations to our congregation in honor of their birth.



President's Message



Dear Beth El Congregants,

There are two subjects that I'd like to touch on this month, the ongoing war between Israel and Hamas, and the progress with our new building. As for the former, the situation in the Middle East continues to be extremely distressing. Like everyone else I am ecstatic that some of the hostages have been released. The fact that most of them are now with their families must be an indescribable comfort to them and all their loved ones. Unfortu-

nately, the fact remains that the large majority of the hostages are still in the hands of Hamas, and, if the recent reports can be verified, some are in the hands of other terrorists in Gaza. The brutality of these terrorist groups continues to be on display as they use our innocent civilian abductees to bargain for humanitarian aid which they will undoubtedly divert to their own fighters and precious time in which they can solidify their positions. The fact that many of the hostages have been released while Hamas continues to hold their family members shows the cold and calculating way in which these terrible people operate. The other thing that they're trying to do, by delaying the release of the hostages, is to put as much time between the present and the awful events of October 7 so that world opinion might shift towards their cause. In fact, the response by much of the world is so outrageously amoral that it's hard to fathom. Nevertheless, we are still hopeful that the release of the hostages will continue and once it's done the IDF can return to its totally justified policy of rooting out Hamas and relegating them to the dustbin of history. We stand with Israel in our thoughts and prayers.

As for the new building, I wish I had some better news. To recap, we've been in a holding pattern for a couple of months due to the subject of wetlands. While we don't have issues or concerns over how to build on the lot such that the building will stay dry and stable, the paperwork doesn't match what's on the ground, as was made clear when the wetlands folks walked the site with our soil scientist and found some discrepancies. In fact, prior to this morning I was planning to communicate that we had overcome this hurdle with the Town through the results of recent test diggings that we had performed at the site. I was hopeful that we would get the final clearance from the Conservation Commission (CC) at their Dec 7 meeting such that we would be able to proceed to Town Planning and Zoning immediately afterwards. However, I received some informal information this morning that the CC may not be willing to accept our revised plans without a full reapplication. This would be a serious delay and, at this point, I am unwilling to even hazard a guess as to how long. Once again, I wish I had better news, but in the meantime, please be assured that we are making every effort to keep this precious project moving along. In addition, as things seem to turn on a dime, I will endeavor to provide more frequent updates.

Looking forward to December, once again we have a number of exciting programs on the horizon, including, but not limited to, a Hannukah party on Dec. 9th at Temple Emanu-El and another Dinner and Daven, this time hosted by Phyllis Holtzman and Richie Simonson on Dec. 15th. Please check the weekly announcements for RSVP dates and costs. And finally, I would like to express a big Todah Rabbah for all those who donated to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund for the purpose of providing tactical helmet lights to a unit of the IDF. And a special Mazel Tov to Rabbi and Lisa Kideckel on the birth and health of their two granddaughters, Ruby and Isla, who are now home with their parents, Stacey and Sam

Please don't forget to call into the daily minyan and/or come to Shabbat services. You need this as much as the rest of the congregation does.

Congregation Beth El is Providing Light to the IDF

A few weeks ago, I received a call from Lisa and my cousin, Sam, in Israel who is a member of one unit of navy seals in need of some additional gear that would help them. Originally, we agreed to provide them with protective sunglass eyewear for a unit of twenty-five. While Sam was preparing to purchase the equipment, his reserve unit was called into service in Gaza. For days neither his parents, nor us, heard anything from him. Just a few days ago, the unit returned safely. During their mission, somehow another group was able to provide them with the protective eye gear. They immediately purchased tactical helmet lights, instead, which were shipped to them while at the border and which they used in Gaza.

Through the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund, we have provided them with these tactical lights. Some of you had heard of Sam's call to me and have already donated towards this special cause. Each one of these tactical helmet lights costs approximately \$115. I know that Sam's

unit appreciates that we have provided them with the gear. 




