This year, we as a community need to drown out the name of Haman more than ever, as we stand strong together with Israel and the hostages. Think about the fact that Haman and Hamas are almost similar in their English spelling. But in their actions, they are but one and the same. And while in Israel and around the world we may be thinking of tempering the celebrations, based on the war and the hostage situation (may they come home now!), let us not give in to Hamas' desire to destroy what is ours – the right to celebrate being Jewish and the right to defend ourselves from aggression and destruction at the hands of Haman, Hamas and their likes.

If Purim is at the end of this month, Passover is soon to follow. Many of the stores are already stocking their shelves, not realizing that this year is a Jewish leap year and Passover is near the end of April. We will once again be holding a virtual second night Passover seder from the Kideckel home.

#### **President's Message**



Dear Beth El Congregants,

As Israel's war in Gaza progresses inexorably towards the goals of the defeat of Hamas and the return of all the remaining 134 hostages, I am still appalled that it seems as if the entire world is calling on Israel to institute an immediate cease-fire. And, of course, the world seems ready to reward the savage attack

and massacre of Oct 7 with the ever-demanded "2 state solution". Whatever your feelings about Netanyahu, and I realize he is quite the controversial figure, both in Israel and abroad, I, for one, am extremely grateful and proud that the Israeli government is not bowing to world pressure to allow Hamas to escape with what they will consider total victory. As painful as this is for both the IDF and their families, as well as whatever innocent civilians there are in Gaza, it's glaringly obvious that this war needs to end with the destruction of Hamas, the return of the hostages and the ultimate deradicalization of Gaza, Judea and Samaria, before any discussion about a 2-state solution makes any sense whatsoever. Once again, I pray for a speedy end to this conflict with Israel achieving its goals. May Hashem protect our troops and the Jewish people everywhere.

As for our new synagogue structure, we are building on the good news that we received at the end of Jan when our application to the inland wetlands commission was approved. Over the month of Feb, we assembled the full submissions to the next two committees, the Design and Review Board and the Planning and Zoning Commission. These should be formally accepted by both committees at their respective meetings on Feb 27. Unfortunately, it's very difficult to predict how long these next approvals might take; we are hopeful that it will not require the full 65 days that they are entitled to, nor will it require any type of public hearing which could also inject a delay. In the meantime, our team has refocused attention on completing the detailed construction documents that are required to obtain bids from various contactors. Hopefully the bidding process can run in parallel to the issuing of the building permit (following approval by town P&Z). As always, please stay tuned for developments as they occur.

As for programming, just a quick reminder that back at the end of Jan we held a wildly successful Tu B' Shevat seder with Israeli wine (and foods) and a Tree of Life Art Project led by Henie Kurzman at Temple Emanu-El (TEE). In addition, by the time you receive this Bulletin we should have held our "Havdalah and Impossible Beef Chili Dinner" and sing-along, featuring music by Roz Etra, at the home of Judy and Kirk Engel, on Feb 24. Coming up on Mar 10, the Breakfast Club event that was postponed due to inclement weather last month will be occurring at the Waterford Community Center. This will be a morning minyan (9:00), followed by a lox and bagel breakfast, and then a presentation by Stacey Sobel, CT Regional Director at ADL, who will speak on *Stand Up to Antisemitism and Hate: What It Is and What We Can Do About It Together*. Finally, mark your calendars for an evening of Purim celebration on Saturday March 23. This will start with a community-wide Purim spiel with hamantaschen at TEE, followed by Havdalah and then the megillah reading. As always, I would like to express a big Todah Rabbah for all

Please don't forget to call into the daily minyan and/or come to Shabbat services. You need this as much as the rest of the congregation does.




