Rabbi Wolintz-Fields is one of the Women's League representatives to the Conference of Presidents of Major American Organizations.

She has been invited to deliver Opening Prayers at the United States House of Representatives, the New Jersey Senate, the New Egypt Speedway, and the Ocean County College Commencement. She is one of the featured Rabbis on the cover of the book "When Rabbis Bless Congress."

Together with her husband Jonathan, they are the proud parents of three children, and live in Ocean Township, New Jersey.

The minyan will always have a minimum of ten participating by stream. Therefore, the services will still include those parts that require a minyan and will fulfill that obligation. This includes the mourner's kaddish.
