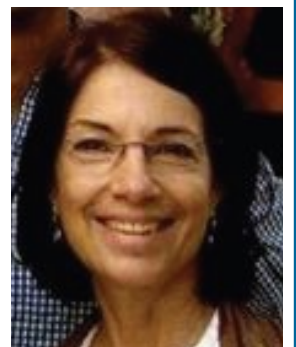


### Virtual Inclusion Shabbat TONIGHT! Friday, February 18 • 6:30 pm

### From Women's Tefilla at the Kotel to the Kotel Deal: Whose Space, Whose Practice? Sunday, February 27 • 1 pm



Shulamit Magnus is Professor Emerita of Jewish Studies and History at Oberlin College. She is a National Jewish Book award winner and a founder of women's group prayer at the Kotel. She is the first-named plaintiff in a case before the Supreme Court of Israel asking enforcement of Jewish women's already recognized right to read Torah at the Kotel, using scrolls held there. Magnus opposes the Kotel deal, which would criminalize women's group prayer at the Kotel.

The minyan will always have a minimum of ten participating by stream. Rabbi Weiss has ruled, based on rabbinic and *halakhic* sources, that – on a temporary, emergency basis, and not as a permanent change – a minyan may be comprised of ten Jews at different locations linked over the internet. Therefore, the services will still include those parts that require a minyan and will fulfill that obligation. This includes the mourner's kaddish.
