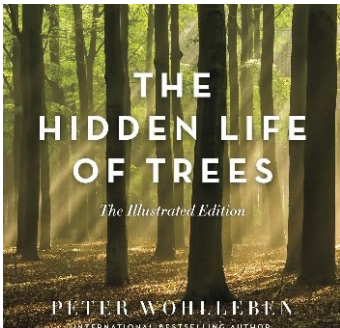

Saturday, January 27 • 7 pm • The Wicked Plant Co.

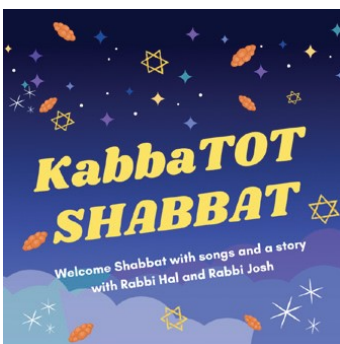

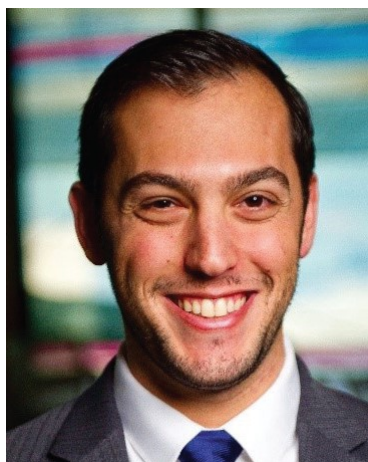

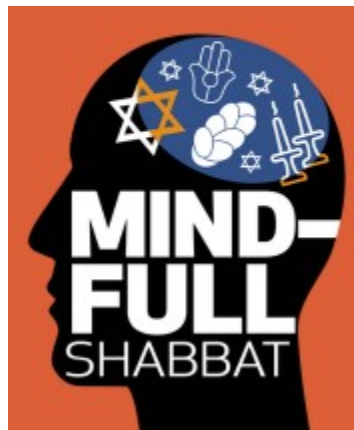
