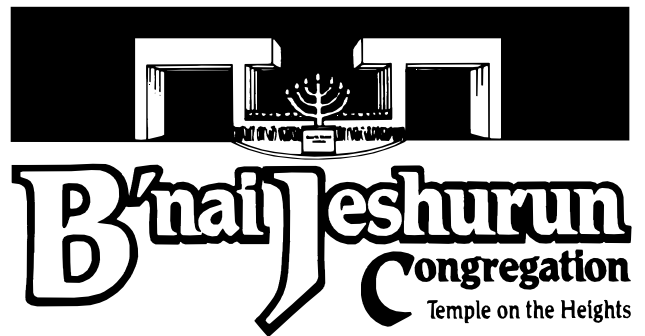

Red, White & Blue Parade Sunday, July 5 • 11 am - Noon

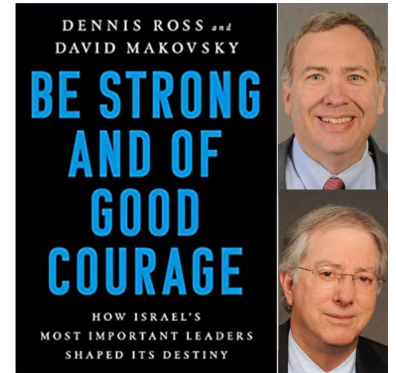

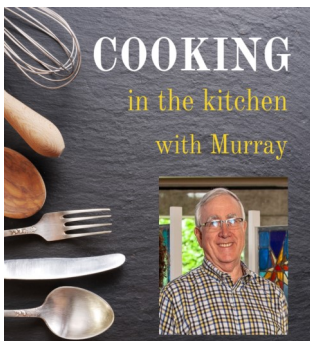
**How Israel's Most Important Leaders Shaped Its Destiny and Lessons

Rabbi Weiss has ruled, based on rabbinic and *halakhic* sources, that – on a temporary, emergency basis, and not as a permanent change – a minyan may be comprised of ten Jews at different locations linked over the internet. Therefore, the services will still include those parts that require a minyan and will fulfill that obligation. This includes the mourner's kaddish.
