Suicide Prevention: A Community Conversation for Saving Lives Sunday, March 27 • 2 pm

Suicide is a word that evokes fear and stigma. Sadly, it happens too often, making it all the more important that we know what to do to prevent it. In this presentation, Dr. Dan Reidenberg, an international mental health and suicide prevention expert, will talk about what we know

about suicide, data on how frequently it occurs and in what age groups, which might surprise you. Dr. Reidenberg will share with us some basic tips on how to ask someone about a mental health challenge and suicide, what to listen for and how to respond. 


