Suicide Prevention: A Community Conversation for Saving Lives Sunday, March 27 • 2 pm

Suicide is a word that evokes fear and stigma. Sadly, it happens too often, making it all the more important that we know what to do to prevent it. In this presentation, Dr. Dan Reidenberg, an international mental health and suicide prevention expert, will talk about what we know about suicide, data on how frequently it occurs and in what age groups, which might surprise you. Dr. Reidenberg will share with us some basic tips on how to ask someone about a mental health challenge and suicide, what to listen for and how to respond. He will also give us recommendations on how to support someone who is grieving the loss of a loved one who died by suicide.

Dr. Reidenberg is the Executive Director of Suicide Awareness Voices of Education, Managing Director of the National Council for Suicide Prevention and is a Special Advisor to the International Association for Suicide Prevention.

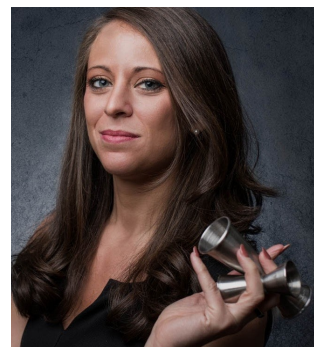

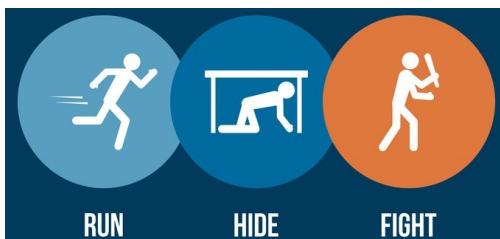
Cantorial Candidate Visit

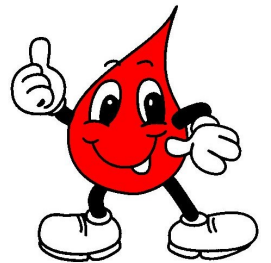

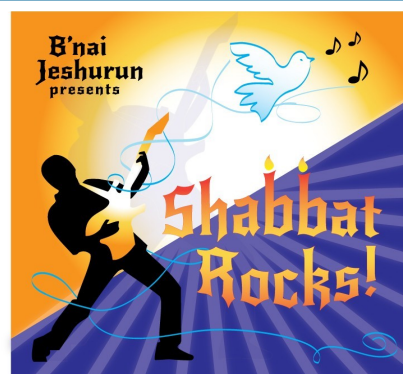

The minyan will always have a minimum of ten participating by stream. Rabbi Weiss has ruled, based on rabbinic and *halakhic* sources, that – on a temporary, emergency basis, and not as a permanent change – a minyan may be comprised of ten Jews at different locations linked over the internet. Therefore, the services will still include those parts that require a minyan and will fulfill that obligation. This includes the mourner's kaddish.
