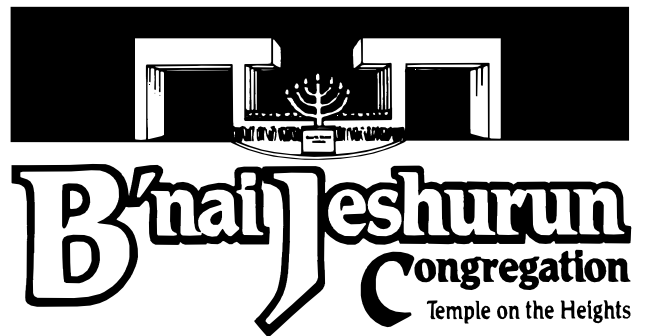

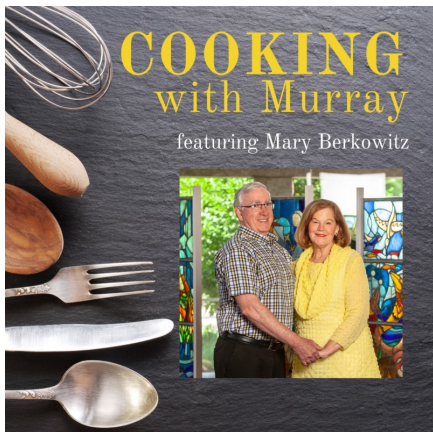

How has a mom from Montana become a leader in fighting anti-Semitism? The founder of a major neo-Nazi website orchestrated a harassment campaign launching a troll storm relentlessly terrorizing Tanya Gersh and her family with anti-Semitic threats and message for months. The threats took an emotional, physical, social, financial and professional toll on Tanya and her family, but Tanya fought back. The Southern Poverty Law Center filed suit in federal court on their behalf, winning a more than \$14 million judgment against the neo-Nazi leader and shut them down.

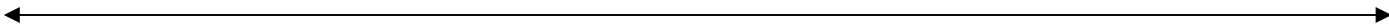
