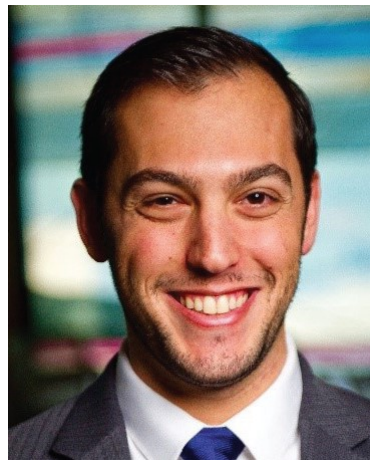
Preparing for the College Campus: How Antisemitism & the Current Climate Impact the College Process

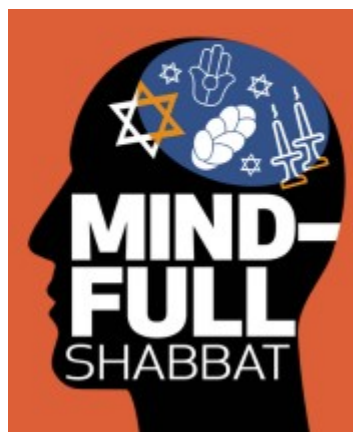
