





Beineinu - Between Us



I want to share with you a change that we will be making in our prayer services. Beginning with the first Shabbat of December, we will begin a practice of allowing the *shaliach tzibbur* – the one who is leading the chanting of the service on behalf of the congregation – to choose whether or not to include the *imahot* – matriarchs – in the

prayers for that service.

Our congregation is a big umbrella that includes congregants across the spectrum of Conservative Judaism. We have a significant number of members on each side of this issue, many wanting to include *imahot* and many wanting to maintain the traditional text which includes only the *avot* – patriarchs.

Conservative Judaism has long been committed to the concept of *halakhic* pluralism: there can be more than one way in which Jewish law can be interpreted. In that spirit, Cantor Shifman, Rabbi Rudin-Luria and I decided together to implement this change in order to address the desires of both groups. At the same time, each person fulfills the obligation to recite the *Amidah* by their individual silent prayer, in Hebrew or English. Regardless of the choice made by the *shaliach tzibbur*, you can opt for either formulation – with or without *imahot*. They appear side by side in our Shabbat and festival *siddur* and on a and b pages in our weekday prayerbook. A more complete explanation of the *halakhic* basis for this change was emailed to the congregation.

Today, within Conservative Judaism and within our synagogue, the Judaism we practice is fully egalitarian in every way. Women act as *shaliach tzibbur*, fulfilling the obligation of prayer as they chant prayers for the congregation. Women take *aliyot* at the Torah and read from the Torah as well. Many

Cemetery Plot Price Increase

In January 2020 the Cemetery Committee approved cemetery plot increases effective July 1, 2020. Due to the pandemic, these rate increases were changed to a January 1, 2021 start date. The rate increases for B'nai Jeshurun members at all four synagogue cemeteries will go into effect on January 1, as follows: Bet Olam – from \$1,000 to \$1,500, Chesterland – from \$650/\$750 to \$1,000, Glenville – from \$600 to \$700 and Zion – from \$350 to \$700. Non-members pay higher plot costs and may not purchase plots at Bet Olam.

If you are interested in cemetery plots and want to purchase at the current rates, please contact Paula Botkin before the end of the year. If you have any questions regarding the cemeteries and these rate increases, you may contact Cemetery Committee chair Mel Ginsberg (ginzabba5@gmail.com or 216-407-1862), Executive Director Jay Ross or Paula. Thank you for your understanding, as these rate increases are necessary due to the increased costs of operating the cemeteries.

Be the Helper (Candle)

The Menorah is the main symbol of Hanukkah. When we light the candles, the *Hanukiyah* symbolizes: religious freedom; the miraculous victory over oppression; the miracle of survival of our people in difficult times; the miracles we appreciate each and

every day; the resolve to bring light in times of darkness; the Maccabees' courageous choice to use precious, sacred resources when scarce; and the joy of bringing family together to celebrate the "lights" in our lives.

The Hanukkah Menorah (*Hanukiyah*) need only be designed with spots for eight candles (or oil containers) to commemorate the eight days of the holiday. Why do all the *Hanukiyot* that we use have nine? The extra candle, called the *Shamash* or the "Helper Candle," sometimes stands apart, distanced from the eight required candles. In some *Hanukiyot*, the *Shamash* is elevated, towering high above the line of eight candles. On my favorite Menorah, the *Shamash* is sandwiched right in the middle in a place of prominence. What is so special about this candle which isn't even required, shouldn't even be there?

The Shamash is the candle that we light first. We use it to light the other candles of the Menorah. Shamash means to serve. This service/helper candle helps light the way for all the candles. It enables the other candles to shine. The helper candle brings joy and warmth to others. And in its service, its own light is never diminished. Perhaps, the Shamash glows even brighter by helping others and sharing light.

As we approach the dark, cold days of winter, many in our congregational family remain isolated and in need of our help. Throughout the pandemic, we are grateful to our small and committed group of synagogue volunteers who have been regularly calling and "virtually visiting" our most vulnerable congregants. We are looking to expand the volunteer base and are asking for your help to join our caring callers team (under the auspices of the Chesed Committee) so we can reach, engage, virtually visit and support more of our isolated members and each other. We may also expand to offering deliveries. If you would like to be the *Shamash* and help light the way for those vulnerable in our congregation, join our volunteer network, or if you know of a congregant needing additional support, please let me know. Be the Helper (Candle)!

What Is the Light of Hanukkah?

We know the story of the miracle – the oil that should have burned but one night and miraculously lasted for eight. Yet, the Talmud (*Avodah Zarah 8a*) also relates the following tale: When Adam, the first human, saw the daylight hours were

becoming shorter and shorter, he said, "Woe is me! Perhaps because I have sinned, the world is becoming dark around me and is returning to *tohu va-vohu*, utter chaos. This is the death sentence declared upon me by Heaven!" He sat for eight days in fasting and prayer. After the winter solstice, when he saw the days becoming longer and longer, he said, "This must simply be the way of the world!" He went and made an eight-day festival...for the sake of Heaven.

Perhaps the origins of Hanukkah have less to do with the Maccabees or the miracle of the oil, but rather came about as a celebration of light during the darkest point in our year. At its essence, Hanukkah is a holiday about experiencing fear, vulnerability and darkness, yet not being consumed. Literally, on our darkest days, the Hanukkah lights remind us that light and security will return again.

Living in the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic, this message is all the more striking. Unable to celebrate in the ways we are accustomed, needing to retreat indoors as the weather continues to get colder and daylight hours dwindle, we could all benefit from a little more light. Adam, in this tale, reminds us that the darkness will not last forever. Our Hanukkah lights are a testament to the faith we have of brighter days ahead: days will again begin to get longer, the cold and snow winter brings will dissipate, and at some point (God-willing soon), the pandemic that has upended so much about how we live our lives will recede as well, giving way to brighter days ahead.

Smart End of Year Giving

Pay your synagogue dues, Mahar pledge and/or other synagogue obligations by December 31 and reap potential tax benefits while providing meaningful support to B'nai Jeshurun. Please consult with your tax advisor for further information related to the following points.

- If you itemize deductions, your cash gift may be tax deductible. Just make certain that your online donation is made or envelope is postmarked by December 31.
- If you will not be itemizing deductions, for 2020 only, eligible individuals may still be able to deduct up to \$300 in charitable donations on their return. Again, just make certain that your online donation is made or envelope is postmarked by December 31.
- If you own stocks or securities that have appreciated in value and have been held for at least one year, you can donate and receive credit for the current market value without having to pay federal income tax on the gains. If you are going to donate stocks or securities, please notify Paula Botkin to get detailed instructions on how to donate your stock, and include the name and number of shares.
- If you are at least 70-1/2 years old, you may distribute up to \$100,000 per year tax-free from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to the synagogue or other qualified institutions. These distributions may count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and may exceed your RMD as long as they total less than \$100,000. Although the RMD requirement has been suspended for 2020, the qualified charitable distribution option is still available to you. If you are sending a distribution from your IRA, please let Paula know the amount and where it is coming from. Most brokers will not include the name of the donor for privacy reasons.

If these potential tax benefits are not enough reason to give before the end of the year, an anonymous congregant will match the first 100 Mahar pledges/donations dollar for dollar made during our Eight Days of Giving campaign between December 10 - 18!

women in our congregation have taken on the obligation of wearing a *tallit* and a few even wear *tefillin*. We have women Cantors and Rabbis. Women serve as synagogue president and in the highest levels of community leadership. The Judaism we live and breathe sees women as fully equal partners with men in all aspects of our religious lives, just as they should be in every other aspect of our personal, family and communal lives.

And yet, despite all these changes that have embraced full equality in religious life, a woman opening up a traditional *siddur* is unable to see herself in its pages. Adding the *imahot* to the *Amidah* is in line with the many variations of our prayers that have evolved in different communities over the centuries. It preserves the tradition's essential meaning of the prayer while enabling us to draw inspiration and spiritual strength from God's unique and powerful relationship with each of the founding mothers of our faith. I hope that for those who desire to include the *imahot*, this change will create opportunities to find deeper connection to our prayers and tradition.


