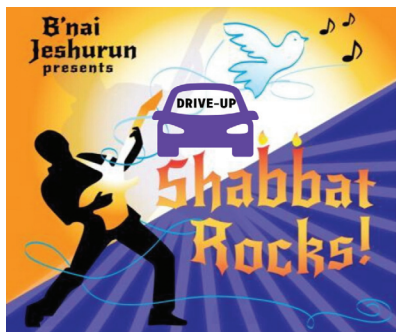

Beineinu - Between Us



In Kabbalah — Jewish Mysticism — each week in the counting of the Omer corresponds to a different *sefirah* (one of the ten aspects of the Divine through which God's light is channeled as it flows through our world and our souls). By meditating on the week's *sefirah*, we draw that dimension of God's spirit into our soul and are

nurtured by it.

One of these *sefirot* is known as "*Netzach*." The word is often translated as "victory" or "eternity," but a better translation might be "endurance." It is the power to overcome all obstacles, the persistence and focus we need in order to succeed.

Netzach is not about rising above the moment. It is not the strength of the sprinter. It is the strength of the marathon runner who pushes on relentlessly over the long term, determined to meet his/her goal. When we draw down God's *Netzach* into our soul, God graces us with the fortitude to surmount the long-term challenges we face. It is this aspect of God – *Netzach* – that has enabled us to do what in the beginning seemed impossible: to endure the long, hard journey of this pandemic that we traveled together and yet alone.

Even as we are grateful to God for getting us this far, we know that our journey is far from complete. We can see our destination on the horizon, but it is not yet within reach. May God grant us the *Netzach* to persevere until this pandemic is finally in our rear view mirror.

Netzach is also about the ability to overcome obstacles that stand in the way of our being instruments for bringing God's *Chesed* (Kindness) into the world. As our anxiety over our challenges rises, there is a temptation to turn our focus only on ourselves. Just looking after our own needs is hard enough and sufficiently tiring that we lack the energy and will to attend to the concerns and needs of others. Under the weight of stress, we can become less patient, less giving, less accepting. In this sense too, we need *Netzach* now, enabling us to be stubbornly persistent in always showing patience and kindness to one another in word and deed.

President's Message



As we mark the difficult milestone of spending an entire year without getting together in the synagogue as a community, I ponder how we got here and what comes next. First, I wonder how we got to this point. Even as we first shut down and began staying at home, we never thought it would last this long.

Second, I miss seeing everyone, whether at Shabbat morning services, Megillah readings and Purim carnivals, the High Holiday services and all the other special programs and events we hold each year, such as Israel Bonds, Tribute event, Mind-full Shabbat, Consecration, Confirmation, holiday services and so much more...even meetings!

Third, how will we feel when we return? While we are all anxious to return and excited at the thought of seeing everyone, I know that some (including myself) are uncomfortable with the idea of being with crowds, elbow to elbow, taking Kiddush food from big buffet tables, much less davening/singing aloud. I miss it all desperately, but I am also nervous. Is there a way to ease into this gradually? Fortunately, the Pandemic Procedure Task Force is starting to plan for the return to the synagogue. We are not ready yet, but when the timing is right, with more widespread vaccinations, we will continue to follow science and the CDC guidelines and re-open safely.

Fourth, how do we mourn for all we've lost? We've lost beloved members of our community, and many of us have lost family and friends. What can we do to make sure they are remembered appropriately, that we don't allow them to be forgotten, just another loss in a year full of losses? We want to honor their memories as a community. What will that look like? Our clergy are planning a remembrance service, once it's safe for us to be together, so we can mourn as a community.

Finally, how do we commemorate all that could not be celebrated as we would have liked, such as graduations, weddings, B'nai Mitzvahs, birthdays, anniversaries? We don't have the answer to this yet, but we are thinking about going big to welcome everyone back to the building...I cannot wait!

Counting Up Together

This is a month of transformation and growth. During the Omer, the Biblical Israelites marched together from Egypt to Mt. Sinai. They prepared for this moment by climbing to new heights to meet G-d at the mountain and receive the Ten Commandments. The rabbis say that this was more than just a physical journey from one destination to another. The Israelites, newly freed from their enslavement, were not yet ready to receive G-d's teaching and instruction. Each day of their journey to Sinai, the Israelites worked on themselves, spiritually and physically. That is why we are dedicating this month to our #BJCFIT wellness initiative.

Every evening, we take time to count the 49 days from Passover to Shavuot. The Omer teaches us to take moments of mindfulness on our journey of self-improvement, growth and transformation. Though the Omer is sometimes considered mournful, as joyous events like weddings and concerts are not held in the opening weeks before Lag B'Omer, we can also look on the positive roots of this season. "The Omer celebrates the journey of the sprouting grain. Our ancestors reaped a sheaf on the first day of the Omer and baked bread on the last day, the transformation of life into life. In the Jewish mystical tradition, each day of the Omer connects us to a different mystical attribute of the Divine...that will ground and nourish us... in this season of rebirth." (*The Jewish Book of Days*, Jill Hammer). We do not countdown to the holiday of Shavuot. Our tradition teaches us to count up and elevate ourselves for this is the season for positive change.

In this year of being apart, we have found so many ways to be united. We hope that you will join our wellness and fitness initiative as part of #BJCFIT as we count up our steps and miles to virtually journey the 5,991 miles from Cleveland to Jerusalem together. Join me on our weekly #BJCFIT Peloton ride or any of our other opportunities to grow, exercise and build strength together.

Education & Youth



The Pillar of *Gemilut Hasadim*

The rabbis of the Talmud declared that the world stands on three pillars: the pillar of *Torah*, the pillar of *Avodah* (prayer), and the pillar of *Gemilut Hasadim*. These pillars inform everything we do at the Youth & Learning Center; while *Torah* and *Avodah* are uniquely Jewish, however, the concept of *Gemilut Hasadim*, acts of loving-kindness, is seemingly universal. How then do we internalize this as a Jewish concept? The text that most strongly informs my own connection with *Gemilut Hasadim* is a story about two prominent Rabbis, Yochanan Ben Zakkai and Yehoshua, walking in Jerusalem after the destruction of the Temple. Rabbi Yehoshua looks at the ruins and says, "Alas! The place which atoned for the sins of our people through sacrifice lies in ruins!" Then Ben Zakkai shares these words of comfort: "Do not be grieved, my son. There is another way of gaining atonement even though the Temple is destroyed. We can now gain atonement through deeds of loving-kindness, for it is written, 'Loving-kindness I desire, not sacrifice'" (Hosea 6:6).

Hosea's prophecy, "For I desire goodness, not sacrifice; Obedience to God, rather than burnt offerings" (Hosea 6:6), marks a turning point for our religion and the message the rabbis use to inform their connection to *Gemilut Hasadim*; with acts of loving-kindness we are fulfilling God's will.

Fortunately, many people in our world are ready and willing to lend a helping hand to those in need, and yet our own heritage helps provide a unique perspective on *Gemilut Hasadim*. Jewish tradition teaches us that we have inherited an imperfect world and we must be committed to *Tikkun Olam*, helping repair it. "You are not obligated to complete the task, but neither are you free to desist from it" (Pirkei Avot 2:21).

Especially today, with so many people impacted in different ways by the pandemic, I encourage you find a way to be involved in acts of *Gemilut Hasadim*, whether through the Chesed committee and projects in our congregation and Youth & Learning Center or in whatever way is most meaningful to you. There is so much to be done and we each have the power to make a difference.
