# Beineinu - Between Us



One of the most important turning points in Moses's life comes when he sees the Egyptian taskmaster beating a Hebrew slave. The Torah tells us *vayifan ko vachoch* – Moses looked this way and that way – and then he struck down the Egyptian. Many commentators have focused on this phrase: "He looked this way and that way." Why did Moses look before he intervened? One explanation is that Moses was waiting to see if anyone would step in to save the slave. The sages taught, "where there is no man, strive to be a man." Moses understood that in this instance, justice depended upon him and he needed to step forward and act.

Another way to see the text is that Moses was waiting to see if an Egyptian would intervene. Seeing none, he took things into his own hand. The lesson: Often, when Jews face oppression, the world looks on in silence. In our day, we know the meaning of this teaching from the sad reality of the Holocaust, when the West was aware of the Final Solution and yet was very slow to intervene. We also see it in the ostracization and isolation Israel so often faces in the international arena.

A third way of understanding this passage is that Moses was waiting to see if another Hebrew would try to save his brother. But none did. The lesson here is that we must remember that *kol Yisrael arevim zeh ha-zeh* – all Israel are responsible for one another. When we see another Jew in need, we should be the first to seek to help.

# President's Message



As we joyfully gather together in greater numbers in our building, I thought it would be a good time to pause and think about the role our building plays in our synagogue community. Virtual gatherings on Zoom have been a vital lifeline during the pandemic, and we will continue to use Zoom in various capacities going forward, recognizing that not everyone is ready or able to come back in person. However, our building remains the hub of our synagogue community for so many things.

**Prayer** is likely the first function that comes to mind when one thinks of the synagogue: our daily minyan, our Shabbat and holiday services, and High Holiday services. We come together for spiritual nourishment, to honor a deceased loved one by saying Kaddish, to celebrate a Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

However, the Hebrew term *Bet Knesset* or its Greek counterpart, *Synagogue*, literally means a "house of assembly." A very general term, *Bet Knesset* recognizes that Jews gather together for many different purposes and our building is a wonderful illustration of that. Think of all the other reasons that we gather together:

**Adult study:** Starbucks, Bread & Torah every Shabbat, the *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*, our Weingold Fall Forum, as well as many other study opportunities throughout the year. **Educating and engaging our children and youth:** beginning with Kinder Shabbat Friday mornings, KabbaTOT Shabbat Friday evenings, religious school and teen programming. **Affiliate group functions:** Sisterhood, Men's Club, ATID and Hazak all have held a variety of programs. And there's also the Sisterhood Judaica Gift Shop. **Meetings:** Board, Executive, Officer, Committee meetings. **Family celebrations:** Wedding receptions, Bar/Bat Mitzvah parties. **Libraries:** for adults and children. **The Kitchen:** Volunteers prepare meals for those in need, as well as our kiddush and congregational lunches. **Annual Events:** Cantor's Concert, Tribute Dinner, Annual Meeting, Bond Dinner.

It's vital that we maintain our beautiful, 42-year-old facility. Jay Ross, our Executive Director, working with the House Committee, is creating a proactive facility plan to update HVAC and make other improvements. At the same time, we continue to make ongoing repairs as needed. There are significant price tags attached to many of these projects and we welcome your support to help us achieve these important goals. Please reach out to Jay or Lorna Siegal, our Development Director, if you would like to help with capital projects.

# From the Rabbi



On Seder night, we begin the main section of the Haggadah with "*Ha Lachma Anya*":

Let all who are hungry, come and eat.

Let all who are in need, come and join us.

Now we are here, next year in the Land of Israel.

Now we are slaves, next year we will be free.

Mark Gerson, in his book on the Haggadah *The Telling: How Judaism's Essential Book Reveals the Meaning of Life*, suggests this dramatic opening to the Maggid (Telling) portion of the Seder is an internal call that we should come to the Seder night intellectually and spiritually hungry. None of us is perfect and the Seder is a time to identify our own needs and, like the Afikomen, broken and hidden, to look at our lives and ourselves to notice what is broken, what is missing and what we must search to find to be more whole. What are we slaves to in our lives and what would it take to be free from those impediments? As we are obligated to see ourselves beginning Seder night in "Egypt" and "in slavery" what actions must we take to free ourselves? This must also prompt us to raise our awareness to those across the world living in captivity.

The Seder's opening statement composed in Aramaic can be understood as a frame for our entire Seder night and the guide for what it means to be a Jew. We hope you will open up your Seder to include those who do not have family in town or a Seder to attend. When we make this call to welcome all who are hungry and in need to join us, haven't we already sent out our invites, welcomed our guests, closed the door and sat down to the table? Are we truly expecting anyone else to come and heed our call? We must understand it as words to live by each and every day: to seek out those in need and support and provide for them - from the empty-handed and homeless refugee fleeing Ukraine to our neighbor living with food insecurity in Cuyahoga County.

## Learning Through Experience

Among the primary goals of our Youth & Learning Center is to provide experiential opportunities that immerse our students and families in Jewish tradition and learning. It was so exciting to join our

Hineni teen fellows on a journey to Washington DC (our first trip in two years!) to learn about the Holocaust, our country's relationship with Israel and how to combat antisemitism. I was filled with pride in our students, watching them advocate for what they believed in with the offices of our Ohio senators, Sherrod Brown and Rob Portman. It was also great to see so many of you in person for our Purim carnival & Megillah reading and we are excited to bring back our Passover programs and Youth Shabbaton (see page 5 for more details)! Yet, with all of our excitement to be joining together for these immersive experiences once again, it's easy to forget that the Jewish people have been practicing experiential education for millennia, right at our Seder.

Rather than simply telling a story, the Seder allows us to become part of the story. We sing songs, place symbolic foods on our Seder plate and declare our obligation to feel as though we personally came out of Egypt. Bitter herbs recall the bitterness of slavery, parsley dipped in salt water our ancestors' tears, and matzah our hurried departure from Egypt. The Talmud teaches that the goal of the Seder is precisely to prompt questions so that we learn more.

Perhaps you can enrich your Seder this year with a new custom or two. For students and their families joining our Passover program on April 9<sup>th</sup>, you will come away with discussion and learning designed to enhance your Seder. In addition, I would love the opportunity to speak with you about a variety of Seder customs you might consider, or perhaps you can create your own ritual to share!

We already have an incredible example of experiential education right in our own homes on Passover, and each year we have the ability to make it an even more memorable experience!

## Hineni Fellowship Trip to Washington, DC



It's been almost a week since our return to Cleveland, but aspects of the Hineni Fellowship trip are still circling in my mind. I was lucky enough to be a participant, which included a four-day trip to Washington, DC and multiple pre and post sessions. Over the course of this trip, I learned a lot about the history of the Jewish people, how to advocate for Israel, and how to stand up against antisemitism. We met with countless influential leaders like Nadav Zysblat, the minister for political affairs at the Israeli embassy, and Matt Fidel, the communications director for congressman Jim Langevan of Rhode Island. These speakers taught us about their experience working in politics, gave us advice on how to stand up for what we believe in, and answered any questions we had for them.

On the last day of our trip, we spoke with Anna Gokaldas, Senator Brown's senior policy advisor, and Kevin Smith, Senator Portman's chief of staff. We advocated for a bipartisan bill to give Holocaust survivors money to ensure that none are living in poverty, expressed our disapproval of the new proposed Iran deal, and communicated our support for the confirmation of Deborah Lipstadt as the Special Envoy to Combat Antisemitism. After these meetings the group felt accomplished; we were able to express our beliefs to powerful political leaders and use the skills we picked up over the course of the trip. Everyone in the fellowship grew closer as the trip progressed, and by the end of the trip we were sad to leave. Overall, the Hineni Fellowship experience is one that can't be had anywhere else and was filled with learning, growing, and fun.

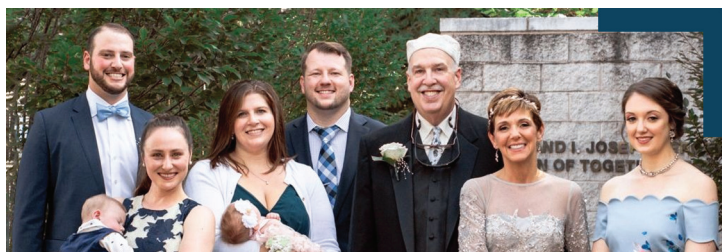

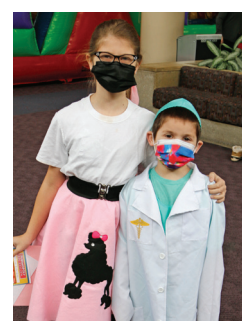

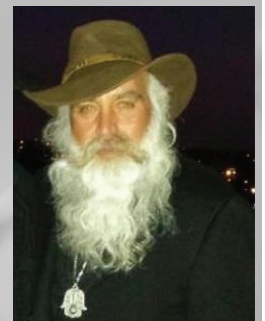
