

## From the Rabbi



The Hebrew months of Av and Elul can be known as the Jewish time for love and harmony. As the summer lingers, August is often the season for weddings before the High Holidays. The month of Av begins in national mourning. We commemorate the saddest day on our annual calendar, Tisha B'Av, the anniversary of

the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem, the breaching of the walls and much historic tragedy on the 9<sup>th</sup> of Av.

From brokenness and destruction, we start a steady climb to rebuilding and reaffirming life beginning with the lesserknown Tu B'Av (Jewish Day of Love) and then Rosh Chodesh Elul and the lead up to Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur. The letters of the month Elul hint at the theme of love by spelling out the acrostic "Ani L'Dodi V'Dodi Li, I am my beloved's and my beloved is mine." This verse from Shir HaShirim, the Bible's Song of Songs, is a favorite at weddings and often the vow recited under the chuppah.

Following tragedy and destruction, Tu B'Av marks a time to reunite and rebuild. For thousands of years dating back to Biblical times, this has been a day where love has blossomed and relationships have been formed. It is a time for new beginnings. Tu B'Av is exactly forty days before the rabbinic date that the world was created (the first day of creation with Rosh HaShanah marking day six when humanity began).

As a community, Tu B'Av traditionally has been a day for gathering together in harmony and joy celebrating the good in our lives and looking forward to the coming new year. Beginning the climb to the holidays, Tu B'Av helps us to continue to overcome adversity and reunite our community in an uplifting and joyful way. Join us on Tu B'Av, Friday evening, August 12 at 7 pm for a special Shabbat service led by me and Cantor Rosenbaum featuring songs, poems, prayers and food expressing love and harmony.

## Cantor's Corner



Songwriting is something I am fairly new at, having started in the first year after I learned to play the guitar at cantorial school. I met Sue Horowitz, who runs a group called the Jewish Songwriters Cooperative, in December 2019, and she invited me to join. I

started getting involved with this group mostly from afar. July 10-13, I finally had the opportunity to join the group for an in-person collaborative retreat, and it was so wonderful to meet all my "new old friends" (a term coined by someone in the group)!

At the Jewish Songwriters Collaborative Retreat, I connected with people from various backgrounds and experiences, and we all came together on a level playing field. Some are rabbis or cantors, some are teachers or songleaders, some are ba'alei t'filah or active layleaders. Some are professional musicians. Some of them had been songwriting and playing instruments for decades—and some, like me, were newer to it. All of us shared a deep passion for Jewish music and a desire to inspire each other to create, connecting more with the group and our own communities we serve through music. While there, I experienced some of the most deeply spiritual and moving t'filah in my life. I sang among some of the richest harmonies I have ever encountered. I found that collaboration breeds perspective. Every time I experience something like this, where I am in community with my peers, I feel that it feeds my soul.

While I will continue to reflect on the experience I had at this retreat and contemplate how to put the inspiration I got from it into action (and hopefully more original songs), I wanted to ask you the following question: What feeds your soul, and how can we build it among our own community? Let's find the answers together!



### **Socal Justice/GCC: Bail Reform**

In the past several years, there have been various opportunities to pursue social justice through our Social Justice/GCC Core Team – helping to increase voter turnout in low propensity areas, providing Covid testing and vaccines to areas that did not have access, helping to get a Crisis Diversion Center in Cuyahoga County, to name a few. In October, 2021, I shared in *Tidings* about some new criminal justice initiatives that were identified through GCC member congregations holding House Meetings, including at B'nai Jeshurun. The top two initiatives chosen to focus on were 1) reducing youth being bound over and tried in the adult prison

system; and 2) reforming the way our system of cash bail is administered after an arrest.

I would like to share an update on the last area mentioned – bail reform. I am one of the GCC Bail Reform Team leaders, helping this team move through a process of learning, researching, analyzing and arriving at an actionable issue that can move Cuyahoga County toward a more equitable system around bail. This process we are using for bail illustrates how GCC approaches issues. We studied the history and current status of bail and then met with leaders in Cuyahoga County that are connected to the criminal justice system and bail. From this knowledge, we have refined our focus to Pretrial Services. Pretrial services provide services and supervision to pretrial defendants that promote public safety and court appearance, reduce taxpayer cost and time spent in jail before court appearance, preventing defendants from loss of job, income and child custody. We are now strategizing how we can increase use of Pretrial Services, which help provide better information to judicial officers deciding pretrial custody or release for a defendant.



## Memorial Plaques & Golden Book of Remembrance

A beautiful way to honor the memory of a loved one is with a memorial plaque or listing. Plaques are displayed on the Memorial Wall at the rear of the David J. & Ruth A. Moskowitz Sanctuary. During the week of yahrzeit, your loved one's name is also highlighted in the center section of the Wall. The Wall is an adjustable, alphabetic memorial. The Golden Book of Remembrance is on permanent display in the case outside Nickman Chapel.

## Tax Advantaged Ways to Pay Your Synagogue Dues and Donations

There can be significant benefits to paying your dues, Mahar pledge and other synagogue donations with stock instead of cash. If you own stock or other securities that have appreciated in value and have been held for at least one year, you may be able to donate them to B'nai Jeshurun and receive credit for the current market value without having to pay any federal income tax on the gains. The process is not difficult and most often can be completed with just one phone call.

In addition, there is a wonderful opportunity for those currently required to be taking RMDs from retirement plans or may be required to do so during calendar year 2022. You can pay your synagogue dues and most of your other synagogue donations with required minimum distributions. The distribution (which may be up to \$100,000 each calendar year) is NOT subject to federal income tax. If you plan on transferring stock or other securities to us, please contact Marcy Stahm for instructions, to let us know that a transfer is on the way, or with other questions.

As with all tax-related matters, you should consider your individual situation and should consult your tax advisor for advice.




