

From the Rabbi

As we celebrate Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights, we know that the menorah does not light itself. The *shamash* (often called the helper candle) is most essential because it provides the necessary spark for all the other candles to provide light. It is the true source of our light.

Rabbi Stanley J. Schachter^{z"} was our *shamash*, our light and guidepost, always standing tall and upright with a welcoming and inclusive gentleness and calm. Rabbi Schachter brought so much light to our community as our beloved senior rabbi starting in 1987 and then as rabbi emeritus since 2002. Over the last month, so many in our congregational family have shared stories of how much Rabbi Schachter meant to them - his guidance, support, counsel, sermons and friendship. His intellectual brilliance was only matched by his compassion. He was a scholar, leader of the Conservative Movement, a master storyteller and lover of Jewish humor. He modeled for each of us how to live our lives as a Jew.

Tohonor Rabbi Schachter's memory, our congregation is launching a special initiative of 100 Acts of Kindness. Rabbi Schachter's kindness, warmth and his caring for the community defined him. President's Message



"Do you mind being called a Jew?" asked my classmate at Bloomfield Hills Junior High in suburban Detroit. I was caught off-quard, looked at her puzzled and said proudly, "Why would I mind? That's what I am." Only much later did I realize that, for her, the word "Jew" was itself pejorative - an insult. But,

I felt proud of my Jewish identity - how did that happen?

My parents were culturally Jewish with nominal religious observance in our home, but sent my brothers and me to religious school because they felt it would be important for us to have some Jewish education to support our Jewish identity. They were right! I credit my engagement at my Temple as key to helping me forge my strong and positive Jewish identity.

In our current world, where antisemitism has become socially acceptable, our children and youth are growing up in a troubling time. I ask myself, what is the role of our synagogue in combating antisemitism? Speaking out and advocating, forging bonds with the non-Jewish community and educating ourselves on the threats are all important. In addition, we must also pay special attention to the Jewish identity formation of our children. All that our synagogue offers: from our early childhood programs on through religious school and youth programs help our children develop a positive Jewish identity, based on an understanding of Jewish history, practice, traditions and the State of Israel.

And for us as adults, supporting our synagogue is a positive way to combat the negative effects of antisemitism. As we feel hostile forces swirling around us, it is important to pay attention to our own psychological well-being. The synagogue offers many ways to do that including prayer, study and social events. Our Wellness initiative is an important new way to engage with BJC and benefit from an array of programs that supports us emotionally and socially within a Jewish framework.

To help keep B'nai Jeshurun strong, I ask you to support our Mahar Campaign, our synagogue's annual fundraising effort. Your contribution - at EVERY level - is meaningful. As an added bonus, during our Eight Days of Giving, the first 100 donations will be matched and have even greater impact. Thank you for your support; it has never been more important.



The Bridge, B'nai Jeshurun's downtown Cleveland initiative, just celebrated its first birthday! The Jewish community in Downtown Cleveland and the near-west side is certainly thriving; there are over 360 names in The Bridge's database as of the end of October 2022, and this list continues to grow every single day. The Bridge's program offerings throughout the last year have included happy hours, a trivia night, Jewish holiday gatherings and so much more.

For many, the highlight program of The Bridge is *Shabbat Clusters*, where individuals and couples are grouped into clusters of 10-15 people and host one another in their homes for Shabbat dinners once a month for three months. These Shabbat Clusters create opportunities for participants to take part in a meaningful Jewish experience while fostering new relationships and strengthening old ones.

GCC: Juvenile Bindover Action

Thursday, December 6 • 7 pm Zoom or In-Person at Olivet Institutional Baptist Church



GCC is organizing an Action focusing on ending the abuse of discretionary bindovers in Cuyahoga County. Rabbi Rudin-Luria and members of the Social Justice/GCC Core Team will be attending and are encouraging congregants interested in juvenile justice to also attend. GCC is hoping 500+ people will attend virtually or in-person.

Discretionary youth bindovers are juveniles tried in adult court, and if convicted, sent to adult prison at the discretion of judges. The purpose of the Juvenile Bindover Action is to educate GCC members, the public, and the media about the abuses of youth bindovers in Cuyahoga County and to present recommended changes needed to address these abuses. The session will follow a Q&A format with: 1) an expert from the Children's Law Center on the negative impact of bindovers on youth, families and the community at large; 2) an individual describing the personal impact of youth bindover on him and his family; 3) an attorney from the Office of the Ohio Public Defender on state-of-the-art policies which have successfully reduced bindovers in other large Ohio counties; and 4) an expert panel on recommended policy changes for the County Prosecutor, the County Executive, and Juvenile Court Judges. 

- If you itemize deductions, your cash gift may be tax deductible. Just make certain that your online donation is made or envelope is postmarked by December 31.
- If you own stocks or securities that have appreciated in value and have been held for at least one year, you can donate and receive credit for the current market value without having to pay federal income tax on the gains. If you are going to donate stocks or securities, please notify Joscelyn Harris (joscelynharris@bnaijeshurun.org or 216-831-6555 ext. 105) to get detailed instructions on how to donate, and include the name and number of shares.
- If you are age 70 ½ or older and subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) from retirement accounts (IRA or other), you may distribute up to \$100,000 per year tax-free to the synagogue or other qualified institutions. These distributions may count toward your RMD and may exceed the RMD as long as they total less than \$100,000. If you are sending a distribution from a retirement account, please let Joscelyn know the amount and where it is coming from. Most brokers will not include the name of the donor for privacy reasons.


