Beineinu - Between Us



The sages teach that Jethro joins the Jewish people after the defeat of Amalek. But Rashi suggests that Jethro joined the Jewish people later, after the giving of the Torah. He was moved by a God who wanted a loving relationship with His people, whose prescribed religious practices were filled with such joy, and who demanded repeatedly in his teachings that the Jewish people should act at all times with unconditional love and kindness, reaching and helping the stranger and those in need.

The members of Beth Israel in Colleyville, TX who gathered at synagogue on that fateful Shabbat morning were sharing in that joy of Judaism. Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker was a hero for throwing that chair, enabling others to escape, but he was also a Jewish hero for welcoming in a seemingly homeless man and offering him a cup of tea. In doing so, he was embodying the most essential Jewish values of *chesed*, *gemillut hassidim* and *tikkun olam* that had attracted Jethro.

Kabbalah teaches that the flow of God's light into the world and our souls are controlled by two *sefirot* known as *Chesed* and *Gevurah* – Kindness and Judgment. *Chesed*, so to speak, turns on the spigot, sending God's light and love flowing through our world and through us. But too much of God's light would overwhelm and obliterate us, and so *Gevurah* is the "off knob" that restrains the flow of light. The balance between *Chesed* and *Gevurah* enables the world to exist.

As we go forward after the hostage taking at Beth Israel, we will need to strike that same balance between *Chesed* and *Gevurah*, putting limits in place while holding onto the joy of our tradition and remaining open enough to allow God's light to flow through us so that we can still answer God's call for us to be a light unto the world.

May God guide us in seeking that balance, keep us safe from all harm, heal our shattered hearts, and bring about a world in which hatred is banished and love reigns supreme.

President's Message



Have you ever used the map navigation app, Waze? Developed in Israel, the app gives you turn by turn instructions to provide the most efficient route to your selected destination. I especially like two of its features. The first is an alert that warns you of a delay on the route and provides an alternate route to avoid the traffic jam or accident. The second estimates how long you will be stuck in traffic when Waze hasn't been able to give an alternate route. It really helps to know when the frustrating situation you are in will be over.

How I wish there was a version of Waze to help us navigate through the pandemic! As I write this, we are in the midst of the Omicron surge. Just prior to the appearance of the new, highly contagious variant, we were planning to proceed with more in person events. We had no Waze warning to tell us that there was trouble ahead (Omicron!) and we needed to take a different route. So, suddenly, we were in the middle of the surge and once again found ourselves in the painful position of pulling back, of cancelling some in person events, and wondering about the future.

Perhaps the most difficult aspect of the pandemic is not knowing when it will end. No app to tell us how long we are "stuck" -- when we will be able to take off our masks, plan large in person events, and get back to normal, reclaiming the lives we led prior to March of 2020. As I sit on the bimah on Shabbat and look at the many empty seats, I wonder when they will be filled again. This uncertainty is emotionally challenging for all of us. There are predictions that Omicron will come and go quickly -- perhaps it will have subsided by the time you read this! I hope that these predictions are accurate, and we can return to planning more in person events. We want to offer options for those ready to gather in person. Regardless, we will continue to navigate, "recalculating" our route when the situation dictates, to keep our synagogue community safe.

We have long been called the People of the Book (*Am HaSefer*). During the pandemic as reading has increased, I have taken advantage of our synagogue libraries (adult and children's collections) overseen by Dr. Rafi Simon. I hope that you continue to browse our extensive collection online including the newest books ranging from topics of Zionism and Jewish cooking to prayer and Torah commentary. Two of my recent favorite books have been Dara Horn's *People Love Dead Jews* and Matti Friedman's *Spies of No Country: Secret Lives at the Birth of Israel*.

I've also become a podcast fanatic. The words "*Shema Yisrael*" have become our creed, the prayer which we say every morning and evening, our statement of faith, the first words we teach our children and the final words we say before death. "*Shema Yisrael*" can also be translated as "Listen Jewish people." Now is that perfect time to "*Shema Yisrael*" and begin your Jewish podcast journey. There are so many Jewish podcasts that I'd like to recommend, like weekly Torah commentary from Pardes, Hadar and Rabbi Jonathan Sacks or informative interviews from the Tikvah Podcast. I'd love to know which are your favorite Jewish podcasts and why. My go-to Jewish podcast short list:

Israel Story - True stories from Israel's past and present. My favorite episodes include the history of Israel's pig farming and Israel's corona hotels. **Chutzpod** - A new weekly podcast by Rabbi Shira Stutman and actor/activist Joshua Malina. **Daf Yomi for Women - Hadran** - Michelle Farber leads an engaging and thorough daily page of Talmud learning. It is fast-paced to keep up with the global 7 1/2 year cycle of Talmud study. **Judaism Unbound** - Exploring 21st century American Judaism and highlight Jews "pushing the bounds of what it means to be Jewish." **Menschwarmers** - explores the intersection of Jews and sports. **Adventures with Dead Jews** - Dara Horn's podcast extension of her award-winning book. **What Now?** - A JTS Podcast, Sarah Beth Berman interviews JTS faculty on how to respond to tragedy.

Writing this in the aftermath of the attack and hostage situation at Congregation Beth Israel in Colleyville, TX, as a community, we have been shaken once again by violence targeting us. We are struggling – caught between a desire to keep our doors open, welcoming

any and all who would like to join us and bringing everyone into our community, and a reality that requires us to have security guards on alert, or doors locked requiring us to announce ourselves to gain entry.

The moment already felt challenging, with so many of us not gathering together in person due to the pandemic, and this situation demonstrated to us that even in smaller numbers we cannot feel completely secure in the synagogue. We must remain vigilant, we must work to recognize anti-semitism in any form and call it out for what it is; and yet, in this moment I am reminded of how beautiful it is, and how often we used to take for granted, the ability to come together to learn, pray and celebrate as a community. We should always be at home in the synagogue, and never let those who would seek us harm deter us from the sacred endeavor of leading a Jewish life.

In working with our students and all of the children and teens at B'nai Jeshurun, we strive to ensure that all feel at home in the synagogue – that it be a place where students simply enjoy spending time, a community students feel proud to be a part of, and a second home where students will always feel comfortable.

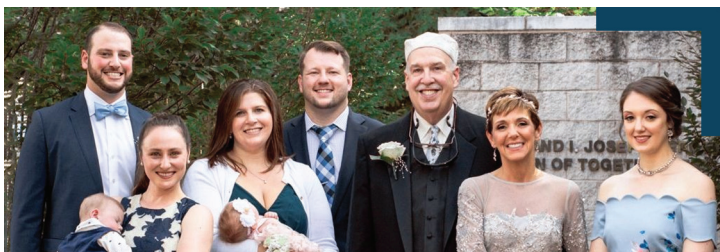
