From the Rabbi



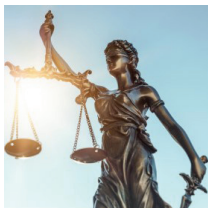
As the Biblical book of Proverbs states, "To everything there is a season." This month marks a time to LEAP. 2024 is a leap year in both the Jewish and the secular calendars. February marks the leap year by adding an extra day on February 29 and Adar (which begins this month) adds an entire month to the Hebrew calendar, Adar 2. This

extra day and leap month account for the adjustment for a solar calendar (secular) and lunar calendar (Hebrew) catching up to the actual orbits based on astrophysics and mathematic calculations. Putting math and science aside, how can we mark this leap year as an exceptional moment? Can we see it as a special opportunity? What will we do with these extra 24 hours on February 29th and extra month of Adar that we did not have time for last month or last year? Will we use them as just another day or as a chance to take a LEAP?

In Ethics of the Sages, Pirkei Avot 5:20: "Rabbi Yehudah ben Tema taught: Be as bold as a leopard, soar as an eagle, be as quick as a deer, and strong as a lion..." How can we learn from this Mishnah to take a leap with this extra time we've been given this month to strengthen our community and soar higher? Can we push ourselves in a bold leap that we may not have had time for in the past? Can we dedicate this extra time for Israel, for Greater Cleveland, for our Jewish community, for our synagogue, for G-d, for our own families, for learning, for volunteering and for ourselves?

How will you use your time to LEAP this month?

Last month marked another milestone in the synagogue's turning the corner on the COVID-19 era. For the first time since the pandemic, we have reconvened the Marcus Leadership Institute. From the Rabbi



I didn't grow up camping, but Rabbi Alex did, and she loves it. Ramah had a major impact on both of us, but what I mean is roughing it in the great outdoors. Her skepticism that I was the kind of person who would enjoy camping only strengthened my resolve to prove that I

am. It took thirty seconds in Moab to prove her right. I was instantaneously swarmed by a horde of mosquitoes like it was the plague of gnats. If I was Pharaoh, the Israelites would have been freed, like, immediately.

And yet, even if nature has it out for me, Tu B'Shevat is one of my absolute favorite holidays. The Torah teaches us that in a war, you can't needlessly destroy fruit trees. It asks: "Is a human being a tree of the field?"

But Psalm 92 offers a different answer to that question: "The righteous will bloom like a date-palm, will thrive like a cedar in Lebanon."

A human being is, actually, a lot like a tree of the field. In *The Hidden Life of Trees* by forest scientist Peter Wohlleben, discussed at our Tu B'Shevat Seder, he explains how trees communicate with one another. They share nutrients with their sick and vulnerable. They have a sense of time and memory. Tu B'Shevat reminds us that nature is possessed of a miraculous hidden life that too often goes unnoticed and underappreciated. But our job as Jews is "Shema, Yisrael..." to "Hear, O Israel." To tune into this song of the earth.

One way we can all do this is by giving composting a try here at B'nai Jeshurun. Food scraps, plates and napkins can now be tossed into our green bins! Other items soon. Individuals and families can also sign up to have their home compost collected outside our building.

As Rav Kook, the first Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of then British Mandate Palestine, said: "Every part of the vegetable world is singing a song and breathing forth a secret of divine mystery of the creation."

Education & Youth



"You shall not oppress a stranger, for you know the feelings of the stranger, having yourselves been strangers in the land of Egypt." (Exodus 23:9)

This month, our Congregational Shabbaton coincides with Parashat Mishpatim, which enumerates 53 different mitzvot, some of which our Shabbaton participants will explore together – I encourage you to join us! Of these 53 mitzvot, perhaps none is more well-known than the call not to oppress the stranger, one who is vulnerable in society. The Torah demands empathy; we suffered at the hands of the Egyptians, we know how it feels, therefore we should never mistreat or abuse another human being. We take this response for granted, perhaps because it's cited so often and we have internalized the message. In fact, the Torah tells us how to act toward a stranger on 36 different occasions! And yet the Torah's response to our oppression in Egypt could have been radically different. Could we not argue that since we were oppressed, exploited, disrespected and tyrannized, and no one stepped in to help us, that we don't owe anything to anyone!?

In the Torah, God certainly demands more of us than this. We can each remember times in our own lives where we have been exploited and mistreated. It might be tempting for us to say, 'well, if you had been through what I've been through, you would understand that I don't owe anybody anything,' and yet the Torah teaches that precisely from these experiences we must learn the proper way to treat others.

We have an obligation as Jews to love and care for the stranger, articulated time and again in the Torah. Sometimes this can be difficult to hear - how can the fate of a stranger, someone I don't even know, be my responsibility? And yet, if we wish to be worthy heirs of the Torah, of our tradition, we must wrestle with these words, as we seek to grow in our kindness and compassion – working to ensure a better world for all.

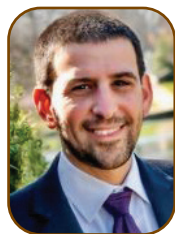

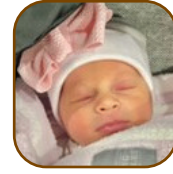
