

From the Rabbi



As we begin the secular new year and focus on the resolutions that we make for 2023 in the year to come, it provides us an opportunity to celebrate what makes B'nai Jeshurun such a special community. In talking with Assistant Rabbi candidates, they shared that our congregation is known for our daily minyan and Shabbat services

which are welcoming, inspiring and reflect our commitment to prayer, community and song. The Hebrew word for prayer (tefilah) shares the same root with the word "wonder" and "selfjudgment." Prayer is our way to express wonder and amazement at the daily miracles in our lives. It reminds us to live with an attitude of gratitude and share our thanks to G-d every single

Prayer can also be a fixed time each day we look inside ourselves, engaging in self-evaluation in order to reflect on the type of person we strive to be each day. Prayer can be transformative and enlightening. Rabbi David Wolpe writes using the image of a person pulling a boat to the shore as a metaphor for prayer: "To someone standing far off, it might appear that one is moving the shore closer, but of course it is only the boat that moves. Similarly, people think they are moving G-d when they are in fact moving themselves. G-d does not change in response to our prayers, but we do. G-d remains unfathomable, but with each earnest prayer we come to understand ourselves better. With each pull, we draw closer to G-d. And if our prayer draws us closer to G-d, then the prayer has been answered."

Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks^{z"I} wrote: "Prayer changes the world because it changes us. It brings the Divine Presence into our lives and gives us strength we didn't know we had. It is to the soul (the mind, the self, our inner life) what exercise is to the body. Like exercise, it is important that we do it daily at set times, and like exercise, it makes us healthier (though in a different way) and more highly charged with positive energy."

This month's scholar-in-residence, Rabbi Josh Warshawsky, will lead us in "Soul Tide Shabbat" along with Cantor Rosenbaum, helping us to elevate our prayer services with kavanah (intention), spirit and inspiration. May the secular new year help us resolve to open our hearts in prayer, song, thanks, wonder and selfimprovement.

President's Message



In April, we will celebrate 75 years since the State of Israel was founded. Such an important milestone deserves more than just a one-day celebration and so we have established the Israel at 75 Committee chaired by Zehava Galun and Adam Hirsh who, along with

their committee, are planning a full calendar year of special events and activities: a wide array of offerings to help you commemorate Israel's special birthday. The calendar of events is not quite finalized as I write this, but I promise that this Committee is planning a memorable year full of fun, educational and uplifting ways to celebrate and to get to know Israel better.

Like me, you may feel that it's even more important at this time to make a strong statement of our love and support for Israel, especially during this time when antisemitism expressed through words and actions is on the rise here and around the world. The recent BDS resolution approved by the Undergraduate Student government at CWRU was called both "anti-Israel and antisemitic" by CWRU University President Kaler. Knowing that all Jews have a home in Israel provides a measure of comfort and security that we did not have 76 years ago. Beyond that, we take great pride in the many accomplishments of the State of Israel - from the blooming desert to the tech innovations of the "start-up nation."

At the same time, we recognize Israel faces challenges on many fronts. But, to love Israel and support her, we don't have to consider her perfect. In fact, recent research from Dr. Sivan Zakai encourages us to educate our children, even at young ages, about Israel in a realistic way so that their love of Israel will be robust and realistic and they will be effective advocates when they reach a college campus. Dr. Zakai's message to Jewish parents is, "The best way to build resilience, a sense of self and purpose and connection to a greater Jewish community and the wider world is by engaging children in conversations about the real world — in all its beauty and messiness." As we plan for the coming year of celebration, the engagement and education of our children is critical to building the next generation of supporters of Israel who love her in all her beauty and messiness.

Cantor's Corner





Music is central to being Jewish. We teach our youngest children the Shema and songs like Hinei Ma Tov. In our services, we don't simply read from the Torah or our Siddur, but put the words to musical notes; we sing the Kiddush on Friday evenings and have different melodies

for each festival. From traditional to contemporary, our Jewish lives are filled with song.

Music truly is our heart and soul, and that is why we are so excited to be offering for the first time Soul Tide Shabbat. Coming up on January 20th and 21st, nourish your soul with music from Rabbi Josh Warshawsky, both throughout Shabbat and for our Havdalah concert on Saturday evening (see the front cover for details)! As Rabbi Warshawsky writes, "My mission is to help people find a spiritual and meaningful home for themselves in order to live lives filled with purpose. I am guided and motivated by my belief that human beings are spiritual seekers and meaning makers. We can find that meaning through Jewish sacred text and ritual, and in the chain of tradition passed down from generation to generation...through prayer, through song and harmony, through spirituality, through ritual, through community, and through justice and fairness, the way is illuminated and becomes clear."

Just as the tide rises and falls, constantly moving, Soul Tide Shabbat brings to B'nai Jeshurun new Jewish music that moves us, with melodies written intentionally to express and re-imagine the deep meaning of our traditional texts. Throughout the weekend, Cantor Rosenbaum will join Rabbi Warshawsky to enrich this experience for all of us, and students in our Bessie Hershey Religious School, at Gross Schechter Day School and at Mandel Jewish Day School will be learning a song to join in with them on the bimah at our Havdalah concert!

As Rabbi Warshawsky sings in words pulled right from our Siddur - Ma Rabu - "How many and how wondrous are your works, Adonai; with wisdom you fashioned them all." Let us celebrate them in song together!





Next Steps for Social Justice/GCC



At the beginning of 2022, our team decided to expand our focus beyond GCC to encourage greater involvement from the congregation. We changed our name to Social Justice/GCC and we conducted a survey to identify other social justice areas of interest. In September *Tidings*, we

reported on the results of our survey. After discussions with Rabbi Hal and lay leadership, it has been decided that initially we will focus on two social justice areas where B'nai Jeshurun will actively engage outside GCC. These two areas are Food Insecurity and Climate Change. Both of these areas have local and national Jewish organizations working on them and we can partner with them as well as pursue our own initiatives. We know some congregants are interested in other social justice areas and we encourage that, although it will not be under the auspices of B'nai Jeshurun. We will continue to work with GCC in its areas of focus that include criminal justice, voting rights, gun safety and health care equity. Our next step is to identify leaders for Food Insecurity and Climate Change. We expect to begin our efforts in these two social justice areas early in 2023. We encourage anyone who is interested in these social justice areas to join us. Please contact me for further information.
