As we begin the secular new year with resolutions to change for the better, I am beginning to teach a new class on Mondays at noon on Zoom where we will explore the most recent legal decisions within our movement. Conservative Judaism balances tradition and change embracing innovation and modernity while holding strong to our customs.

Furthermore, just as every generation faces new issues and challenges, so must the *halakhah* be deemed capable of responding and adapting to new circumstances... President's Message



I've given a lot of thought the last several months to one big question: why is it that antisemitism continues to rear its ugly head, even now in this modern age? We are centuries past the days when the populace's ignorance could be used to convince them that we caused the Black Plague and a host

of other societal ills—and yet. Given that I'm writing this during the holiday season, I hope I can be excused for taking a break and using my column this month to share one of the most compelling explanations I've ever read—authored by Bret Stephens, a Jewish Op-Ed columnist at the New York Times:

"Jews have long stood for a set of ideas that, if not radical now, were radical in their time. Among them: monotheism, freedom, general literacy and what Jewish tradition calls 'argument for the sake of heaven.'

Monotheism imposes a single ethical standard — such as "thou shalt not kill" — on all people, regardless of their country or culture. It's the seed of the idea of universal rights. The story of the Book of Exodus has been an inspiration for all freedom-seeking people — "Let my people go!" Literacy, a prerequisite for becoming a Jewish adult, is the basis for the unshackling of the mind. And argument for the sake of heaven — inscribing dialogue and dissent into religious tradition — is central to any democratic society.

No wonder Jews have inspired so much loathing from every ruler, religion or ideology seeking to keep people in servitude and ignorance. Whenever antisemitism rears its head, it isn't just Jews who are in the cross hairs. It's freedom, education and human dignity — values all of us should share, whether you're Jewish or not."

Mr. Stephens' words have the ring of truth to them: I never considered how the requirement of a Bar Mitzvah over the centuries resulted in near-universal adult literacy in our community. But I am proud that those traits that make the Jewish People a target are also our best qualities, and I wouldn't change a thing.

Best wishes to us all for a more tranquil 2024, and a swift and safe return of our brethren being held hostage in Gaza.

Cantor's Corner



Whenever I look back through my photos of vacations or interesting places I've visited, I'm struck by just how many of my pictures are of trees. I catch myself looking up and marveling at how beautiful nature is as the sun shines through the branches. There

is even a word for this phenomenon in Japanese: *komorebi*. For all the different angles of the sun and all the different types of foliage on trees (or even snow on bare tree branches!), the possible views are nearly endless and never cease to amaze and inspire me.

In the non-Jewish world, it may seem somewhat odd to have a religious holiday dedicated to trees. However, trees factor prominently into the stories of the Tanakh if you look closely enough: the gopherwood used to build Noah's Ark, the unconsumed burning bush in which G-d revealed G-d's self to Moses, the acacia wood used to construct the *Mishkan*, the *kikayon* G-d sent to shade Jonah before causing it to wither and die, the palm under which Deborah the prophetess sat where Barak sought her counsel...the list goes on. None of these stories would be the same if it weren't for the role these trees played. Trees provide shade, food, air, fuel and building materials, in addition to their aesthetic benefits. So, I think the real question is: why doesn't everyone *else* have holidays for the trees?

Though Tu B'Shevat may be considered a minor holiday, it's an opportunity for us to recognize the blessing trees represent in our lives and not take them for granted. We turn our focus to nature and find new ways to sustain ourselves by planting trees, learning more about plants and caring for the earth. Personally, since cacao grows on trees, that alone would be enough to make me incredibly grateful, as a world without chocolate is too grim to even contemplate! Even as we face winter weather, I continue to appreciate the role nature plays in our lives — especially trees — and I hope we will all find new ways to celebrate that this year!

Who Am I To Go To Pharaoh?

Have you ever been in a situation where you knew the right thing to do, yet dreaded doing it? Maybe you were worried about how your actions might be perceived, maybe concerned about potential

consequences? Moses is famously faced with such a dilemma at the beginning of the Book of Exodus, *Shemot*, which we begin reading this month.

Even in the presence of a miracle, the burning bush, and hearing God charge him with the most critical of missions, to go back to Egypt and save his people, Moses tries to back out not just once, but on five separate occasions! The dialogue between Moses and God mimics what one might expect from a child trying to get out of what a parent is telling them to do.

Rashi, the great medieval French commentator, provides a compelling argument for Moses' behavior at the burning bush. Not only is Moses asking, "Who am I, important enough to speak with kings and Pharaohs?" but also, "What have the Israelites done to deserve a miracle to be performed for them that I should bring them out of Egypt?" To this question, God responds, "They are destined to receive the Torah on this very mountain, three months after they leave Egypt." Moses is not simply being asked to do something, he is being charged with a sacred mission. So too, the Israelites are not simply being freed from all burden or responsibility. They are being freed from serving their masters in Egypt so that they can accept the service of another – of God: Torah and Mitzyot.

As we support our brothers and sisters in Israel and as we see a disturbing rise in antisemitism in our country and around the world, may we all heed this charge – doing nothing is simply not an option. In this moment, we must stand up for our right to exist and proudly claim our Jewish heritage, to never let those who might seek us harm deter us, and may we be blessed to fill our world with Torah, Mitzvot, and Gemilut Hasadim.





Over the past 40 years, medical costs have doubled, insurance copays and deductibles have spiked and bankruptcy rates have quadrupled. All of this has created an avalanche of destructive medical debt. A 2019 study found that 35% percent of Ohio adults **CONGREGATIONS** struggled to pay their medical bills. The root cause of more than 60% of bankruptcies in America is due to medical debt.
