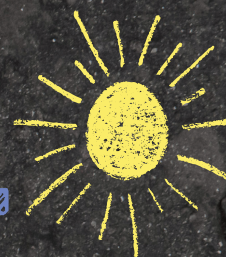

Beineinu - Between Us



As I write this column, we have just held our first Shabbat with the congregation in the sanctuary. It felt good to be back together again, to experience each other's presence and hear each other's voices raised in prayer and song. These past 16 months have been very challenging for all of us, and there is a palpable sense of relief in

the air as the pandemic has started to ebb. I pray that this is still true when you read this.

Somehow it is appropriate that the shift in the pandemic has occurred during this season of the year. We are now in the three weeks of admonition between Shiva Asar B'Tammuz (17 Tammuz, the day that the Romans breached the walls of Jerusalem) to Tisha B'Av (9 Av, the day the Babylonians, and later, the Romans, destroyed the Temple). These three weeks are a time of semi-mourning during which it is customary to refrain from live music and celebrations. During the three Shabbatot of this period, we read Jeremiah's prophecies in which he castigates the people for their sins and warns of the coming destruction.

Tisha B'Av itself is the only fast day besides Yom Kippur that is a 25 hour fast. Our mourning for the Temple is so deep that it is the one day in the calendar when we are actually forbidden to study Torah or Jewish texts because such study is seen as something which brings us joy. The only subject we are allowed to study is the destruction of the Temple.

But after Tisha B'Av, the mood of the calendar swings to the other side of the pendulum. The following seven weeks are referred to as Shiva De-Nechamta, the Seven [Weeks] of Comfort. The mood lightens as each Shabbat we read passages from Isaiah which promise God will forgive us, restore us to our land, and bless us. The seven weeks ends with Rosh Hashanah, the celebration of the New Year.

Just as we shift soon from mourning to rejoicing on the Jewish calendar, so too I pray that these seven weeks will also bring a continued gradual lessening of the pandemic and a concurrent return to greater normalcy.

Wishing you health above all else, and an enjoyable summer.

President's Message



A couple was stranded on a desert island and, years later, finally rescued. The rescuers saw two structures that the couple had built and asked, "What are these?" The couple replied, "That's our shul and that's the one we couldn't be caught dead walking into..." This is a well-known joke,

but as with many jokes, it holds a grain of truth that makes it funny. Synagogues have very specific "personalities" or "cultures" that either entice us to join or cause us to walk away.

One very important aspect of our synagogue's culture includes listening to our membership when there are weighty matters to be decided - such as finding a new Cantor or how to conduct High Holy Days services as we are emerging from a pandemic. We recognize that our members have strong ideas and feelings about each of these issues and therefore we have surveyed the congregation to collect those opinions in an organized and helpful manner.

Our Cantor Search Committee was thrilled with the many thoughtful responses we received regarding the factors most important to them in our new Cantor. The responses have been used to inform the job description and will inform the entire search process. I am optimistic that we will be successful in our search for the Cantor that fits well with our congregation and culture.

We have repeated the High Holy Days survey again this year, but the High Holy Days Task Force recognizes that the choices and complexity have increased considerably since last year as we find ourselves in a transitional period emerging from the pandemic and its restrictions. While we are very happy to have started in person Shabbat services in June with limited numbers, the High Holy Days present us many additional challenges given the size of our congregation and the range of feelings people have about their comfort level in large group settings. Many options are under consideration and your responses are vital to helping us design meaningful options to meet the needs of our congregants. Once again, I feel confident that our process of listening to you will result in a positive outcome.

My thanks to everyone who has responded to these surveys. We are listening!

Cantor's Corner



The summer represents warm weather, fun activities and an opportunity to enjoy the outdoors. For our kids, it allows them to recharge their batteries and relax from an intensive school year. Unfortunately, the summer also

represents a very dark period in our Jewish history. Both of our holy temples were destroyed on the same Hebrew date (9th of Av). The destruction of the temples is marked by a 24-25 hour fast day. The invading countries burned and destroyed our holy temples and we lost autonomy. We were exiled and our connectivity to G-d has never been the same.

While we can visit the Western Wall, it is a skeleton of what the temples were in their grand luster. It is very easy to misconstrue our places of worship and assume they have successfully replaced the holy temples. While we can pray daily, there is no comparison to what the holy temples represented. This is why our sages institute the three weeks prior to the destruction as a gradual mourning period. It starts with a minor fast on the 17th of Tammuz and gradually intensifies in the mourning observances, as well as restrictions during the 21-day period. No weddings and celebrations are permitted.

The nine days prior to the 9th of Av, we don't eat meat unless it's Shabbat, a bris or a completion of a tractate. On the 9th of Av, the mourning intensifies further with a 24-hour fast, not wearing leather, and abstaining from intimacy. We don't wear tallit and tefillin the morning of the 9th of Av.

G-d's presence has departed from Jerusalem and we are all struggling to connect with G-d in our own ways. We are living in perilous times and the number of anti-Semitic attacks is skyrocketing. We need G-d more than ever. We cannot afford to be divisive. We need to unite despite differences and show G-d we are deserving of G-d's love and blessings. We cannot wait for a calamity to happen as it usually unites us temporarily. We need to get on board now and each of us needs to elevate our observances and behavior. May we be worthy to see the third temple be rebuilt and thrive side-by-side as a Jewish nation.

Walking in God's Ways

"And now, O Israel, what does Adonai your God demand of you? Only this: to revere Adonai your God, to walk only in God's ways, to love God, and to serve Adonai your God with all your heart and soul... Adonai your God is God supreme and Adonai supreme, the great, the mighty, and the awesome God" (Deut. 10:12-17)

This month, in Parashat Ekev, we are commanded to walk in God's ways, but what does it really mean to walk in God's ways? What attributes and qualities demand our reverence, our action? Moses could have chosen to mention any number of qualities or feats when describing God's attributes in the verses that follow. Perhaps he would remind the children of Israel of God's might in afflicting the Egyptians with the ten plagues or in splitting the Red Sea. Perhaps he could recount the Flood or the Tower of Babel. But instead, Moses tells the people that God "shows no favor and takes no bribe, but upholds the cause of the fatherless and the widow and befriends the stranger, providing them with food and clothing." (Deut. 10:17-18)

We learn here from Moses that walking in God's ways is not about our might but rather about our love and care for those in need, those afflicted by injustice, and those suffering from natural disaster. Tzedakah, advocacy, service, lending a helping hand, these are God's ways. So, as we work to make our way out of the pandemic, to walk in God's ways means to recognize the physical, financial and emotional toll this time has had on so many of us. Walking in God's ways, we have the power to make a difference – and there's no better time to start than right now!

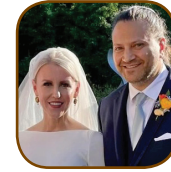
