From the Rabbi



Summer is my favorite season. Perhaps, it is because I grew up on the Jersey Shore and spent my early years on the beach or at summer camp. I have memories of trips to Shea Stadium with my dad to see the Mets and family trips to the Catskills. Now, the summer usually means a trip to Israel or enjoying the MetroParks, the

lake, the fairways of Cleveland's golf courses and all of our wonderful outdoor programs in our Linden Family Courtyard like Friday night services and Shabbat Rocks.

Summer is also a time for new beginnings. I am excited to welcome Cantor Alyssa Rosenbaum to our clergy team. We have already developed a close partnership meeting regularly on Zoom and look forward to her leading us in services, programs and classes. I hope you will join us this summer and get to know our wonderful new Cantor.

Summer is also an appropriate time to work on improving ourselves as we approach the High Holidays. On my first day of Rabbinical School at JTS in New York, our dean Rabbi Bill Lebeau sat our class down and taught us one Mishnah for almost four hours. In my weekly Zoom "What's Nu?" class, we are studying Pirkei Avot 6:6 (Ethics of the Sages) and the same classic teaching I was taught more than 25 years ago describing the 48 qualities necessary to live a life dedicated to Torah. The Mishnah advises us to have a listening ear, an understanding heart, organized lips, to love righteousness, seek justice and to prioritize our time. We may not all aspire to be congregational rabbis but these *middot*, life skills and traits to refine, have the ability to help each of us be better partners, friends, community members and role models.

President's Message



There are two new year's celebrations in Judaism. Rosh Hashanah is "harat olam" when the world is born, and Pesach, which occurs in Nisan, the first month of the year in the Jewish calendar. July 1 is yet another new year for our congregation, albeit one with no religious significance

- it is the beginning of our fiscal year. And though this date passes with no celebrations or fanfare, a lot of work has preceded it as we construct the annual synagogue budget. Our Budget Committee, chaired by Treasurer Greg Goldfeder, along with Marcy Stahm, our Controller, and the rest of the staff and clergy review literally every aspect of synagogue functioning.

While most congregants are not interested in the details of the budget, there are key areas of interest. First is the question of dues: will they increase or stay flat? I am pleased to say that this year, like last year, we have decided NOT to raise dues. The second question: are we being fiscally responsible in creating a realistic budget? You may be aware that dues cover only a portion of our budget and we rely on the generosity of our Ner Tamid Donors, our Mahar campaign, as well as other donations, to fill the gap in our budget and allow us to continue to provide the robust programming that helps make our synagogue such a special place.

In addition, a crucial ongoing source of income vital to our synagogue's financial health is our endowment, including both targeted endowment funds that donors specify for certain purposes, as well as unrestricted funds. Our Investment Committee has determined that no more than 4.5% of our endowment may be used each year to ensure these funds remain strong and growing for our synagogue's future. Given the economic forces at play, it is vital that we grow our endowment.

On September 18, we will be dedicating our new Endowment Fund Donor Wall which recognizes individuals who have contributed \$10,000 or more to an endowment fund. Each flower on this beautiful wall represents an endowment fund donor, but even more importantly, each flower recognizes and honors the commitment made to our synagogue and its future. With some flowers still left to be claimed by new donors, please consider whether you want to join the others on the wall in securing our synagogue's future.

Korach: An Unholy Controversy

"Any argument which is for the sake of heaven will endure, and one which is not for the sake of heaven will not endure." – Pirkei Avot 5:20

Our tradition recognizes there is nothing 'wrong' with disagreement; in certain arguments, however, where two sides treat

one another with respect and unselfish motives, they add Godliness to the world, unlike those that lack respect and reflect selfish motives. Pirkei Avot singles out the dispute between Korach and Moses in Parashat Korach, the first Torah reading this month, as a prime example of an argument not for the sake of heaven.

At first glance, Korach's argument seems well-grounded. He challenges Moses and Aaron's leadership, claiming they have amassed too much power when in fact the entire nation is holy. Korach is seemingly working to preserve equality in his community, so what makes his challenge "not for the sake of heaven"? Rabbi Jonathan Sacks interprets the difference between the two types of arguments as "an argument for the sake of truth" and "an argument for the sake of victory." The former is motivated by pursuit of the greater good, while the latter stems from a desire for personal gain. Korach's goal was not truly to preserve equality but rather to supplant Moses's and Aaron's leadership of the Israelites. His motivation was selfish, not seeking to benefit his community.

In contrast to Korach, Pirkei Avot singles out another dispute as a prime example of an argument for the sake of heaven, that of the houses of Hillel and Shammai in the Talmud. The two famous rabbis interpreted Jewish law in fundamentally different ways, sometimes affecting basic tenets of Judaism. And yet their students would live together and respect the other's right to disagree, recognizing that they did not possess the only valid approach to interpreting Jewish law. Their arguments represent a search for ultimate truth, forcing each side to constantly clarify and rethink their positions.

There will undoubtedly be many times in our lives where we disagree with others, sometimes on the most fundamental of issues. And yet when we do disagree, may we strive to make sure that our disputes, like those of Hillel and Shammai, are for the sake of heaven.
