Last year, we held a special Shabbat service in honor of Tu B'Av (the 15th of Av), a holiday that celebrates love—and we're looking forward to doing so again this year. No matter what stage of life you're in, we all have love in our lives, and that is always worth celebrating, perhaps especially amidst the somber moments of our calendar.

Education & Youth



At the end of this month we observe Tisha B'Av, the saddest day on the Jewish calendar. On this day in our history, both the First and Second Temple in Jerusalem were destroyed, and according to our tradition many other great calamities befell our people, dating all the way back to the Israelites' wandering in the wilderness when ten of the twelve spies

returned with a bad report, according to tradition on the 9th of Av.

And yet, beginning immediately after Tisha B'Av we begin to console one another, to announce that things will get better. On each of the seven Shabbat mornings between Tisha B'Av and Rosh Hashanah we read special Haftarat of consolation, taken from the reassuring words of our prophets that even as Jerusalem is poor, restless and distressed, God will restore her beauty, making her "windows of rubies and gates of precious stones...great shall be the happiness of your children" (Isaiah 54:12-13). How can it be that in the immediate aftermath of our saddest moment, we can even begin to think of a brighter future?

The Midrash (Pesikta D'Rav Kahana 18:5), written nearly 2,000 years ago following the destruction of the Temple, shares of a sailor who heard Rabbi Yochanan reciting these verses from Isaiah and said incredulously, 'We have nothing precious left, how can you say such things!' According to the midrash, shortly thereafter the sailor's ship sank into the sea and he saw under the water ministering angels shaping and carving something. "What is this?" he asked. "We are making the windows of the Temple out of rubies and its gates from precious stones."

And so it is in the eyes of our tradition, that even when we saw the Temple destroyed, God was already busy building for the future. And the words of our prophets should not be seen as hope in a far off time, but rather that even in our moment of despair, the seeds of a brighter future are already in motion. Even when it is hard to see, may we continue to be the change we wish to see in the world, and know that the seeds of a bright future are already in our midst.

Social Justice/GCC: Food Insecurity Subcommittee

What is food insecurity? Food insecurity is defined as “the condition of not having access to sufficient food, or food of an adequate quality, to meet one’s basic needs ...” There is a pressing need to ease the burden of food insecurity in our own region, as well as at the state and national levels. In May 2023, with the end of pandemic-era assistance, many households experienced a reduction in SNAP (Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) benefits. Local food pantries, including the Kosher Food Pantry and the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, are working hard to fill this gap. Nationally, organizations are stepping up to advocate, educate and assist. Through preliminary research, we have learned that there is a place for a synagogue committee to make a difference.

What role is there for B’nai Jeshurun? A Food Insecurity Subcommittee, which is now in formation as part of B’nai Jeshurun’s broader Social Justice/GCC Committee, invites your participation. This subcommittee, co-chaired by Shelley Scher and Carol Willen, will focus on social justice, including public policy and advocacy through a Jewish lens. We hope to complement the important social action work of the synagogue’s Chesed Committee. The efforts of this Subcommittee will reflect our Jewish perspective and seek to provide broad impact. Goals and strategies will be developed, drawing on the expertise and resources of MAZON: A Jewish Response to Hunger, the Greater Cleveland Food Bank and other organizations. The committee will devote time to studying the issues before defining and crafting our social justice approach to this problem.

We encourage congregants to join our ranks. Our first meeting will be scheduled over the summer, allowing you to join us from the start. Synagogue leadership and clergy recognize the importance of this effort. Rabbi Rudin-Luria will help drive the vision of our work. We welcome Rabbi Jacobs, who will be working directly with the subcommittee. 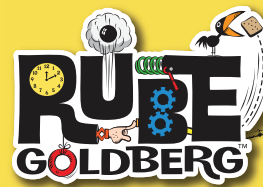
