





Peineinu - Between Us



"If you believe it is possible to break, then believe it is possible to repair." These words, taught by Rabbi Nachman of Breslov, carry great significance for me this year as we approach the High Holy Days. It seems there is a lot in our world and our lives that is broken. It is at times like these that we need our High Holy Days

season most. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur come along to remind us that change is possible. No matter what we have done wrong individually or as a society, there is always the ability to repair. Through introspection and examination of our thought, speech and deeds, we can confront our failings and transform ourselves. The shofar blasts call us to that reckoning, while imploring God to forgive us and allow us to start our lives anew. God, in turn, stands ready to lovingly receive us.

But what happens when the High Holy Days themselves are impacted by the crises we face? In this time of pandemic, is our ability to observe the holidays so broken they cannot help us heal? I cannot tell you as of this writing what the High Holy Days will look like; I know they will be different. What I can tell you is that - whatever form they take - they will be a shared community experience that will move us to seek the repair we need to heal ourselves, our relationships and our world in the coming year. We will still be transported by Cantor Shifman's beautiful voice. The sermons and teaching will still comfort, challenge and inspire you. We will still cry together as we sing "On Rosh Hashanah it is written and on Yom Kippur it is sealed..." We will still feel the urgency of the shofar blasts calling us to repentance. We will still conclude Ne'ilah at the end of the fast imbued with both commitment to work for a better future and hope in its fulfillment.

"If you believe it is possible to break, then believe it is possible to repair." These holidays may be different, yet in their own way they will be the best ever. Believe it. And believe in your own ability to rise up to the many challenges you face. God promises us we can. All we have to do is try.

resident's Message



Over the last few months, while some synagogues have been unable to function, our clergy and staff have made sure we've hardly missed a beat. We have begun to offer a wide variety of online programming, and the number of congregants who tune in to

our zoomed and streamed services has significantly increased. However, with all we've accomplished and all the programs we continue to plan, the future is still largely unknown. What we do know is that we need our synagogue, our faith, our community and our clergy more than ever. The Pew Forum on Religion found that with 91% of houses of worship closed in April, there was still a 25% increase in faith during the pandemic. Gallup reported that 28% more people are praying now than they did before. And a new survey of young people ages 18-25 by Springtide Research Institute found that 35% increased their faith, nearly 46% have started new religious practices and 43% have participated in at least one religious service online. Based on those numbers, B'nai Jeshurun must not only survive this crisis but emerge even stronger and offering more for all ages.

I believe that most of our congregants realize the value in all we've been doing before and during the pandemic, and we hope we can count on your continued support as our fiscal year starts anew with the 2020-2021 membership renewal notices going out. Realizing that this crisis has financially hurt some of our congregants, your financial support is more important than ever, and we greatly appreciate those who have already stepped up to help during this challenging time. We've also asked the budget committee to prepare several budgets with different levels of cuts in expenses.

I want to offer my appreciation to our staff, our clergy and all of you. We are a community, and we will get through this together, perhaps a little worse for wear, but we will get through it. And, in the end, whenever that is, my hope is that we will be a stronger community for it. With all of your support, we can get there.

Pantor's Corner



This month, we will commemorate the destruction of both holy temples. There is a three-week period starting with a minor fast. The fast is called the 17th of Tammuz, which begins the downfall of Jerusalem. The outer walls were destroyed, leading to the destruction of the temple itself. The

three weeks begins a mourning period, which intensifies in mourning as one nears the actual destruction of the temple. No weddings, haircuts or celebrations take place. The last nine days we abstain from meat, swimming, and try to avoid trips. The destruction took place on the 9th of Av. We commemorate this with a 24-hour fast. No leather is worn. Tallit and tefillin are not worn in the morning service. No greeting of one another or intimate relations. Both temples were destroyed on this day, as well as other calamities that happened.

Besides the destruction of the temples, what makes Jerusalem so special? According to tradition, all creation began with Jerusalem. The epicenter is Mount Moriah, the actual site of the temples. This was also where Isaac was almost sacrificed. Jacob had his famous dream of angels going up and down the ladder in the same spot. The Western Wall signifies the remembrance of the holiest of sites. Even though the temple was destroyed, the desecrated area still maintains holiness. The temple

Education & Youth



This month, we conclude the fourth book in the Torah, as the Israelites wandering in the wilderness approach the Promised Land. The tribes of Reuven and Gad see that the land they arrive at prior to crossing the

Jordan River into Israel is perfect for raising cattle, and they ask Moses if they can settle there. On one level, the request seems fair, since this is the land that would best serve these two tribes. But in settling down there, the tribes of Reuben and Gad would be circumventing the challenges that awaited in conquering the land of Israel. Perhaps they felt they could stand in solidarity with the rest of the Israelites from a distance, while letting the other tribes doing the work necessary to settle the Canaan.

Moses, however, challenges Reuben and Gad: "Shall your brothers go to war while you sit here?" (Num. 32:6). The message is clear, how can you forsake your community when they need you? And so Gad and Reuben make the offer to Moses, that while they will ultimately settle down on the east bank of the Jordan, they will join the rest of Israel in battle until the entire land is conquered. Only then does Moses permit them to settle outside the land.

We are all sometimes placed in the position of the tribes of Reuben and Gad. While we stand in solidarity, whether with Israel, communities in need around the country and the world or with the problems plaguing people right here in Cleveland, it is all too easy to let others do the most difficult work. We must remember there is much we can do, even when a pandemic makes it impossible to be on the front lines in person. Whether by

donating to worthy causes, volunteering, combating biases and prejudice or in any other fashion, the tribes of Reuben and Gad demonstrate to us that solidarity requires action. Let us learn from their example and find the best ways we can take action to make our world a better place.



in its glory was a place of pilgrimage three times a year. G-d's holiness was most felt in this area. Even though we believe G-d's presence is everywhere, it was especially evident here. The site embodies tears, prayers and hopes to connect with G-d. We still pray in the Diaspora, facing toward Jerusalem, for this reason.

The area is not just a historical asset, but the very core of our Jewish roots. This is why we always end the Passover seder with the text, "Next year in Jerusalem". Part of the word "Yerushalayim" means *Shalem* – complete. We are incomplete and, as such, always recognize this in a wedding by breaking a cup. In order for us to have true celebration again, Jerusalem needs to be restored to its glory. Until then, we need to be cognizant of what this gaping hole represents. May we all witness Jerusalem in its rebuilding and be worthy to worship G-d in an unprecedented way.

CARES Act
