This has been a long and difficult year for all of us. The separation from congregation, friends and family that has been necessary during this pandemic has taken away from us the human contact that feeds our neshamas (souls), giving us solace, joy and strength. In-Person Services Update

We are excited to welcome synagogue members back for in person services in June. For the safety of our community, we require members ages 12 and older who are eligible to be vaccinated to be fully vaccinated in order to attend. Masks are required for the unvaccinated and are optional for vaccinated individuals. Pre-registration will be required for all attendees. Safety measures such as social distancing and temperature checks will be followed and numbers will be limited for Shabbat services. Further details are:

On June 1, the morning minyan will resume and will be held outdoors when the weather permits and inside otherwise. Beginning June 18, Friday night and Saturday morning services will resume. Zoom and live streaming links will still be available for all services. Registration links are coming soon; please check our website and e-blasts.



President's Message



As I begin my Presidency, I have reflected on what led me here - a natural inclination as I am a Developmental Psychologist. I grew up in the Reform Movement at Temple Beth El in Detroit, and was a leader in youth group and Michigan

State Temple Youth. At Brandeis, where I majored in Judaic Studies and Psychology, I had my first real experience with traditional Judaism. I liked what I saw: the Shabbos dinners, the traditions, the warmth of the services. I felt a connection to Judaism I had not experienced before and made many friends in the process. Traditional Judaism is a "team sport" and I felt welcomed onto the team. I decided to observe kashrut, became a Shabbos regular and Torah reader.

Fast forward to my arrival in Cleveland after finishing grad school at Cornell, to join David, my fiancé. Soon after our wedding, we went "shul shopping" and 32 years ago B'nai Jeshurun became our spiritual home. Two children arrived in guick succession and we keenly felt the absence of family nearby. We were craving connections and reached out to the synagogue to form a *havurah*. Balancing our careers and young children, we hadn't really connected with the synagogue yet.

Havurah Shorashim was the crucial connector for us - our "synagogue family" with whom to celebrate holidays, life cycle events and attend synagogue activities. We felt anchored and connected. This was key to us staying at BJC. As my kids grew older, I became connected in new ways and took on leadership roles.

Relationships have been central to my Jewish evolution and involvement with the synagogue. I am not unique and want to ensure we are doing all we can to facilitate meaningful connections between congregants. As a large congregation, it is challenging, but relationships are key to building community and not simply a list of names in a directory. A key focus of mine will be to strengthen all we do already and find new ways to build connections. I welcome your ideas and support in this endeavor.

From the Rabbi



"Sometimes you see a war on TV and sometimes you see it through the window of your home. This is the situation right now in Ashkelon." These were the words of my colleague, Rabbi Gustavo Surazski, in Ashkelon. Another colleague posted that as the sirens blared, he was at a playground in

Tel Aviv with his young children. He panicked because he could not make it to a bomb shelter in time and did not know what to do. Thankfully, there was an Iron Dome intercept and they were safe. For us in the Diaspora, we live with our hearts facing east, with one foot in the Holy Land. Our hearts have been in our throats painfully lately.

Hamas's charter calls for the destruction of Israel. As I write this, their terrorist rockets are aimed into the heart of Israel's cities, at both Jew and Arab alike. Israel has responded because a sovereign nation has a right to defend itself. Rabbi David Wolpe summed it up: "Here is the simple truth. If Hamas stopped raining rockets on Israel, it would be over. If Israel stopped defending and retaliating, it would be slaughter."

The other simple truth is that any and every death in this conflict is heartbreaking. We must all be devasted at the loss of life, no matter which side, nationality or faith. We mourn for all lives lost: Jew and Arab, Israeli and Palestinian. I pray that by the time you read this column, there is not just a ceasefire but a lasting peace.

Israeli scholar and thinker Yossi Klein HaLevi wrote: "Israelis know how to live with missile attacks...war, siege, boycotts and terror atrocities. But we don't know how to cope with Jewish and Arab mobs roaming our streets, attacking synagogues and mosques and lynching their fellow citizens. How do we fight a war against terrorists when we internalize the terror and turn against each other? Is this how Israel unravels? For Israel to survive requires two commitments: maintaining the security high ground and the moral high ground. Weaken either and our long-term future is compromised."

Education & Youth



State of our Education

This year has challenged us in so many ways, forcing us to completely rethink how we work with all our students and families. And yet, as our Shabbat morning program, youth service and teen program moved online and our midweek Hebrew program

transformed into 1-on-1 tutoring sessions, I am awed at the ways our families balanced having children learning at home with taking care of everything else in their lives. I am pleased to report that in spite of these challenges, the vast majority of our students and families remained as engaged as ever with our Youth & Learning Center.

On Shabbat mornings we partnered with the Jewish Education Center on a new curriculum designed for virtual learning - each unit centered on a Jewish value that helps build resiliency during challenging times, and students received activity boxes and challenges to maintain engagement throughout the week. Our holiday program series featuring Luach Lion was a huge hit, bringing together dozens of our families for hamentashen baking on Purim, growing a terrarium on Tu B'Shevat, creating a table-scape for Passover and more. The improvcomedy duo, The Bible Players, were a hit with students of all ages on Simhat Torah, Hanukkah and Purim. In the fall and spring, many families participated in Shabbat @ Home Together, where families received Shabbat candles, grape juice, challah and a Shabbat art project and then joined together on Zoom to welcome in Shabbat as a community. Another major highlight was our Havdallah concert featuring rabbi song-leader Josh Warshawsky.

As the weather got nicer outside and the number of Covid cases began going down in our area, we sought out safe ways to begin gathering together again outside. Families have enjoyed the opportunity to celebrate Consecration and siddur presentation ceremonies, as well as join us for youth group events in person.

While it is certainly our hope to be able to all join together in person again soon, we have been learning from our experiences this year to determine what we can learn from to help strengthen our program when that day comes – hopefully soon!






