President's Message



Honeycake, latkes, matzo ball soup: as we travel through the Jewish calendar, there are the culinary "must haves" that symbolize important aspects of each holiday celebration. As we sit at the table enjoying these delicious foods, they raise warm memories of holidays past and the

people who prepared them and may no longer be with us. For me, that person is my grandmother, of blessed memory, who made the best "Jewish food" I have ever tasted. Her unbelievably delicious cooking and baking was even more amazing because she was illiterate. She had worked as a child and never attended school and so all these recipes were made from memory.

Just as I think of her each Shabbat as I use the candlesticks that she passed on to me, each time I prepare these foods, I honor my grandmother's memory doing my best to live up to her high standard of cooking. Unlike my grandmother, I do rely on recipes. As each holiday approaches, I reach into my recipe collection and find the dog-eared pages often stained from past uses to repeat the comforting annual ritual of preparing for this particular holiday. So, for Shavuot, I am dusting off my blintz souffle recipe.

Judaism has given us four times throughout the year to recite Yizkor and collectively remember those no longer with us. Shavuot is one of those opportunities. Standing with others, reciting the Kaddish together brings a great deal of comfort. Our memories are our own, but in grieving we are not alone. And while we may remember those people in many different ways throughout the year, being together for Yizkor elevates that experience of remembering. Yizkor gives us another opportunity to grieve communally for someone who, like my grandmother, has been gone for decades, or for someone who has just passed on. Judaism has recognized that grieving does not have a time limit and that the loss of those we loved is with us throughout our lives. Yizkor provides us with a way to honor those we've lost and comforts us in the process. So, this Shavuot, I remember my grandmother with love as I eat blintzes and as I recite the Yizkor prayers, finding great comfort in both.

State of our Youth & Learning Center

As our students get ready for summer camp, vacations and more, I want to take a moment to reflect on this past school year, and all we have accomplished despite an ever-shifting landscape. We began our school year with classrooms set up under

canopy tents on the grounds outside our building, with weather that graciously accommodated us through the height of the Delta variant wave. We came back into our building only to be required to shift to virtual learning during the Omicron variant surge this past winter. And yet through all of it, our teachers and students continued to adapt and learn, and it has been wonderful to be able to conclude our school year in person, even bringing back our Youth Shabbaton held at Camp Wise this spring, with over 50 students, teens and staff participating.

It has also been a blessing to welcome new youth director Sydney Ungar into the fold. With her, we have held numerous events and kicked off our new Monday night Makom program for teens, which has been a great success in creating a space for teens to gather, socialize, eat and learn together. We also brought 12 high school students together for our 1st ever Hineni Fellowship trip, a project of the Isakowitz Jewish Youth Initiative, made possible by the generosity of the Isakowitz family. This immersive trip brought our students to Washington, DC to learn in-depth about the Holocaust, anti-Semitism and the US relationship with Israel, meet with advocacy groups and political leaders from both countries, and advocate for what they believed with the offices of both Ohio senators.

Through it all, we are grateful for the opportunity to be back together in person in ways that were not possible last school year. And we are hard at work beginning to plan and build the best experiences for all of the families in our congregation for the coming year – learning from our successes during the pandemic, bringing back those highlights which were simply not possible the past couple years, and crafting new programs and initiatives to bring our community to new heights together. 





Social Justice/GCC: Wrongful Conviction

In 1975, three young Cleveland Black men were convicted of murder based on the eyewitness testimony of a 12-year-old, whose false testimony was coerced by prosecutors. The three men served 106 years combined in prison before being freed, with the help of the Ohio Innocence Project, when the witness recanted. Their lives were spared only because the death penalty in Ohio was declared unconstitutional in 1978. The story is detailed in the book, *Good Kids, Bad City* by Kyle Swenson.

Some of you may have seen the May 6/7 20/20 episode on detailing the case of 12-year-old Anthony Harris, a Black Cleveland area juvenile wrongly convicted in 1998 of murdering a white 5-year-old girl based solely on a coerced false confession he made. He was held in juvenile detention for two years before being freed in 2000.

Last month, Eliana Wolf, daughter of Tami & Jason Wolf, hosted a panel of two Black Cleveland exonerees, Charles Jackson and Laurese Glover, interviewed by Pierce Reed of the Ohio Innocence Project. They served a total of 48 years in prison. Laurese Glover was a juvenile bindover (as a juvenile, he was transferred to adult court). The Innocence Project, founded in 1992, works to free the innocent, prevent wrongful convictions, and create fair, compassionate and equitable systems of justice for everyone. Their work is guided by science and grounded by antiracism. The Ohio Innocence Project, which is part of the Innocence Project network, is based in Cincinnati and has a Northeast Ohio presence, led by Alec Berezin, a BJC member.
