From the Rabbi



Israel at 75

HaTikvah, Israel's national anthem, was composed by Naftali Herz Imber. He was born in Galitzia where he dreamed like so many Jews of a Jewish state in the land of Israel for a homeland and hope (HaTikvah) in the 1870's. He wrote those words living in Europe in the face of rising antisemitism

and pogroms nearly 75 years before the rebirth of the modern state in 1948. He wrote them before Theodore Herzl, the father of modern Zionism, convened the first World Zionist Congress. Could Imber have imagined an Israel like we have today?

As we mark this incredible milestone of Israel at 75 and we celebrate the miraculous story of the rebirth of the Jewish state, our Promised land and start-up nation, we celebrate Israel's incredible story. Even in the midst of Israel's current civil unrest and political challenges, the protests over the judiciary and the ongoing conflict with the Palestinians and terror attacks, we have to marvel that Israel is flourishing and a model nation for the world. In Joel Chasnoff and Benji Lovitt's new book, *Israel 201: Your Next-Level Guide to the Magic, Mystery and Chaos of Life in the Holy Land:* "In under a century, we have transformed ourselves into a thriving democratic state - a regional superpower, economically advanced, creating and sharing ideas that impact the entire world."

In Daniel Gordis' new book, *Impossible Takes Longer: 75 years after its creation, has Israel fulfilled its founders' dreams?*, he writes: "Israel has mesmerized the world because of its magical story, one of the greatest stories of resilience, rebirth and triumph, a nation literally reborn after a 2,000 year hiatus, born with the expressed purpose of saving the Jewish people, deeply committed to creating a society much more perfect than those from which it had come. Israel's successes make it too easy to forget the magnitude of what it has accomplished."

Imber's lyrics of HaTikvah composed more than a century ago still carry our hope and pledge our unbreakable bond of love for Israel: "As long as the heart of the Jewish people beats, As long as the eyes of the Jewish people looks to the east, Then our hope is not lost to be a free nation in our land."

Cantor's Corner



It is undoubtedly the case that Judaism has changed a lot over the course of the past couple thousand years. Yet there is a major commonality which has sustained our people

throughout the centuries: the commitment to learning. We aren't just encouraged but *commanded* to teach the words of our laws to our children. Books help bring the past to life, bring comfort when we feel lost, bring our imaginations to new heights. Some books are even good enough to occasionally reread and rediscover something new or relive our nostalgia. Our ultimate reread and ultimate teacher truly is the Torah, our Tree of Life.

Cemetery Update

B'nai Jeshurun has burial rights at four cemeteries: Bet Olam, Chesterland, Glenville and Zion. Two cemeteries, Chesterland, and Glenville are fully owned by the synagogue. To maintain the cemeteries at the highest level possible while managing our expenses which have risen steadily, we are no longer allowing any monuments more than eighteen inches high to be placed on graves unless there is already a double stone in place. We ask that no artificial flowers or pots be left on the plots for maintenance workers to pick up; fresh flowers are acceptable. No large stones, borders, bushes, trees or frames are allowed on graves. Small stones are welcome.

At Bet Olam Cemetery over the next few years, B'nai Jeshurun and its cemetery partners are considering removing existing frames from all sections of the cemetery with new topsoil and grass planted; a final decision on frame removal will occur this year. Existing monuments will not be touched. This is being done to enhance the beauty of the cemetery while reducing maintenance costs. Frames will not be allowed on any future plots. As is the case with many facilities, labor is scarce and hand cutting weeds and replanting plants is becoming cost prohibitive. Please note as well that only members may be buried in the B'nai Jeshurun section at Bet Olam. Non-members may be buried at the other three cemeteries.

Counting the Omer

Throughout this month we count the Omer, the seven weeks from Passover until we arrive at Shavuot. There are two primary reasons for this counting – the first agricultural, recognizing the spring harvest, and the second historical, counting the fifty days between the Exodus from Egypt until the Israelites arrived at Mount Sinai

and received the Torah.

So why do we count? We can all think of times we have counted days – when we're counting down to the next vacation we have, until the Browns' next game, time until we're out of quarantine... – anytime we're excited or anxious for something to occur. According to the *midrash*, when Moses told the Israelites, 'you shall worship God,' they asked him: 'When will this be?' He replied, 'at the end of 50 days,' and so each of them began counting for themselves. Having witnessed God take them out of Egypt, they had every reason to count these days in excitement and anticipation of when the rest of God's promise, receiving the Torah, would be fulfilled. Based on this, the Sages ordained the counting of the Omer.

While the Israelites in the wilderness were excited, the spring harvest likely made our ancestors anxious. They didn't know whether their crop would be strong, whether they would have enough for themselves and their families. They counted anxiously until the crop was harvested and were sure they would have enough.

Interestingly, during the Omer we count the days that have passed rather than the days which still lie ahead. The Rabbis of the Talmud decided that we should say the blessing for counting the Omer on each and every day, as the number rises, emphasizing the significance of each day.

Sometimes we get so caught up counting down to the next momentous occasion in our lives that we forget to live for today. Our tradition reminds us that it is not only those major events in life that are worthy of blessing; every single day is a blessing with the potential to be great if only we give it a chance.
