# Beineinu - Between Us



Last month, Gina Peddy, an administrator at a Texas school district, instructed teachers to "teach both sides" of the Holocaust. In the face of public outrage, the district's superintendent apologized and instructed teachers to disregard that comment, adding that there are not two sides to the Holocaust.

She did not, however, indicate any reprimand for Peddy. In fact, many parents from the school defended her.

This summer, a Palm Beach school district rehired a principal who had been fired because he refused to say the Holocaust was a historical fact. His lawyer appealed, claiming that it was not right that some parents from the school were pressing him to confront parents who were Holocaust deniers. Educators, he argued, seek to remain neutral. The judge agreed.

In 2013 in Albany, high school teachers gave their students a writing assignment: "You must argue that Jews are evil and use solid rationale from government propaganda to convince me of your loyalty to the Third Reich!" In 2014 in Rialto, CA, teachers gave their high school students an assignment to compose an essay on whether they believe the Holocaust was "an actual event in history or merely a political scheme." Resources given to students included a Holocaust denial website.

Holocaust denial is a way of twisting the facts not just to claim that the Holocaust did not happen, or that it was not "as bad" as Jews' claim, but that Jews are in fact evil and that we use the "myth" of the Holocaust to manipulate and control others. In the words of Rabbi Jeffrey Salkin, it is a "war against Jewish history," and it is succeeding.

Among millennials and Generation Z, 63% did not know that six million Jews were murdered. Over half of those thought the toll was under 2 million. Some 10% had never heard the word "Holocaust." Fewer than half of Americans knew that Adolf Hitler became chancellor of Germany through a democratic political process. When the last Holocaust survivors pass way and the physical remains of the camps continue to deteriorate over time, Holocaust deniers will become more able to spread their hateful lies.

It's no secret that synagogues around the country often struggle to find the best ways to engage students in middle school and high school following their Bar or Bat Mitzvah. To that end, here at B'nai Jeshurun, we are excited to establish two exciting

# From Our Affiliates

### **Greater Cleveland Congregations**



During my career as a family physician, I have unfortunately experienced the tragedy of treating and comforting too many patients and their families who were touched by gun violence and suicide. Gun safety is an ever increasing public health issue. According to the CDC, there were 39,707 deaths from firearms in 2019 (the last year for which we have official data). That translates to 109 deaths every day! Thirty percent of those deaths are from homicides and a staggering 60% are from suicide. The other 10% include unintentional and accidental shootings and legal interventions. There are another 210 people who survive a gunshot wound DAILY, many of whom will suffer long term physical and mental health

challenges. According to the American Academy of Pediatrics, 78 of our children are killed or injured by firearms daily.

One of GCC's core issues is to promote gun safety by partnering with the national Do Not Stand Idly By campaign: DNSIB.org. Their strategy is to partner with gun manufacturers, gun dealers and public officials using a market-based approach. Forty percent of all firearms sold in this country are sold to public agencies using tax dollars: 25% to the military and 15% to law enforcement. With time, many of these and other firearms end up in the used "secondary gun market" which can operate outside regulated channels. An ATF report over a decade ago reported that 58% of guns recovered at crime scenes were sold by 1% of gun dealers. GCC's approach is to work with the public sector gun purchasers to use their buying power to pressure gun manufacturers to improve safety and tracking measures and make responsible sales a top priority by establishing relationships only with responsible gun dealers.

Another arm of the DNSIB approach is to help bring smart guns to market. A smart gun can only be fired by its authorized owner through a variety of tested technologies including fingerprint recognition. Smart guns are useless in the "secondary market" and can help prevent guns being used against their owners by an intruder, impulsive suicides by family members of a gun owner, an accidental toddler death or the next Sandy Hook. The DNSIB campaign is a unique approach to improve gun safety, save lives and decrease firearm injuries without impacting one's right to buy and own a firearm. Whoever saves a life, it is considered as if he saved an entire world.




