Beineinu - Between Us



It is only the power to imagine that enables us to engage in *teshuvah*. Too often, we allow ourselves to get caught up in our own wants, needs, feelings and perspective. When we are hurt or angry, we often will withdraw into ourselves. At such a time, we often are unable to see any way out of our conflict. We are sure

that we are right, and they are wrong.

Yet the Torah commands us *v'ahavta l'reyecha kamocha* – love your neighbor as yourself. That is a great feat of moral and religious imagination! To love our neighbor as ourselves, we have to be able to see what they see, to feel what they feel. Only by imagining what another person is feeling can we open ourselves up to them.

It's like the famous Hassidic story about a rebbe who asked his Chasid, "Do you love me?" "Of course, I love you," said the Chasid. Then the Rebbe asked, "Do you know what hurts me?" "No, I do not," said the Chasid. Then the rebbe explained, "If you do not know what hurts me, how can you say you love me?"

Here, we are entering a New Year. This is the time to seek to grow beyond the limitations of our current selves. It is also the time to put down a burden, to mend a relationship. To not only imagine, but speak and act with a sense of could be, rather than the worn old story that remains stuck in our heads.

Rabbi Rami Shapiro teaches that with a little Hebrew sleight of hand, Rosh Hashanah - which literally means Head of the Year, can be read as Rosh Ha-Sheenah – head-changing day. He writes, "You can't have a new year with an old head. So, if you want a new year, you are going to need to get a new head. A new head is a story-free head".

It takes courage to say *Hineni*, to be fully present and honestly look at the stories we tell ourselves; and it takes imagination for us to change. This year, may we all have the imagination to see beyond our current reality, to envision how we can be better, how we can heal our relationships and our world, and may we have the courage to get a new head, one filled with optimism, compassion and love.

8. **Enjoy Kiddush:** Delicious treats are available pre-packaged. Join us for a L'chaim at the "shnaps table."

The Saddest Month of the Year?

We are in the heart of the Hebrew month of Cheshvan. Its full formal name is Marcheshvan (Mar means bitter) and it is the only month that does not have a Jewish holiday.

Our former education director, Susan Wyner, would always share a story with our schoolchildren on this. After the month of Tishri, filled with Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, Simhat Torah and the following month of Kislev's Hanukkah, is Cheshvan the left out middle child of the Jewish year? The holidays are so beautiful, inspiring, filled with food, song, lots of services and family time. They also disrupt our normal schedule and are wonderfully exhausting. I have a running list of all the things that have to be done "after the holidays." For the last month, we have set goals for the new Jewish year and made promises. Perhaps our month of Cheshvan can be understood as our opportunity to settle in to our new normal and incorporate these goals without holiday disruptions. This month, we can begin our "regular" schedule of work, study, exercise and volunteering. Our synagogue classes are beginning again in full swing and it is the perfect time to join our learning opportunities.

If I remember Sue's story correctly, Cheshvan discovers that it indeed has a special holiday, at least four. Each week, Shabbat becomes the highlight, the goal and target of preparation and focus. In Cheshvan, we have the time to make Shabbat our weekly *yom tov* and recognize the gift of our weekly calendar. Cheshvan isn't the saddest month. It helps us center our entire year, implementing the goals we set and living the values and traditions we hold the highest.

***"Noah was a righteous man,
perfect in his age."***

This month we start all over again, reading from the very beginning of the Torah. At the beginning of the story of Noah, we come across the verse above, and rabbis and Jewish leaders continue to be puzzled by the question, what does it mean 'in his age'? Was he perfect for *his* age, which was filled with evil, but in any other generation he would have simply been an average person? Or was Noah able to be a good person despite the age in which he lived? Had he lived with other decent people, would he have been even more outstanding?

I've always liked this second understanding, but Noah's own actions seem to contradict this. Noah is the first person in the Torah with the opportunity to lead when God decides to destroy humanity, saving only Noah's family. Yet Noah's reaction is simply to follow God's command. By contrast, later when Abraham is told by God that Sodom and Gomorra will be destroyed, he pleads on behalf of the people, arguing that if there are even 10 good people the city should be spared. In the end, however, Abraham relents and the city is destroyed. Finally, by the time of Moses when God threatens to destroy the Israelites after they build the golden calf, Moses stands in the breach. "If you will not forgive their sin," he says, "erase me from the book which You have written."

Noah was certainly a good person, but we are fortunate that leadership has evolved since his time. At the same time, we are indebted to Noah, for without a first leader we would never have evolved to become the people we are today. Here at the Youth & Learning Center, teaching Torah and Jewish values, Hebrew and Tefillah, and finding the best ways to reach all of our students in spite of the challenges presented during this pandemic, our students are developing the skills to become leaders in our community. Just as Noah set a template for leadership that Abraham and Moses built upon, may our children learn from and build on our example to be strong Jewish leaders for the next generation.

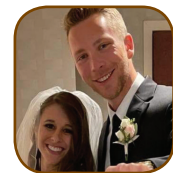

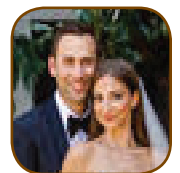

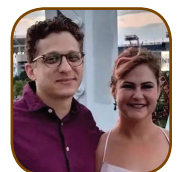
