

From the Rabbi



This month, our congregation welcomed a beautiful, new Torah scroll dedicated by the Gottlieb family in memory of their parents, grandparents and great-grandparents, Saul & Bernice Gottlieb^{z"l}. Bernice & Saul were pillars of the congregation, a couple and family that exemplified what it meant to live a life dedicated

to Torah, the highest Jewish ideals and to community. Saul, a Holocaust Survivor, and his incredible wife, Bernice, dedicated their lives to family, B'nai Jeshurun, Israel and Holocaust remembrance, reminding us all to Never Forget. Perhaps that is why our first new Torah scroll in more than 25 years, the Gottlieb Torah, has been placed in our ark in the David J. & Ruth A. Moskowitz Sanctuary next to the Holocaust scroll which is more than 500 years old.

The final commandment in the Torah, number 613, is to write a Torah scroll. There are three ways that one can fulfill this mitzvah and obligation. We can learn to be a sofer (scribe) and actually write our own Torah scroll. It takes a year to write one Torah, making sure that the more than 300,000 letters are perfect and beautiful. We can commission a sofer to write a Torah on our behalf or in memory of a loved one and perhaps have the opportunity to fill in a letter with the help of the sofer. or donate a part to contribute to the writing. The last way is to live a life in such a way that one's life is like a Torah scroll by living by the highest values of our tradition and sharing a love of Judaism that is passed on for generations to come. The Gottlieb family has fulfilled the 613th commandment for our community, just as Saul & Bernice lived it for us.

This month, our holiday cycle ends with Simhat Torah, rejoicing and dancing with the Torah scrolls, as we complete and begin the Torah reading cycle. The commandment to write our own scroll means that we have the responsibility to carry the Torah forward and make it our own. Everyone who joins us for Simhat Torah will have the opportunity to literally carry the Torah as we celebrate together.

President's Message

So, this is my "vidui", my confession: I get very frustrated at times and worry that I will not have the time or energy to get the high priority items on my agenda completed or maybe even started. The holidays present a time for me to pause and renew.

As I think about the New Year and the final seven months of my presidency, I resolve to keep my big hopes and dreams for our shul front and center, while still dealing with the more mundane issues that are frequent and inevitable. I appreciate all of your support as I do both.
