From the Rabbi



My first spiritual encounter was with a tree. My father was trying to teach me that God still talks to us. Not by upending nature (splitting the sea...the burning bush), but through nature. He wanted my five-yearold mind to grasp what Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel calls, "radical amazement."

That God is unknowable, but we can catch a glimpse of the Divine through a deep appreciation of God's creatures. So, he pointed out the window to a nearby tree, whose branches were swaying in the wind. "It's a tree," I said. My father smiled and said, "It's God waving hello."

Rosh Hashanah is the birthday of the world. Hayom harat olam - "Today the world was born." We get this opportunity to start again. To see the world as brand new. To stop and say, "Huh, I never noticed that before." Not because it's different, but because we are. To watch a tree sway gently in the wind, and wave back.

Our Torah gives us two models for how to relate with nature: Genesis Chapter One and Genesis Chapter Two. The former tells us to conquer the earth, but the latter tells us to till and guard the land. So, which model are we to follow? "... Genesis One was the story for the first era of human development. But having fulfilled that promise (...) we need another story to guide our next steps (...) Genesis Two" (Rabbis Cardin and Reisner).

It's time to turn the page. Sustainability isn't just a nice idea, it's a mitzvah. And yet, we're not doing enough to leave behind a healthy, thriving environment for our children. No freedom from fear of worsening air quality, floods, fire, drought. And we need to do teshuvah, which starts with how we return to look at a single tree.

Did you know trees warn each other of predation? They share nutrients with their weak and vulnerable. Our Torah, which is a tree of life, beckons us to Shema, Yisrael. Hear the miraculous song of nature. Our inherent oneness with the world around us. If only, Shema, Yisrael.

From the Rabbi



Listen Israel, Adonai our God, Adonai is one.

You shall love your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.

The Shema, our central prayer that speaks to the unity of the Divine, demands unity from us as well - unity of self in our worship of the Divine. By the time we arrive at the Shema in our morning prayers, we are meant to have complete focus, complete presence, and complete intention. We physically gather our tzizit, mirroring an internal gathering of the self - the pieces of which are so often scattered and pulled in different directions. We affirm the oneness of God, and then we read that we must love God with all our heart, all our soul, and all our might. The structure I imagine for the Wellness Center is one that embraces this trilogy established in the Shema of the heart (levaycha - which in the biblical tradition is also the mind), the soul (nafshecha), and the body (me'odecha - literally your might/your physicality).

Judaism believes in an integrated self - mind, body and soul all interconnected. When one of these pieces is hurting, the others suffer as well. When one of these pieces is nourished, the others are fed as well. The trap is a singular focus on one of these spheres to the exclusion of the others. The dream I have is to build a center that is intentional and proactive about integrated care. A center that tackles the spiritual malady of loneliness. A center that serves as a supportive and healing space for those suffering from addiction, grief and mental illness. A center that sees the body as the temple of the soul. A center for creativity, self-expression and play. A center for meaningful prayer and study. A center that utilizes the powerful healing tools baked into our tradition.

Join us in building this sacred space for the Cleveland Jewish community. We need it now more than ever.

"You shall rejoice in your holiday and you shall experience nothing but happiness"

Sukkot is a time to be happy and rejoice, and among the central rituals of the holiday we are instructed to build a sukkah, a temporary dwelling-place symbolizing

the tents the Jewish people lived in during their 40 years wandering in the desert. I have fond memories of putting up decorations in our family sukkah when I was growing up and spending time celebrating with family and friends in the sukkah throughout the holiday. This year we are delighted to host our B'nai Jeshurun community at our family sukkah for lunch on the first day of Sukkot after services!

If you have never had the opportunity to build your own sukkah at home, I encourage you to make it happen next year! It is tremendous to be able to take part in such a powerful ritual, one that links us to thousands of years of tradition and brings us together with family and friends as we celebrate outside in a space so conducive to spending quality time together.

At the same time, we must remember that our *sukkah* is symbolic; we have a home to return to if it gets cold outside or starts to rain. But what if the sukkah actually was home? For too many people, even in our own community, "home" is a temporary notion – there are those for whom shelter is as flimsy and fragile forever as our *sukkah* is meant to be for a week. In fact, the World Economic Forum estimates there are 150 million homeless and the UN estimates that 1.6 billion people live in inadequate shelter around the world. While we are celebrating, we must remember those less fortunate and do our part to help out. In his Mishneh Torah, Maimonides writes that when a person celebrates, he or she is obligated to remember those less fortunate as well, 'to feed the poor, the orphan and the widow' (Deut. 16:11)."

I encourage you to join in B'nai Jeshurun's commitment to chesed, helping out in our community, and we have great opportunities for congregants of all ages to be involved in service learning and chesed projects. Together we can make an impact in our greater community, working to ensure that everyone, regardless of need, has a reason to rejoice this season.




